## "SEAFOOD SOUFFLE SALAD"

1 pkg. lemon or lime jello  
1 cup hot water  
2 cup cold water  
1 tbs. lemon juice or vinegar  
gar  
½ cup mayonnaise  
¼ tsp. salt  
Dash of pepper  
1 tbs. minced onion  
1 cup flaked fish (crab, salmon, shrimp etc.)  
1 cup mixed minced raw vegetables (celery, cucumber, green pepper, carrots, fresh tomatoes)


