A COMMENDABLE NUMBER OF EAGLE RIVER - CHUGIAK RESIDENTS TURNED OUT LAST MON NIGHT, OCT 29, FOR THE SECOND CIVIL DEFENSE MEETING HELD LOCALLY TO RE-ORGANIZE THE C.D. PROGRAM FOR THIS DISTRICT.

THE URGENT MEETING WAS HELD IN THE MULTI-PURPOSE ROOM OF THE CHUGIAK SCHOOL AT 8 PM. APPROXIMATELY 80 LOCAL NEIGHBORS ASSEMBLED TO HEAR GENE BENITO, OUR NEWLY APPOINTED DIST CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR AND HIS FRIEND, BILL BANKS, OUTLINE THE STATE C.D. PLAN AND THE STATE REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH DIST.

THE MEETING MOVED ALONG WITH GENE & BILL CLEARLY ADVISING THOSE PRESENT OF THE NEED FOR A WELL ORGANIZED C.D. PROGRAM IN OUR AREA AND THE STEPS THAT MUST BE TAKEN TO GET THIS VITAL SERVICE UNDERWAY. GENE & BILL TOLD WHAT ASSISTANCE WE COULD EXPECT FROM STATE & FEDERAL AGENCIES & WHAT TASKS ARE UP TO US, THE RESIDENTS OF THIS AREA, TO PERFORM. THE FACTS WERE CLEARLY STATED AND LEFT NO DOUBT IN ANYONE'S MIND BUT THAT WE HAVE GOT TO DO FOR OURSELVES AND GET STARTED IMMEDIATELY. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT LABOR, TIME, TALENTS, EQUIPMENT & FINANCES WILL BE REQUIRED & THAT OUR LOCAL CIVIL DEFENSE PROGRAM MUST BECOME A PROJECT THAT WE MAKE THE TIME FOR IF WE ARE TO HAVE ANY CHANCE OF SURVIVAL IN THE EVENT OF AN ENEMY ATTACK.

EVENTS OF LAST WEEK APPARENTLY PROMPTED MORE THAN ONE OF US TO DROP WHAT WE WERE DOING AND ATTEND MONDAY'S MEETING WITH FIRM RESOLVE THAT WE WOULD DO SOMETHING NOW & NOT PUT IT OFF ANY LONGER (HOPING WE HAVEN'T ALREADY WAITED TOO LONG.)

THE FIRST STEP IN REORGANIZING, AS POINTED OUT BY GENE, WAS THE NECESSITY OF A COMMUNITY PLAN WHICH MUST BE SUBMITTED TO STATE C.D. OFFICIALS FOR APPROVAL. A COMMITTEE OF 8 PERSONS WAS DESIRABLE TO WORK WITH GENE IN FORMULATING THIS COMMUNITY PLAN. NOMINATIONS WERE TAKEN FROM THE FLOOR, AND IT WAS INDEED GRATIFYING TO NOTE

LATE THAT SUMMER (1950) THE COUPLE BOARDED A BUS TO SEATTLE AND TOOK A BOAT FROM THERE TO JUNEAU & WENT BY AIR TO BETHEL & ON TO KIPNUK, ALASKA. IN THIS NATIVE VILLAGE MAXINE TAUGHT BEGINNERS & FIRST GRADERS. AS SHE EXPLAINED IT, MANY OF THESE CHILDREN DID NOT SPEAK ENGLISH AND EVEN PRE-SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN ATTENDED SCHOOL TO LEARN OUR LANGUAGE. AFTER A YEAR THERE THE STEPHENS WERE TRANSFERRED TO PILOT STATION ON THE YUKON RIVER. THERE THEY TAUGHT ALL GRADES IN ANOTHER GOVERNMENT SCHOOL.

THE COUPLE TOOK A 6 WEEKS LEAVE OF ABSENCE & FLEW TO OKLA WHERE THEIR FIRST SON, BRANT ALAN, WAS BORN. WHEN THE INFANT WAS JUST 3 WEEKS OLD THE STEPHENS RETURNED TO PILOT STATION AND COMPLETED THE SCHOOL TERM. THEY REMAINED THERE TILL THE SPRING OF 1954 & MADE ANOTHER TRIP TO ADA, OKLA, WHERE THEIR 2ND SON, CLAYTON THOMAS, WAS BORN IN JULY.

THE COUPLE AND THEIR TWO BOYS SPENT THAT SUMMER VISITING BOTH THEIR FAMILIES & THEN MOVED TO DENVER, COLO, UNTIL THE SPRING OF 1955. WHILE IN DENVER THEY OPERATED A TRAILER COURT.
