PARENT TEACHER MEETING

Despite the fact that the guest speaker was unable to appear at the December 9th meeting of the Chugiak P.T.A. the meeting was a lengthy one. The greater part of the time was consumed with the discussion of a re-run of the play "Harvey". The members of the cast felt that with enough advance publicity and early pushing of ticket sales, a full house could be anticipated for one or possibly two performances. It was requested that this time the entire membership of the P.T.A. get behind the cast and help in every way possible, from selling of tickets to acting as stage hands. The play was tentatively scheduled for a week-end at the end of January with sale of tickets and publicity to start immediately. Christmas parties and treats were also taken into consideration. In view of the large number of school and pre-school children now in our community, providing a small sack of candy and nuts or fruit for each child would still cost the P.T.A. about \$100. Members were reluctant to discontinue this tradition, but still felt that it was a rather large financial burden for P.T.A. to stand this year. It was voted to ask parents to contribute .50¢ per family to help defray the expense. Notes will be sent home with the children explaining this situation as it was felt sure that parents would be glad to contribute. It was brought to the attention of the membership that a candy sale had been tried at the last Friday night movie with great success. Sale of candy will be a feature at succeeding bi-monthly meetings for this will add to the profit from the showings, said profits being set aside to purchase educational film for the classrooms.

2 Fires in Chugiak

Last Thursday afternoon Chugiak Volunteer Firemen answered a fire call at the home of Mrs. Miller on the Eagle River Homestead Road. A blowtorch being used to thaw pipes in a well house had ignited the building. A large crew of men answered the call with water back pack pumps which was the only equipment available. By holding the fire down with these pump cans the men were able to tear the structure apart so that the fire did not involve the adjoining home.

On Saturday afternoon the Quonset Hut home of Clare "Pop" McDowell and its entire contents were destroyed by fire. The fire had gotten a good start before it was discovered and although a large crew responded to the alarm there was no equipment available to quell the roaring blaze. Once again, plenty men but no tools!

RESCUE Tools ARE HERE!

The PUSHMASTER, a hydraulic device for forcing entry to wrecked cars or buildings was received by the Fire Company Rescue unit. This tool is the only one of its kind in use by Rescue teams in Alaska. As we mentioned last week, Olga's recipes represent either her own Russian ancestry or Guy's Swedish upbringing. This week we offer two pastry recipes which are typical of both countries. One is the Russian version of doughnuts, which are light, tender and very popular with the children. The other is a favorite Swedish Christmas cookie.

BOOBILICKI (Boob-lich-kee)

COLDIE: 2 cups sour milk
grated rind and
juice of 1 lemon
or 1 tsp. lemon
extract

BEAT: 3 eggs until lemon
colored

1 cup sugar

ADD: 2 cups flour to egg
mixture

ADD: 1 tsp. soda to milk
mixture and pour into
egg batter.

ADD: 4 more cups flour
½ tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking powder

MIX WELL

Drop batter by ½ tbs. into
hot grease (365)

COOK FOR DECEMBER
OLGA JOHNSON

Fry until nicely brown.
Drain, roll in powdered
sugar, cinnamon sugar or
leave plain.

FATTIGLAND (fat-tig-land) Poor Mans Cookie

6 egg yolks
1 tbsp. melted butter
1/3 tsp. salt
3 cups flour
6 tbsp. sweet cream
4 tbsp. sugar

**BEAT EGGS WELL, ADD SUGAR
& MILK WELL.**

Add remaining ingredients
Roll thin.

Cut into diamond shapes.
Cut a slit in center of
each piece. Tuck corners
into slit.

Fry in deep fat (370) for
2 to 3 minutes or until
golden brown. Dip into
powdered sugar.

These are a very crisp
fragile cookie and must be
stored uncovered or they
will become soft and soggy.


