RULES FOR CHRISTMAS LIGHTING CONTEST ANNOUNCED

The rules for the Xmas lighting and decorating contest that is being sponsored by the Friendly Neighbor Club have been formulated. The deadline for entering has been set for December 16. The judging will be held on two nights; Friday, December 19th will be the semi-finals, with teams of two judges each visiting the different areas of our community and they will select the entries in those areas at that time. On Saturday, December 20th, the FINAL judging will take place, with the entire team of judges visiting the displays which have been selected in the run-off, then from those selecting the best entries. The judging will be on three points, EFFECTIVE LIGHTING, ORIGINALITY, & INTERPRETATION OF THE CHRISTMAS THEME.

It is hoped that everyone will cooperate in this project and make the effort which the Club is putting forth bear fruit. The more entries there are the larger the prizes will be. 



The Cook of The Month

For her last recipe, Ruth Hartman wishes to give credit where it is due. This final fruit cake comes from the kitchen of her good friend and neighbor, Olga Johnson. This moist rich fruity cake is the perfect dessert for those holiday parties to come.

APPLESAUCE FRUIT CAKE

The night before the cake is to be baked

COMBINE: 3 cups Applesauce
2 cups sugar
1 cup shortening
and boil for 5 minutes.
Next Morning:

COMBINE: 4 1/2 cups unsifted flour
4 tsp. soda
1 tsp. salt
2 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. cloves
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1 cup raisins
1/2 cup dates
1 cup nuts
1 cup mixed glace fruit.

MIX WELL

Add Applesauce Mixture
Grease and Line with Waxed Paper, 2 L loaf pans or 1

Large Tube Pan. Pour mixture into pans and bake at 300 to 325 for 1 hour. Remove cake from pan immediately after taking from oven.
For a variation: omit one cup of applesauce then next morning add 1 cup Logon David Wine.



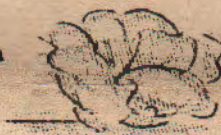

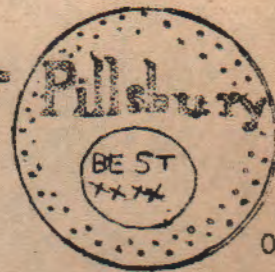
