A parade will escort him to the 9th Avenue Park Strip where a public Barbecue will be held with speeches and music and varied entertainment. The Barbecue will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will feature Texas Beef. If it should rain arrangements have been made to accommodate the crowd at the Y.M.C.A. on 6th Avenue. Officials of the City of Anchorage and area organizations are to take part in the ceremony and program which promises to be a thrilling and colorful event. PUBLIC MEETING FOR FIRE PROTECTION SET AUGUST 8th.

The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Co. Inc., has reached a point where it must have better community support, financially, in order to continue operating. The few donations the Company has received to date have not been sufficient to pay operating expenses or repairs and replacement to equipment.

The Fire Company has a proposed plan for Subscription type Fire Protection to be approved by a Fire Advisory Board whose eight members will be elected to office by Fire Protection Subscribers. There will be an open meeting on August 8th, 1958 for the purpose of answering all questions concerning the proposed Fire Protection Plan. Subscription forms will also be available at this meeting. On the evening of August 15th there will be a meeting of all SUBSCRIBERS for the purpose of electing their eight Advisory Board Members. THE SUBSCRIBERS WILL ELECT THEIR OWN ADVISORY BOARD, The purpose of which is: Approve the Fire Company elected Fire Chief; and Advise the Fire Company on all matters where the good or interest of the community is

PLANE CRASH

The Chugiak Rescue truck with Chick LeDoux, Jess Straight & Jim McDowell were dispatched to the scene and after spending a half an hour finding the crash in the rain and fog and the darkness they spent two full hours cutting the pilot from the wreckage which was badly mangled. Residents of the immediate area were helpful in searching for the lost craft. Some were routed from their sleep by the noise of the crash and others by searchers.

Like everyone who was born and brought up in Southern California, Darlene Robinson has a fondness for Mexican foods. Occasionally she likes to treat her family to a supper of "Tacos" that crisp fried Mexican version of a sandwich.

TACOS:

1 can tortillas (1 dozen to a can)
 Fry in a little HOT oil one at a time, about one minute to each side. Drain on paper towels.
 1 can Enchilada Sauce (Ashley's is best but hard to find.)
 Heat and have ready in a pitcher.
 Brown 1 pound hamburger and cook with 2 diced onions and seasonings until onions are transparent.
 Dice together:
 1 bunch green onions
 3 tomatoes
 1/2 head lettuce
 Set the table with plates and LOTS of paper napkins.
 Set sauce, salad, hamburger mix and tortillas in the middle. Everyone serves himself, in the following

Take tortilla, put one tablespoon of hamburger mix, one tablespoon of salad and pour sauce over all and roll up. Eat holding Taco in the hands. It's very messy but good enough to be worth it.

COLUMBINE



There are forty known species of Columbine most of which, no doubt, would do well in Alaska, as all are grown in the north temperate zone. The most popular in this area is the Sitka Columbine. It grows about three feet high with red flowers about one and one-half inches wide. It is well suited for an open border but will do well in a partially shaded rock garden. All species of columbine are perennials and best increased by dividing the roots clumps in the spring.

Most gardeners I have talked to in this area are favoring perennials to annuals. Because of our short growing season it does seem more reasonable to plant perennials than to have to spend so much time setting out bedding plants each spring or planting seeds and having the plants freeze just as they are coming into full bloom. Don't forget - The Garden Club meets this Sunday, July 20 at 7:30 p.m. at the Swanson's. Non-members are welcome and urged to attend.

SHOPPING in Chugiak

Here's a suggestion to those who bake their own bread. The large plastic dishpans available at the Eagle River Hardware Store are perfect for mixing and raising dough. These pans are square in shape and hold 14 quarts. They are large enough to mix dough for at least 6 loaves. The surface is smooth and chip-proof and the dough can be mixed and kneaded right in the pan. For those who have an oven with a light in it, the heat of this lamp is just right for raising the dough in a minimum of time. Just set the pan in the oven (careful not to let it touch the globe) and close the door.
