Back To School

a dangerous journey

THE FOLLOWING IS A REPRINT OF AN ARTICLE WHICH APPEARED IN THE FALL 1962 EDITION (VOL. 21, NO. 3) OF "FAMILY SAFETY" WHICH IS PUBLISHED BY NATIONAL SAFETY COUNCIL.

TIPS FOR PARENTS ON HOW TO GET YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL AND BACK SAFELY.

THIS FALL, A QUARTER OF THE AMERICAN POPULATION WILL GO BACK ON THE JOB. WILL GO BACK ON THE JOB, SCHOOL BELLS WILL RING, AND AMID GROANS, GRUMBLES, AND A FEW MIXED CHEERS, 45 MILLION CHILDREN WILL SETTLE DOWN TO THE SERIOUS BUSINESS OF GETTING AN EDUCATION .

WILL YOUR CHILD BE AMONG THEM? IF SO, YOU SHOULD KNOW THAT THE BACK-TO SCHOOL MOVEMENT IS LESS SAFE THAN YOU THINK. FOR A PUPIL ON HIS WAY TO SCHOOL IS MAKING A HAZARD-OUS JOURNEY. DURING 1961, AN ESTIMATED 60,000 CHILDREN WERE HURT OR KILLED GOING TO AND FROM SCHOOL.

WHETHER YOUR CHILD WALKS TO SCHOOL, RIDES A BICYCLE, TAKES A BUS OR IS DRIVEN IN THE CAR BY YOU, THERE ARE CERTAIN PRECAUTIONS THAT WILL HELP PREVENT HIS HAVING AN ACCIDENT.

IF YOU DRIVE YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL

DON'T LOAD OR UNLOAD CHILDREN ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE SCHOOL, MAKING IT NECESSARY FOR THEM TO OPEN THE DOOR ON THE STREET SIDE OF THE CAR, AND EITHER TO RUN ACROSS OR DART BEHIND THE AUTO TO THE CURB. BOTH ACTIONS MAKE THE CHILD A TARGET FOR PASSING CARS.

DON'T LOAD OR UNLOAD IN MID-BLOCK. THIS ENCOURAGES CHILDREN TO CROSS AT THIS POINT RATHER THAN AT THE CORNER.

DON'T STOP ON THE CROSSWALK. THIS IS UNFAIR BOTH TO CHILDREN WHO MUST CROSS AND TO THE SAFETY PATROLS WHO ARE TRYING TO DIRECT THEM.

DON'T DOUBLE PARK OR STOP TOO CLOSE TO THE CROSSWALK. THIS MAKES IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE CROSSING

AND PATROLS TO SEE OR BE SEEN BY ONCOMING CARS.

DON'T PULL IN FRONT OF A SCHOOL BUS IN A LAST-MINUTE DASH TO AVOID HAVING YOUR CHILD MISS IT. THIS PRACTICE ENDANGERS THE LIVES OF CHILDREN BOARDING THE BUS AND COULD RESULT IN A SER-IOUS ACCIDENT.

DO POOL RIDES WITH NEIGHBORS WHENEVER POSSIBLE TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF CARS IN. THE SCHOOL AREA.

DO HAVE A DESIGNATED LOCA-TION FOR MEETING YOUR CHILD, PREFERABLY ON THE SCHOOL SIDE OF THE STREET AWAY FROM THE CROSSWALK OR CORNER, AND, IF POSSIBLE, ON A DIFFERENT SIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING FROM THAT WHICH PEDESTRIAN PUPILS ARE USING. LET YOUR CHILD OUT AT THE SAME SPOT IN THE MORN INGS.

TRAFFIC LIGHTS AND SIGNS, YIELD RIGHT OF WAY, AND GIVE THE HAND SIGNALS IND -CATING TURNS, SLOW, AND STOP. THE MOST COMMON TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS ARE: FAILING TO VIELD RIGHT OF WAY, CUTTING IN OR OUT OF TRAFFIC, DISREGARD ING CON-TROL DEVICES, RIDING CON-TROL DEVICES, RIDING AGAINST TRAFFIC, AND IMPROPER TURN-ING. OF COURSE, BIKE STUNTS AND RIDING TWO ABREAST ARE OUT.

ALSO THE BICYCLE, LIKE THE AUTOMOBILE, MUST BE KEPT IN GOOD MECHANICAL CONDITION

IF YOUR CHILD TAKES THE SCHOOL BUS

CROSSING THE HIGHWAY TO AND FROM THE BUS STOP IS PROBABLY THE GREATEST SINGLE HAZARD HE FACES. LAWS THAT REQUIRE A MOTORIST TO HALT FOR A STOPPED SCHOOL BUS VARY FROM STATE TO STATE. SOME STATES

THROUGH YOUR PTA, TRY TO ARRANGE FOR THE SCHOOL TO DISMISS CHILDREN WITH RIDES ON A DIFFERENT SIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING FROM THOSE WHO WALK, OR TO DISMISS ONE GROUP SLIGHTLY EARLIER THAN THE OTHER.

USE MORE THAN ORD INARY CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING A SCHOOL. KNOW AND RESPECT ALL TRAFFIC LAWS AND SCHOOL REGULATIONS. THEIR OBSERVANCE CONTRIBUTES TO YOUR CHILD'S SAFETY AND TRAINING.

IF YOUR CHILD RIDES A BIKE

IF THERE ARE NO SPECIFIC LAWS GOVERNING BICYCLES IN YOUR COMMUNITY, BICYCLISTS FOLLOW THE SAME LAWS AS THOSE FOR MOTORISTS. SINCE THE BI-CYCLE RIDER IS MOVING IN TRAFFIC, HE NEEDS TO OBSERVE

DO NOT REQUIRE CARS ON THE O PPOSITE SIDE OF A MULTIPLE. LANE HIGHWAY TO STOP; IN CANE HIGHWAY TO STOP; IN OTHERS, THE CENTER PARKWAY MUST BE OF A SPECIFIED WIDTH BEFORE AUTOS ARE REQUIRED TO STOP. IN MANY PLACES, THESE LAWS APPLY TO RURAL AREAS ONLY.

BUT EVEN IF YOUR LAW REQUIRES ALL CARS TO STOP, IT IS NEVER SAFE TO ASSUME THAT MOTORISTS WILLIOBEY THEM. YOUR CHILD SHOULD CROSS ON A SIGNAL FROM THE BUS DRIVER OR A SCHOOL BUS PATROL, AFTER HE LOOKS BOTH WAYS HIMSELF.

OTHER RULES HE SHOULD FOL-LOW ARE:

ARRIVE AT THE BUS STOP IN PLENTY OF TIME. HE SHOULD LEAVE HOME EARLY ENOUGH (CONT. PAGE 20)
