



PLANNED

ACCORDING TO PRISCILLA BACON, PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE FOR OUR DISTRICT A TUBERCULIN TESTING PROGRAM IS BEING PLANNED TO INCLUDE ALL FIRST, FOURTH, AND SEVENTH GRADE STUDENTS IN THE CHUGIAK AND EAGLE RIVER SCHOOLS. THIS WILL CONSIST OF A TUBERCULIN SKIN TEST AND A CHEST X-RAY FOR ALL THOSE WHO HAVE A POSITIVE REACTION TO THE SKIN TEST.

THE TUBERCULIN TEST IS A MINUTE INJECTION OF FLUID GIVEN UNDER THE SKIN OF THE FOREARM. IF THERE IS NO REACTION AT SITE OF THE INJECTION WITHIN THREE DAYS IT SHOWS THAT APPARENTLY TUBERCULOSIS GERMS HAVE NOT ENTERED THE BODY AND THERE IS NO SPECIAL NEED FOR AN X-RAY.

HOWEVER, IF THERE IS A CERTAIN DEGREE OF REDNESS AND SWELLING AT THE SITE OF INJECTION, THIS IS CALLED A "POSITIVE REACTION" SHOWING THAT AT SOME TIME OR ANOTHER, TUBERCULOSIS GERMS HAVE TUBERCULOSIS GERMS HAVE ENTERED THE BODY. THE X-RAY IS TAKEN TO SEE IF THE GERMS HAVE DONE ANY DAMAGE, AND IF THERE IS ANY ACTIVITY IN THE INFECTION. THE POSITIVE REACTION USUALLY PERSISTS THROUGHOUT LIFE.

THOSE CHILDREN WHO WERE VACCINATED AGAINST TUBERCULOSIS WITH BCG SHOULD RECEIVE THE SKIN TEST TO SEE IF THE VACCINATION "TOOK." THOSE CHILDREN SHOULD BE X-RAYED ALSO.

NOTICES WERE SENT HOME WITH STUDENTS OF THE IST, 4TH, & 7TH GRADES LAST TUES WITH A PERMISSION SLIP TO BE SIGNED BY THE PARENT AUTHORIZING THESE TB TESTS. PARENTS WILL RECEIVE A RE-PORT OF BOTH THE SKIN TEST & THE X-RAY SOON AFTER THE EXAMS ARE COMPLETED.







SCHOOL AGE POPULATION UP 138%. During the 1950-1960 period, Alaska's school age popula-tion increased at the highest rate of growth in the nation Annually, it increases more than 10% meaning that more classrooms, teachers and related facilities are necessary just to keep pace. Establishment of the Marine Sci-ences Institute at Douglas will further enhance the University's role in Alaska's future.
