THE URGENT MEETING WAS HELD IN THE MULTI-PURPOSE ROOM OF THE CHUGIAK SCHOOL AT 8 PM. APPROXIMATELY BO LOCAL NEIGHBORS ASSEMBLED TO HEAR GENE BENITO, OUR NEWLY APPOINTED DIST CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR AND HIS FRIEND, BILL BANKS, OUTLINE THE STATE C.D. PLAN AND THE STATE REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH DIST.

THE MEETING MOVED ALONG WITH GENE & BILL CLEARLY ADVISING THOSE PRESENT OF THE NEED FOR A WELL ORGANIZED C.D.
