People are thinking about our Telephone System. Dal Oberg says, "The whole telephone deal is silly... The thing I think is silly is that we have a cooperative system but it is not a cooperative. The idea that I have to pay a toll to talk to my own brother who is on the same phone system is ridiculous. Our own board can do something about that." Danny Dell was one of the first people to work to get phones in the area when the oportunity arose to be rid of the old Fire Company hand orank lines. He forked like a beaver and took applications for nembership at the time that The latanuska Telephone Association became organized. He was

told by the board at that time that this area would have direct connection to either Palmer of Amchorage. R.E.A. and engineers had verbally promined that. 
