Fried chicken is known the world over as a great American favorite. Darlene Robinson offers this entirely different version of fried chicken that is crispy tender and the ideal answer to those who are not allowed foods fried in the conventional manner.

### OVEN FRIED CHICKEN

(Good and easy for a Sunday Dinner)

Clean and dry chicken. Put approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup salad oil in a bowl. Add seasonings such as a little oregano, paprika, salt, pepper and onion powder.

Roll a ready to eat cereal fine. Dip chicken in the seasoned oil then roll in cereal crumbs. Place in a baking dish one layer deep. Cover tightly. If your dish does not have a cover aluminum foil will do. Bake at 350 for one hour.
