CHUGIAK LITTLE LEAGUE PLAYS GOOD FAST GAME

The lineup of players in last night's Little League game, Chugiak playing The Braves, was as follows: Danny Werre, 2nd base Paul Fillmore, pitcher Jerry Werre, center field Kenneth Oates, 3rd base Larry Shooshanian, left field Danny Walker, short stop Jimmie Hamilton, catcher Perry Hoag, right field Danny Shelor, 1st base Hank Tofson, relief 1st base L. Shooshanian, pitcher relief. The Braves scored five times in their first two innings. In the second inning K. Oates scored Chugiak's first run - a homer with none on. Shooshanian, Walker and Hamilton singled to load the bases. Hoag hit a fly so Shelor and D. Werre were walked to bring in 2 more scores. Chugiak broke out in a rash of runs and scored 8 more. In the last half of the second Jerry Werre doubled to score. Fillmore and Oates singled to score D. Werre. In the top half of the third the Braves scored four times, and in the fourth they tallied 3 times. Chugiak came back with one score in that inning. In the top half of fifth, Shooshanian was pitcher while Fillmore went behind the plate as catcher. Hamilton made an excellent catch and play to third to put second and third outs. (Neat, fast, exciting, real cool play) Danny Walker singled to drive in a score in Chugiak's half of the fifth. In the Braves final appearance at bat they failed to score while Chugiak scored once more making a final score of 17 to 16 in favor of the Braves.

In Chugiak's first game on Monday they lost 10 to 4. For beginners, the boys made a very fine showing and played fast exciting ball.

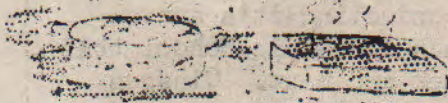

This week Joyce Willis offers two recipes. These easy to fix dishes are the answer to a spur of the moment meal and with a salad are all that are needed for a quick luncheon or even a light dinner.

TUNA SUPREME

(A snap to make)
Arrange in alternate layers in buttered 1 1/2 qt. baking dish:

- 2 Cups tuna (2 large 7 oz. cans)
- 2 Cups crushed cheese crackers
- 3 Cups medium white sauce
- 3/4 Cups sliced ripe olives.

Finish with a sprinkling of crushed cheese crackers. Bake in moderate oven (350°) for 35 minutes. Serves 6.

APPLE CRUMBLE

(Takes about 10 minutes to make)

Sprinkle one half of a dry spice cake mix into an oblong pan. Pour on two No.2 cans of Apple pie filling, then rest of mix. Add 1 Tbs. lemon juice mixed in 1 Cup water. DO NOT STIR.

Bake 50 to 60 minutes at 350°.

(I tried this one already as well as last weeks and they are super. The best compliment to be given is that the men ate heartily and did not afterward ask for "the solid food".)

Plain **DIRT** Gardening

A green lawn is most certainly an asset to any property and involves a surprisingly small amount of labor and capital. Because grass likes cool nights and warm days a lawn can be started anytime from May to September in this area. Although four or five inches of good garden soil is desirable, as little as two inches will make a sufficient seed bed. The soil should be well pulverized. Rake in a good commercial fertilizer and allow to stand for about a week before planting. Select good seed - (about one pound will seed two hundred square feet.) After seeding, sprinkle

with a fine spray and roll or pack lightly. Until the grass is well started do not let the ground dry out or the seeds will not germinate.

When watering the lawn a good soaking twice a week is better than a light sprinkle daily. Depending upon the depth and quality of the seed bed, a lawn needs to be fed occasionally, at least twice a year, in May and late August.
