Local Civil Defense

EAGLE RIVER - CHUGIAK RESIDENTS ARE REMINDED OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE MEETING SCHEDULED FOR 7:30 THIS EVENING (FRI, OCT 19) IN THE MULTI-PURPOSE ROOM OF THE CHUGIAK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. THE NEWLY REVISED CIVIL DEFENSE PLANS FOR THE STATE OF ALASKA HAVE BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO ALL CIVIL DEFENSE DISTRICTS AND OUR LOCAL CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR, CALVIN BENITO, HAS SCHEDULED THIS COMMUNITY MEETING TO FAMILIARIZE RESIDENTS LIVING BETWEEN EAGLE RIVER BRIDGE AND THE KNIK RIVER BRIDGE WITH THE C.D. PROGRAM; WHAT WE, THE PEOPLE, MUST DO IN ORGANIZING AND WHAT STATE & FEDERAL ASSISTANCE WE CAN OBTAIN. A LOCAL PLAN MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE STATE CIVIL DEFENSE HEADQUARTERS AND UPON ACCEPTANCE OF THIS COMMUNITY'S PLANS, STATE & FEDERAL AID WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE. (THIS WILL INCLUDE MATCHING FUNDS FOR A HEADQUARTERS UNIT, MATERIALS FOR SHELTERS, SUPPLIES FOR SAME, ETC.)

TB TESTS PLANNED

ACCORDING TO PRISCILLA BACON, PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE FOR OUR DISTRICT, A TUBERCULIN TESTING PROGRAM IS BEING PLANNED TO INCLUDE ALL FIRST, FOURTH, AND SEVENTH GRADE STUDENTS IN THE CHUGIAK AND EAGLE RIVER SCHOOLS. THIS WILL CONSIST OF A TUBERCULIN SKIN TEST AND A CHEST X-RAY FOR ALL THOSE WHO HAVE A POSITIVE REACTION TO THE SKIN TEST.

Eagle River Cheer Leaders To Be Chosen....

SELECTION OF 5 CHEER LEADERS FOR THE EAGLE RIVER SCHOOL WILL BE MADE NEXT WED, OCT 24. TWO GIRLS WILL ALSO BE CHOSEN AS ALTERNATES (CONT NEXT COLUMN)

THE TUBERCULIN TEST IS A MINUTE INJECTION OF FLUID GIVEN UNDER THE SKIN OF THE FOREARM. IF THERE IS NO REACTION AT SITE OF THE INJECTION WITHIN THREE DAYS IT SHOWS THAT APPARENTLY TUBERCULOSIS GERMS HAVE NOT ENTERED THE BODY AND THERE IS NO SPECIAL NEED FOR AN X-RAY.

HOWEVER, IF THERE IS A CERTAIN DEGREE OF REDNESS AND SWELLING AT THE SITE OF INJECTION, THIS IS CALLED A "POSITIVE REACTION" SHOWING THAT AT SOME TIME OR ANOTHER, TUBERCULOSIS GERMS HAVE ENTERED THE BODY. THE X-RAY IS TAKEN TO SEE IF THE GERMS HAVE DONE ANY DAMAGE, AND IF THERE IS ANY ACTIVITY IN THE INFECTION. THE POSITIVE REACTION USUALLY PERSISTS THROUGHOUT LIFE.

THOSE CHILDREN WHO WERE VACCINATED AGAINST TUBERCULOSIS WITH BCG SHOULD RECEIVE THE SKIN TEST TO SEE IF THE VACCINATION "TOOK." THOSE CHILDREN SHOULD BE X-RAYED ALSO.

NOTICES WERE SENT HOME WITH STUDENTS OF THE 1ST, 4TH, & 7TH GRADES LAST TUES WITH A PERMISSION SLIP TO BE SIGNED BY THE PARENT AUTHORIZING THESE TB TESTS. PARENTS WILL RECEIVE A REPORT OF BOTH THE SKIN TEST & THE X-RAY SOON AFTER THE EXAMS ARE COMPLETED.

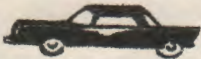

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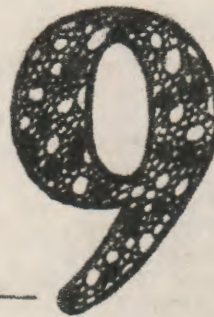

OF LOCAL RESIDENTS, THE GROCERIES WERE COLLECTED FROM THE HIGHWAY AND TAKEN TO PETERS CREEK SERVICE PENDING ARRANGEMENTS FOR TRANSPORTING THEM ON TO HOUSTON.

MONDAY, OCT 15

THREE CARS WERE INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT NEAR MILE 19 ON THE PALMER HIGHWAY. A 1958 RAMBLER DRIVEN BY EDWARD B. HENRY OF MI 44/2 HAD A BLOW-OUT AND PULLED OFF THE SIDE OF THE HIGHWAY AND WAS ATTEMPTING TO STOP. A '60 CORVAIR OPERATED BY RAYMON B. MARTSOLF OF MILE 37 GLENN HIGHWAY, ATTEMPTED TO PASS THE HENRY VEHICLE JUST AS THE RAMBLER VEERED BACK ONTO THE HIGHWAY, THUS FORCING MARTSOLF TO GIVE WAY TO THE LEFT. IN TURN, THIS FORCED AN ONCOMING '61 VALIANT DRIVEN BY STEVE J. PREVITS OF ANCHORAGE TO HIT THE SHOULDER OF THE HIGHWAY. THE LOOSE GRAVEL CAUSED

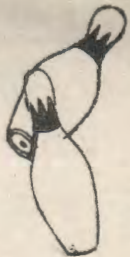

SCHOOL AGE POPULATION UP 138%. During the 1950-1960 period, Alaska's school age population increased at the highest rate of growth in the nation. Annually, it increases more than 10% meaning that more classrooms, teachers and related facilities are necessary just to keep pace. To meet this need, nearly 30% of the State budget has gone into education. Since statehood 88 classrooms have been constructed, in state-supported schools and an additional 27 are under construction today.

UNIVERSITY IMPROVEMENTS LAUNCHED. Backed by the largest appropriations in its history, the University of Alaska is rapidly improving its facilities and at the same time is becoming one of the most respected arctic research institutes in the nation. Establishment of the Marine Sciences Institute at Douglas will further enhance the University's role in Alaska's future.

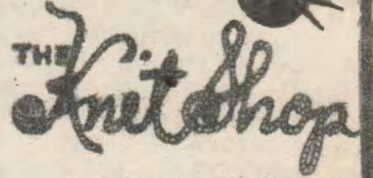

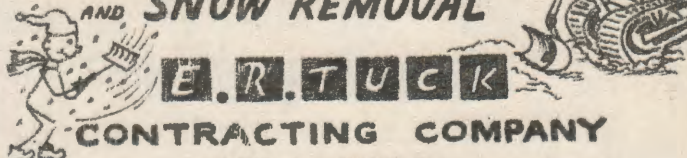

THIS BIRCHWOOD NEIGHBOR WAS BORN IN CHRISMAN, TEX, THE 2ND OF 3 CHILDREN. HIS CHILDHOOD WAS SPENT IN ROSEBUD, TEX, AND HE ATTENDED SCHOOL THERE. FOLLOWING HIS SCHOOL YEARS, JACK BECAME A LONG DISTANCE TRUCKER, DRIVING COAST TO COAST FOR VAN LINES & SEVERAL YEARS IN HIS OWN TRUCKING BUSINESS. HE MADE HIS HOME IN HOUSTON, TEX, UNTIL THE FALL OF 1959 WHEN HE DROVE TO ALASKA WITH HIS BROTHER & FAMILY & SETTLED IN ANCHORAGE. JACK BECAME EMPLOYED IN A WAREHOUSE ON ELDENDORF AFB.

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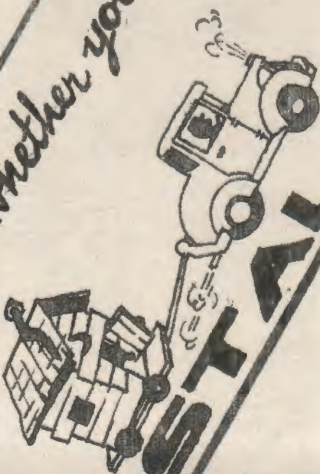
IT WAS THE THIRD DAY THAT SMOKE FROM JACK'S BONFIRE WAS SPOTTED BY GEORGE WILMOTH OF ANCHORAGE & THE FORMER EAGLE RIVER BAPTIST MINISTER, E.C. CHRON, AS THEY WERE PARTICIPATING IN THE AERIAL SEARCH. UPON THEIR NOTIFICATION TO THE RESCUE CONTROL CENTER, SHORTY BRADLEY, HIS FAITHFUL BLOOD-HOUND, AND 3 A.F. VOLUNTEERS HIKE INTO THE AREA & FOUND JACK. WORDS FAIL TO EXPRESS JACK'S RELIEF WHEN HE WAS FOUND. HE WAS PICKED UP BY AN A.F. HELICOPTER & TAKEN TO THE BASE HOSPITAL WHERE HE WAS GIVEN A PHYSICAL EXAM AND RELEASED. JACK GRATEFULLY RETURNED HOME, RESTED ONE DAY AND RETURNED TO WORK.

FROM THIS EXPERIENCE JACK LEARNED OF THE WORK CARRIED ON BY THE ALASKA RESCUE GROUP AND THE CIVIL AIR PATROL AND CAME TO HAVE A HIGH REGARD FOR BOTH THESE ORGANIZATIONS, THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY VOLUNTEERS WHO ALSO ASSIST IN SEARCH OR RESCUE MISSIONS. AND ... JACK STRUCK UP A LASTING FRIENDSHIP WITH SHORTY BRADLEY & HIS HOUNDS, PARTICULARLY DELILAH. IN CONVERSATIONS FOLLOWING HIS RESCUE JACK LEARNED THAT SHORTY HAD SOME BLOOD-HOUND PUPS, REALLY MORE THAN HE COULD HANDLE, AND DOGS WHICH SHORTY HOPED SOMEONE WOULD TAKE & TRAIN IN SEARCH OPERATIONS. JACK DECIDED THIS WAS FOR HIM!

ABOUT 3 WEEKS AFTER HIS OWN RESCUE, JACK'S FIRST BLOOD-HOUND PUP ARRIVED FROM TALKEETNA VIA AIR & RAIL

AS FAR AS WILLOW. JACK NAMED THE PUP "RANGER." HE OBTAINED HIS 2ND PUP FROM SHORTY ABOUT SIX WEEKS LATER AND NAMED HIM "SMOKEY." JACK THEN SET ABOUT RAISING HIS PUPS "BY THE BOOK" (THIS BEING AN AUTHORITATIVE BOOK BY A BLOODHOUND EXPERT) & SOME PERSONAL ADVICE FROM SHORTY.

LAST OCT JACK MOVED TO BIRCHWOOD TO GIVE HIS DOGS THE ROOM TO TRAIN IN SURROUNDINGS SIMILAR TO WOODED TERRAIN WHERE FUTURE SEARCH WORK WOULD TAKE PLACE. 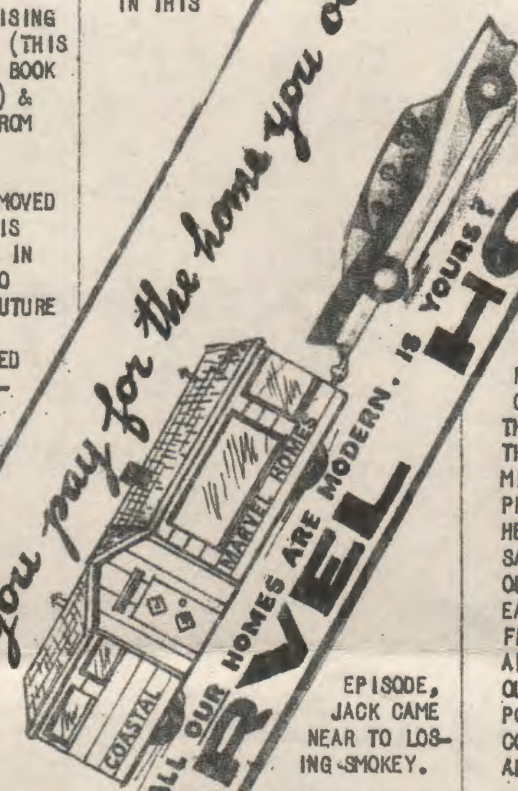

JACK'S CONCERN THEN TURNED TO HIS DOG & THE NEXT DAY HE WENT UP EAGLE RIVER ROAD AS FAR AS HE COULD DRIVE & NOTIFIED ALL THE HOMESTEADERS IN THE AREA THAT HIS DOG WAS LOST & MIGHT WANDER ONTO THEIR PROPERTY. JACK ASKED THAT HE BE NOTIFIED IF ANYONE SAW SMOKEY. HE FOUND ALL OUR NEIGHBORS IN THE UPPER EAGLE RIVER VALLEY VERY FRIENDLY AND COOPERATIVE AND ALL PROMISED TO KEEP A LOOK-OUT FOR SMOKEY. THE STATE POLICE GAVE HIM THE SAME COOPERATION AND JACK TRULY APPRECIATED THIS.

IT WAS 8 DAYS LATER THAT A GROUP OF A.F. MEN WERE HUNTING IN THE AREA WHEN THEY HEARD SMOKEY WHINE. AT FIRST THEY WERE UNDECIDED AS TO WHAT IT WAS, BUT FINALLY, THEY GOT WITHIN ABOUT 20 FEET OF THE NOISE AND CAPT SISARAMB CALLED. SMOKEY, WEAK FROM HIS ORDEAL, CAME LIMPING OUT. APPARENTLY THE DOG HAD

THEY WERE IN A RADIO EQUIPPED BLUE & WHITE PIPER PACER PILOTED BY BERNIE. THE PAIR PLANNED TO RETURN HOME BEFORE DARK THE FOLLOWING DAY (SUNDAY).

THE TWO HUNTERS FILED NO FLIGHT PLAN BUT CORDIA VAVERKA, WIFE OF THE PILOT, KNEW THAT BERNIE INTENDED TO FLY BY PORTAGE PASS & WHITTIER. THE MEN TOOK FOOD AND HUNTING EQUIPMENT WITH THEM.

REPORT OF THE MEN BEING OVER-DUE WAS GIVEN TO F.A.A. BY CORDIA VAVERKA ABOUT 3:30 PM LAST MONDAY. THEY PASSED THE REPORT TO THE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER WHO IN TURN ALERTED THE CIVIL AIR PATROL.

THE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER AT ELMENDORF SAID WED

MORNING THAT THEY HAD RECEIVED A REPORT THAT A PLANE MATCHING THE DESCRIPTION OF VAVERKA'S CRAFT HAD BEEN SEEN SUN TAKING OFF FROM MONTAGUE ISLAND.

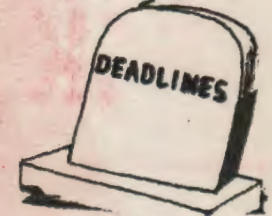

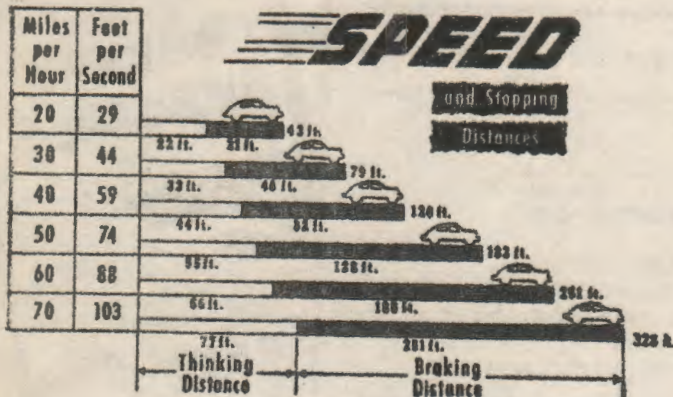
