JUNIOR STUDENTS AT EAST ANCHORAGE HI BROUGHT HOME NOTICES THIS WEEK FROM THE SCHOOL ADVISING PARENTS THAT PRELIMINARY SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TESTS (PSAT) WILL BE GIVEN TO 3RD YEAR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ON TUES, OCT 16TH. THIS IS A SHORT VERSION OF THE SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST OF THE COLLEGE ENTRANCE BOARD. THE RESULTS OF THE PSAT WILL ENABLE JR'S TO COMPARE THEIR ABILITY WITH JR'S THROUGHOUT THE U.S. THE CHARGE FOR THE TEST IS \$1.00.

MANY QUESTIONS ARISE CONCERNING FUTURE PLANS IN THIS IMPORTANT 3RD YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL. IF COLLEGE LIES AHEAD, STUDENTS SHOULD BEGIN TO CHOOSE SCHOOLS FOR WHICH THEY MAY BE ELIGIBLE. IF THE WORLD OF WORK IS IN A BRADUATES IMMEDIATE FUTURE, HE/SHE SHOULD PLAN FOR A JOB. WHICH COLLEGE? WHICH JOB? TO HELP FIND THE ANSWERS TO THESE AND OTHER QUESTIONS, EAST HIGH OFFERS THE FOLLOWING SUGGESTIONS.

ON THE BASIS OF PAST ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE, INTERESTS, AND FINANCIAL STATUS, JR'S SHOULD CONSIDER 3 OR 4 COLLEGES WHICH MAY FIT THEIR NEEDS. IF A CATALOG FOR A COLLEGE IS NOT AVAILABLE, THE PERTINENT INFORMATION MAY BE OBTAINED FROM BOOKS IN THE SCHOOL COUNSELING OFFICE. IF A STUDENT'S GRADES ARE BELOW A "C" AVERAGE, THE SCHOOL COUNSELORS HELP HIM/HER TO DECIDE UPON A JUNIOR COLLEGE OR A TECHNICAL SCHOOL.

DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR STANDARDIZED TESTS ARE ADMINISTERED. THESE ARE PREDICTIVE OF A STUDENT'S FUTURE ACADEMIC SUCCESS. FINDING OUT ABOUT SUCH INTERESTS AND ABILITIES WILL ASSIST

LAST FRI, SEPT 28, WILLIAM A. EGAN ANNOUNCED APPOINTMENT OF A 16-MEMBER STATE-WIDE ALASKA CENTENNIAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO STUDY AND SUGGEST MEANS OF OBSERVING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF ALASKA'S PURCHASE FROM RUSSIA TO BE HELD IN 1967.

FORMATION OF SUCH A COMMITTEE WAS AUTHORIZED BY THE 1962 LEGISLATURE AT GOV. EGAN'S REQUEST. ITS WORK WILL BE COORDINATED BY COMMISSIONER HENRY ROLOFF OF THE DEPT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING. ROLOFF PLANS TO CALL A MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE IN ANCHORAGE WITHIN THE NEXT SEVERAL WEEKS TO LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR ITS STUDY.

THE COMMITTEE IS CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF STUDYING SIMILAR CELEBRATIONS WHICH HAVE BEEN HELD IN OTHER AREAS OF THE U.S. & IS TO REPORT TO THE GOV PRIOR TO THE '63 LEGISLATURE WITH SUGGESTIONS FOR MEANS OF PLANNING & FINANCING THE '67 OBSERVANCE.

IN ANNOUNCING APPOINTMENT OF THE COMMITTEE, GOV EGAN SAID: "THE ACQUISITION OF ALASKA FROM RUSSIA BY THE U.S. IS A SIGNIFICANT CHAPTER NOT ONLY IN THE HISTORY OF ALASKA & THE UNITED STATES, BUT ALSO IN THE COURSE OF WORLD EVENTS. CERTAINLY, IT IS AN OCCASION WORTHY OF STATE-WIDE CELEBRATION AND ONE WHICH WILL PROVIDE A FITTING FORUM FOR A RE-TELLING OF THE STORY OF ALASKA'S HERITAGE, ITS ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND ITS FUTURE."



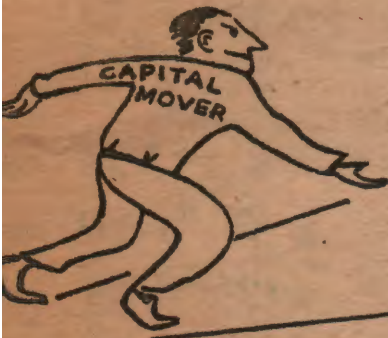

More Views From Alaskans United

ALASKANS WILL PAY THE BILL AND IT WILL HAVE TO BE PAID WITH TAX MONEY. DOES ANYONE REALLY BELIEVE THE PROPOSITION THAT 8400 ACRES OF STATE LAND CAN BE SOLD IN A NEW CAPITAL SITE FOR A SUFFICIENT SUM TO FINANCE THE ENTIRE COST OF MOVING THE CAPITAL? CERTAINLY \$150,000,000 IS A CONSERVATIVE ESTIMATE OF THE COST OF SUCH A MOVE WHERE AN ENTIRE NEW CITY MUST BE DEVELOPED. DO YOU THINK THAT ANYTHING LIKE THIS FIGURE COULD BE RAISED BY LAND SALES? EACH ACRE WOULD HAVE TO SELL FOR AN AVERAGE OF AT LEAST \$25,000. BECAUSE OF A JUSTIFIABLY HIGHER WAGE RATE IN WESTERN ALASKA, OPERATING COSTS OF A STATE GOVERNMENT IN THE WESTWARD AREA WILL BE PERPETUALLY HIGHER THAN THEY ARE NOW. THIS WILL NOT BE OFFSET BY TRAVEL DIFFERENCES. STATE OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES WHO TRAVEL NORMALLY TROUBLE THE STATE ON THEIR TRIPS. THIS IS TRUE OF THE BULK OF SUCH TRAVEL, AND WHETHER THE TRIP ORIGINATES IN WESTERN ALASKA, SOUTHEAST ALASKA OR ELSEWHERE, THE TRAVEL COST WILL BE THE SAME. STATE OFFICIALS IN ALL MAJOR DEPARTMENTS SAY FLATLY THAT THIS IS TRUE.

TAKE YOUR OWN INDEPENDENT LOOK AT YOUR PRESENT CAPITAL. MANY HAVE BEEN LOOKING AT JUNEAU THROUGH THE EYES OF THE ADVOCATES OF THE CAPITAL MOVE, WITHOUT MAKING THEIR OWN INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS.

IS JUNEAU ACCESSIBLE? AT THE TIME OF THE LAST INITIATIVE, PROPONENTS OF THE MOVE CLAIMED THAT THE JUNEAU AIRPORT COULD NEVER BE SERVICED BY JET AIRLINES. NEVERTHELESS, TWICE DAILY JET AIRLINE SERVICE BY PAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC NORTHERN AIRLINES WAS INAUGURATED EARLY THIS YEAR USING JUNEAU'S NEW 8500 FT RUNWAY WITH THE LATEST ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT. SINCE JANUARY THERE HAS BEEN 96.8 % COMPLETION OF SCHEDULED FLIGHTS. A NEW LOCALIZER WAS PUT IN OPERATION IN APRIL & SINCE THEN THERE HAS BEEN 100% COMPLETION. WITH THE ADVENT OF THE MARINE HIGHWAY IN SOUTHEAST ALASKA EARLY NEXT YEAR JUNEAU WILL BE ACCESSIBLE BY AUTO ON A YEAR ROUND BASIS. THE HAINES CUTOFF WILL BE KEPT OPEN THROUGHOUT THE WINTER AND RESIDENTS OF INTERIOR ALASKA WILL BE ABLE TO DRIVE TO THE CAPITAL CITY ANY TIME DURING THE YEAR. THOSE COMING TO THE CAPITAL FROM THE LOWER 48 STATES WILL BE ABLE TO DRIVE NORTH TO THE CAPITAL VIA PRINCE RUPERT.

DOES JUNEAU HAVE ROOM FOR CAPITAL EXPANSION? JUNEAU HAS MORE PROPERTY CONTIGUOUS

TO ITS EXISTING STATE OFFICE BUILDINGS THAN THE STATE OF OREGON IS PRESENTLY USING FOR ITS CAPITAL SITE. NEARLY 30 ACRES ARE AVAILABLE FOR CAPITAL EXPANSION AND THIS IS MORE THAN ADEQUATE FOR OUR NEEDS FOR AS FAR INTO THE FUTURE AS ANYONE CAN SEE. SHOULD IT EVER BE NECESSARY, THERE IS AMPLE ROOM FOR EXPANSION BEYOND THESE 30 ACRES.

IS THE LAND SATISFACTORY FOR CONSTRUCTION? IN 1963 THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT WILL CONSTRUCT AN 8 OR 9 STORY FEDERAL BUILDING OF MODERN DESIGN AT A COST OF ABOUT \$18,000,000 ON ALMOST IDENTICAL LAND ONLY A FEW HUNDRED FEET DISTANT. THIS IS THE SAME TYPE OF LAND THAT AN EXPERT FROM BRASILIA WAS IMPORTED 2 YEARS AGO TO TELL YOU WAS "TIDAL OOZE" AND UNSUITABLE TO HOLD A MULTI-STORY BUILDING. THE LAND WAS THOROUGHLY TESTED BEFORE THE SITE WAS CHOSEN FOR THE NEW FEDERAL BUILDING, AND IT WAS FOUND TO PRESENT NO CONSTRUCTION PROBLEMS WHATEVER.

JUNEAU HAS ADEQUATE OFFICE BUILDINGS. JUNEAU HAS THE

BASIC NUCLEUS OF PERMANENT GOVERNMENTAL STRUCTURES THAT CAN BE EXPANDED SLOWLY AS THE NEED ARISES AND AS THE STATE CAN AFFORD IT. THESE STRUCTURES ARE: (1) THE STATE CAPITAL BUILDING, (2) THE ALASKA OFFICE BUILDING, (3) THE SUPPORT BUILDING, (4) THE TERRITORIAL BUILDING, AND (5) THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION. OVER THE PAST THREE YEARS FEDERAL AGENCIES HAVE BEEN MOVING OUT OF STATE-OWNED BUILDINGS TO MAKE WAY FOR THE ADDED SPACE REQUIREMENTS OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT, AND ADDITIONAL PRIVATELY-OWNED OFFICE BUILDINGS HAVE BEEN CONSTRUCTED TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THESE FEDERAL BUREAUS. WHEN THE NEW FEDERAL BUILDING IS COMPLETED IN 1965 MUCH ADDITIONAL OFFICE SPACE WILL BECOME AVAILABLE FOR RENTAL AT LOW RATES THROUGHOUT THE AREA. THE STATE IS INDEED FORTUNATE THAT LARGE SUMS OF MONEY DO NOT NEED TO BE INVESTED IN CAPITAL BUILDINGS DURING THIS PERIOD WHEN STATE FUNDS ARE SORELY NEEDED FOR SO MANY OTHER URGENT NECESSITIES.

CAPT. LARSON SAID THAT A FRIEND, DR. GAY, WHO QUOTED A FRIEND OF HIS: "THE TROUBLE WITH THE AMERICAN IS THAT HE IS TOO PREOCCUPIED WITH BECOMING INSTEAD OF BEING."

ONE OF THE SERVICES OF THE FIRE DEPT IS THE LITTLE RED WAGON. THE FIRE DEPT HAS ABOUT 1,000 CALLS A YEAR FOR THE LITTLE RED WAGON; THEY PICK UP BETWEEN 2,000 CALLS AND 2,500 PEOPLE.

ON AN AVERAGE THERE ARE 8 TO 10 BABIES BORN IN THE RESCUE TRUCK A YEAR.

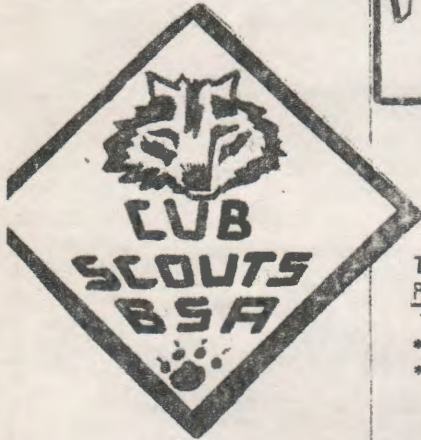

DO HAVE A DESIGNATED LOCATION FOR MEETING YOUR CHILD, PREFERABLY ON THE SCHOOL SIDE OF THE STREET AWAY FROM THE CROSSWALK OR CORNER, AND, IF POSSIBLE, ON A DIFFERENT SIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING FROM THAT WHICH PEDESTRIAN PUPILS ARE USING. LET YOUR CHILD OUT AT THE SAME SPOT IN THE MORNINGS.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS AND SIGNS, YIELD RIGHT OF WAY, AND GIVE THE HAND SIGNALS INDICATING TURNS, SLOW, AND STOP. THE MOST COMMON TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS ARE: FAILING TO YIELD RIGHT OF WAY, CUTTING IN OR OUT OF TRAFFIC, DISREGARDING CONTROL DEVICES, RIDING AGAINST TRAFFIC, AND IMPROPER TURNING. OF COURSE, BIKE STUNTS AND RIDING TWO AHEAD ARE OUT.

ALSO THE BICYCLE, LIKE THE AUTOMOBILE, MUST BE KEPT IN GOOD MECHANICAL CONDITION.

IF YOUR CHILD TAKES THE SCHOOL BUS

CROSSING THE HIGHWAY TO AND FROM THE BUS STOP IS PROBABLY THE GREATEST SINGLE HAZARD HE FACES. LAWS THAT REQUIRE A MOTORIST TO HALT FOR A STOPPED SCHOOL BUS VARY FROM STATE TO STATE. SOME STATES

Back To School

a dangerous journey

THE FOLLOWING IS A REPRINT OF AN ARTICLE WHICH APPEARED IN THE FALL 1962 EDITION (VOL. 21, NO. 3) OF "FAMILY SAFETY" WHICH IS PUBLISHED BY NATIONAL SAFETY COUNCIL.

TIPS FOR PARENTS ON HOW TO GET YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL AND BACK SAFELY.

THIS FALL, A QUARTER OF THE AMERICAN POPULATION WILL GO BACK ON THE JOB, SCHOOL BELLS WILL RING, AND AMID GROANS, GRUMBLES, AND A FEW MIXED CHEERS, 45 MILLION CHILDREN WILL SETTLE DOWN TO THE SERIOUS BUSINESS OF GETTING AN EDUCATION.

WILL YOUR CHILD BE AMONG THEM? IF SO, YOU SHOULD KNOW THAT THE BACK-TO-SCHOOL MOVEMENT IS LESS SAFE THAN YOU THINK. FOR A PUPIL ON HIS WAY TO SCHOOL IS MAKING A HAZARDOUS JOURNEY. DURING 1961, AN ESTIMATED 60,000 CHILDREN WERE HURT OR

KILLED GOING TO AND FROM SCHOOL.

WHETHER YOUR CHILD WALKS TO SCHOOL, RIDES A BICYCLE, TAKES A BUS OR IS DRIVEN IN THE CAR BY YOU, THERE ARE CERTAIN PRECAUTIONS THAT WILL HELP PREVENT HIS HAVING AN ACCIDENT.

IF YOU DRIVE YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL

DON'T LOAD OR UNLOAD CHILDREN ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE SCHOOL, MAKING IT NECESSARY FOR THEM TO OPEN THE DOOR ON THE STREET SIDE OF THE CAR, AND EITHER TO RUN ACROSS OR DART BEHIND THE AUTO TO THE CURB. BOTH ACTIONS MAKE THE CHILD A TARGET FOR PASSING CARS.

DON'T LOAD OR UNLOAD IN MID-BLOCK. THIS ENCOURAGES CHILDREN TO CROSS AT THIS POINT RATHER THAN AT THE CORNER.

DON'T STOP ON THE CROSSWALK. THIS IS UNFAIR BOTH TO CHILDREN WHO MUST CROSS AND TO THE SAFETY PATROLS WHO ARE TRYING TO DIRECT THEM.

DON'T DOUBLE PARK OR STOP TOO CLOSE TO THE CROSSWALK. THIS MAKES IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE CROSSING

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at the Muldoon Civic Center
(approximately 1/4 mi off the by-pass road)

Eagle River-Chugiak neighbors are extended a cordial invitation

THROUGH YOUR PTA, TRY TO ARRANGE FOR THE SCHOOL TO DISMISS CHILDREN WITH RIDES ON A DIFFERENT SIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING FROM THOSE WHO WALK, OR TO DISMISS ONE GROUP SLIGHTLY EARLIER THAN THE OTHER.

USE MORE THAN ORDINARY CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING A SCHOOL. KNOW AND RESPECT ALL TRAFFIC LAWS AND SCHOOL REGULATIONS. THEIR OBSERVANCE CONTRIBUTES TO YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY AND TRAINING.

IF YOUR CHILD RIDES A BIKE

IF THERE ARE NO SPECIFIC LAWS GOVERNING BICYCLES IN YOUR COMMUNITY, BICYCLISTS FOLLOW THE SAME LAWS AS THOSE FOR MOTORISTS. SINCE THE BICYCLE RIDER IS MOVING IN TRAFFIC, HE NEEDS TO OBSERVE

DO NOT REQUIRE CARS ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF A MULTIPLE-LANE HIGHWAY TO STOP; IN OTHERS, THE CENTER PARKWAY MUST BE OF A SPECIFIED WIDTH BEFORE AUTOS ARE REQUIRED TO STOP. IN MANY PLACES, THESE LAWS APPLY TO RURAL AREAS ONLY.

BUT EVEN IF YOUR LAW REQUIRES ALL CARS TO STOP, IT IS NEVER SAFE TO ASSUME THAT MOTORISTS WILL OBEY THEM. YOUR CHILD SHOULD CROSS ON A SIGNAL FROM THE BUS DRIVER OR A SCHOOL BUS PATROL, AFTER HE LOOKS BOTH WAYS HIMSELF.

OTHER RULES HE SHOULD FOLLOW ARE:

ARRIVE AT THE BUS STOP IN PLENTY OF TIME. HE SHOULD LEAVE HOME EARLY ENOUGH

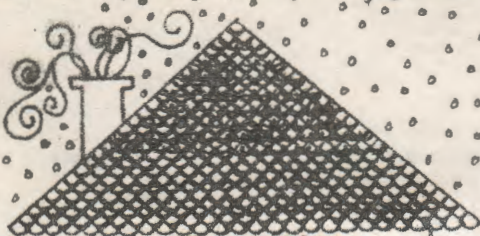

FAST THAT HE HAS TIME TO

MAKING A LAST-MINUTE

BOARD THE BUS WITHOUT DELAY,
TAKING A SINGLE LINE, AND WITHOUT
DISRUPTING. IF THE BUS DRIVER
OR SCHOOL BUS PATROL ASSIGNS
SEATING, TAKE IT QUICKLY AND
POLITELY.

REMAIN SEATED AND AVOID LOUD
BOISTEROUS CONVERSATIONS
ON THE ROUTE. OBEY DIRECTIONS
GIVEN BY THE DRIVER PROMPTLY AND
WITHOUT ARGUMENT.

YOUR CHILD WALKS TO SCHOOL

IF HE IS GOING TO SCHOOL FOR
THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR, SIT
DOWN WITH HIM AND MAP OUT THE
BEST ROUTE TO SCHOOL. FIND
OUT FROM SCHOOL OFFICIALS
BEFORE OR TO OPENING DAY IF ROUTES
HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED. YOU
SHOULD WALK WITH YOUR CHILD
ON HIS FIRST DAY SO YOU CAN POINT
