Young Chugiak Musher donated \$90. in one weekends operation to the Resuscitator Fund.

On March 8 & 9 proceeds from sled dog rides at 14 mile, Palmer Highway gave the resuscitator fund a big boost. Terry Charles, teenage musher, won the 50 lb. sack of Purina dog food for the most passengers on Sunday. Others deserving a big hand of appreciation are Bruce Pettit, Clayton Petronovich, Gene Mc Gowan, Preston Johnson, Ollie Walker, and chairman of the committee, Jerry Cox. All efforts were well rewarded Sunday afternoon when the Rescue Wagon and the resuscitator were placed on emergency run with a local tiny infant to Providence Hospital. Rescue firemen Theodore Brinck and John Noyes made the trip in 28 minutes and with resuscitator and kit were able to remove obstruction of mucus in the infant's throat and ease breathing considerably. The Musher's are proud of their participation and we are proud of the Musher's. Next Saturday and Sunday, March 15 and 16, rides will be held again at the same location, plus a team or 2 at the Isaac Walton Birchwood Range where the proceeds of a Turkey Shoot will go to the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company.
