CARNIVAL CONTEST RULES

Once again it is Carnival Time! As in past years members of the community are urged to turn out to help get the grounds in readiness for the gala Spring event. All hours spent working in connection with preparing the grounds and during the Carnival may be credited to any community organization as their share of Carnival profits. One man hour is equal to one hour credit. In addition, this year a contest is planned to stimulate more interest and to enlist more help in Carnival preparation. A First Prize of a Sunbeam Mixer has been donated by Ray and Maxine Hennichs of the Eagle River Hardware Store; second and third prizes have been donated by C.B.A. and are respectively a Lazy-Susan and an Electric "Horse" Clock. Rules of the contest are as follows:

For each five man-hours spent in readying the Carnival Hall and Grounds, ONE POINT will be earned toward the prizes. An accurate card index file will be maintained at Carnival Hall and a member of the CBA Board of Directors will be on hand each evening and weekend to keep the time. Each Monday a list of the workers and the number of points he or she has earned will be published at the EAGLE RIVER HARDWARE STORE. The contest will end the day before the Carnival and the winners will then be announced. Members of the Board of Directors are ineligible. Tuesday, April 22nd will be the "kick-off" for this contest as materials for the Hall and grounds are expected to be delivered at that time. COOK FOR APRIL PEN LEE

Like so many Alaskan families, the Lees depend on Moose and Caribou meat for the main part of their diet. Pen is always looking for new and different ways to liven up the less select cuts; and she offers this delicious barbecue sauce which is not too hot but is good and spicy.

BARBECUED SHORT RIBS

(for 3/4 of moose or caribou ribs)

- Mix together:
- 1/2 cup vinegar
 - 2 Tbsp. water
 - 1/2 cup catsup
 - 1 tsp. paprika
 - 3 tsp. salt
 - 2 tsp. chili powder
 - 3 tbsps. brown sugar

In a dutch oven or any fry pan with a tight cover, brown the ribs in hot fat. Slice one large onion on them and pour the sauce over all. Allow to simmer (tightly covered) for one hour, or longer if the ribs are large and meaty.

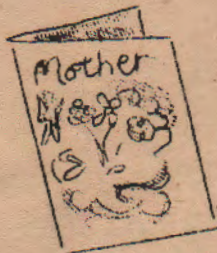

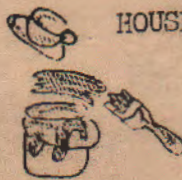
