### NUT PUFFS

CREAM: 1 cup shortening  
1/2 cup sifted confectioners sugar  
1 tbs. vanilla.

ADD: 2 cups unsifted all-purpose flour  
1 cup chopped pecan nuts

Roll into small balls, bake at 375 until just turning brown. Roll in confectioners sugar while still warm. These cookies will retain their round shape during baking and look very festive and attractive.
