The Cook of The Month

From time to time everyone is confronted with the problem of what to do with the left overs of food in small amounts. Lorene Tofson offers this tasty suggestion of a way to use that cup of leftover cooked corn. These crisp fritters provide a delicious supplement to any meal.

CORN FRITTERS

1 cup flour
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking powder
1 cup corn, canned or cup from cob
2 eggs
1 tablespoon milk

Sift together flour, salt and baking powder. Add corn. Mix well. Beat eggs until light. Add milk and combine with other ingredients. Beat well. Drop by spoonfuls into deep fat heated to 365° (or hot enough to brown an inch cube of bread in one min.) Fry until brown. Drain.

Plain DIRT Gardening

The regular meeting of the garden club (aname for this organization is on the agenda for the next meeting and any suggestions from non-members as well as from members will be appreciated) was held at the Earl Ray home on Sunday evening. If you enjoy gardening talk once in a while without being bothered with a lot of yak about taxation, the juvenile problem, and sundry subjects that are paving the way to certain destruction of this ole earth, come to the garden club meeting!

One cannot help but notice each day some new green as one drives the highways and byways of our community.

Gardening has been called the oldest of the Arts. Perhaps this is why it is more satisfying and appreciated by more people than any of the other arts. What a good feeling it is to walk through your garden of

a morning and find the new tender shoots that were not there yesterday. One of the most beautiful and easiest flowers to raise is the Gladiolus. They should be started indoors about the first of April then transplanted outdoors about the first of June. Gladiolus require a good loamy soil, a lot of sunlight and water. If the flower cluster is cut when just the lower flowers are open, the buds above will open in succession and keep fresh for from ten days to two weeks.
