Lorene Tofson

Our Cook of the Month for May has fans that number in the hundreds. Every day the children of the Chugiak School troop down to enjoy the delicious meals that LORENE TOFSON has been preparing for the past two and a half years as chief cook and manager of the school hot lunch program.

However, even before this Lorene's fame as a cook was well known in the community and her recipes are the most sought after by her acquaintances.

When Lorene and her family first came to Chugiak in June of 1952, it was only for a short visit with her sister, Alma Haik, who operates Spring Creek Lodge. But like so many of us, the visit became a permanent one and the Tofsons are now an important part of our community. Lorene says that their first home was a sixteen by thirty two foot tent. In fact, inside this tent their original house was built and the tent peeled off after it was completed. This building still forms the nucleus of their present beautiful home which they have built on their homestead in Birchwood. Lorene's husband, Ing, works as a mechanic for Alaska Sales & Service and her three children, Mary Ann 13, Hank 11, and Linda 9, all attend the Chugiak School where their mother reigns as cook.

Lorene is, like so many capable homemakers, a very busy lady. After her day of work at the school she helps Hank with his paper route on the Birchwood loop. Letaly she has made a hobby of upholstering and has turned out some really professional pieces.

Although one wonders where she can find time to do anything more, Lorene is very active in club work and is one of the founders of the Friendly Neighbor Club and was its first president.

Whenever an affair is planned in the community that requires cooking for large groups Lorene is called on to help for she can prepare a meal for several hundred with the ease that most of us cook our family dinner. Her Chili Feeds have become a tradition in Chugiak. Lorene is a wonderful cook in any type of food preparation but it is in baking where she excels. Many of her recipes are her own invention and she has won many baking contests. This past year she was a judge at the annual baking contest held by the Chugiak Homemakers at the Spring Carnival.

So we now present Lorene Tofson. To many of you who have wished for the recipes that your children have come home from school raving about here is your opportunity.

Here is a recipe that Lorene likes because it is the answer to the problem that arises when unexpected company arrives and there is no dessert. Requiring a minimum of time and utensils to prepare, this cobbler is as the name implies "quick and easy". It can be made in the time that a dinner is prepared and may be served warm.

QUICK AND EASY COBBLER

- SIFT 1 cup Flour
- 1 cup Sugar
- 3 tsp. Baking Powder
- 1/2 tsp. Salt
- ADD 1 cup Milk and mix until smooth.
- MELT 1 cube Butter or Oleo in an 8 x 12 cobbler pan
- POUR batter on top of shortening but do not mix.
- PREPARE 1 No. 2 can of pie fruit or berries and pour on top of batter. DO NOT MIX.
- SPRINKLE 2 tablespoons of sugar on top of fruit.
- BAKE at 350° for 35 to 40 minutes.

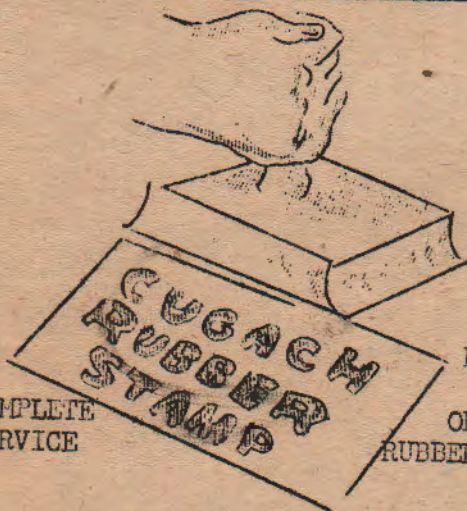
GARDENING TIP
 Nasturtium and Sweet Pea seed can be given an early start to gorgeous blooms if the seed are wrapped in wet paper towels, sealed in foil paper and kept in a warm (not hot) place for about 10 days, after which time they are well sprouted and may be planted outdoors. Nasturtiums may take a few days longer. You may peek during this incubation period.
