SEARCH CONTINUES

PRIVATE PILOTS & THE SEWARD C.A.P. CONTINUED THE AIR SEARCH FOR TWO EAGLE RIVER MEN LAST WEEK-END & ALL THIS WEEK, AS WEATHER PERMITTED. ACCORDING TO MRS ELDON TAILOR OF ANCHORAGE (WHO WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN GETTING PRIVATE PILOTS TO PARTICIPATE IN CONTINUING THE SEARCH AFTER THE ANCHORAGE C.A.P. & RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER DISBANDONED THEIR EFFORTS) FLYERS ARE STILL TAKING OFF FROM SEWARD WHENEVER WEATHER ALLOWS IN THE HOPES OF FINDING SOME CLUE TO THE DISAPPEARANCE OF LEONARD (CORKY) IVIE & BERNARD (BERNIE) VÄVERKA. THE TWO FRIENDS DIDNOT RETURN FROM A WEEK-END HUNTING TRIP TO MONTAGUE ISLAND ALMOST FOUR WEEKS AGO.

REWARD OF LOCAL EFFORTS

LAST TUES, NOV 6, 1962, ALASKAN VOTERS APPROVED A BOND ISSUE WHICH INCLUDED \$1,200,000 FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A HIGH SCHOOL IN THE CHUGIAK-EAGLE RIVER AREA.

TWO YEARS AGO A PETITION WAS CIRCULATED BY THE CHUGIAK PTA POINTING OUT, AMONG OTHER CLASSROOM REQUIREMENTS, THE NEED FOR A HIGH SCHOOL IN THIS AREA. BETWEEN THESE TWO RELATED EVENTS, ENOUGH ACTION TOOK PLACE TO FILL A VERY LARGE BOOK. MANY HOURS BY MANY PEOPLE HAVE SPREAD THE NAME "CHUGIAK" THROUGHOUT THE LENGTH & BREADTH OF ALASKA. ALTHOUGH THE SUCCESSFUL CULMINATION OF ALL THESE EFFORTS IS A HIGH SCHOOL FOR THIS AREA, AN INTERESTING BY-PRODUCT DEVELOPED. THIS HAS ALSO BEEN AN EXPERIMENT IN HUMAN RELATIONS. THE 26 CHURCH, BUSINESS, SOCIAL AND SERVICE TYPE ORGANIZATIONS COMPRISING OPERATION CHUGIAK HIGH SCHOOL (O.C.H.S.) HAS PROVEN CONCLUSIVELY, IT IS POSSIBLE FOR THE PEOPLE OF THIS COMMUNITY TO WORK TOGETHER TO ACHIEVE A COMMON GOAL. THE ROAD HAS BEEN ROUGH AT TIMES, BUT THE FINAL VICTORY IS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE MANY PEOPLE WHO HELPED, EACH IN HIS OWN WAY, TO MAKING THIS VENTURE A SUCCESS. IT HAS BEEN A PLEASURE TO HAVE BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH THE MANY FINE PEOPLE OF THE COMMUNITY ON THIS ENDEAVOR, AND I WISH TO THANK THEM ALL FOR THE WILLINGNESS AND COOPERATION DISPLAYED.



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



REV WAYNE HULL, CHAIRMAN OF THE CHUGIAK ADVISORY SCHOOL BOARD, IS IN RECEIPT OF A LETTER FROM THE ACTING COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION, ROBERT P. ISAAC, WHICH WAS DATED NOV 1, 1962.

SEVERAL OTHER AVAILABLE SITES IN THE EAGLE RIVER - CHUGIAK AREA WERE ALSO CONSIDERED AND VIEWED. BUT, FROM MR. ISAAC'S REPLY, EACH HAS ITS DRAW-BACKS. MR. ISAAC WENT ON TO SAY, "I BELIEVE THAT A SITE COULD BE PURCHASED UNDER THE BONDING PROGRAM... AS WE ALREADY KNOW, MONIES FROM THE SALE OF SCHOOL BONDS IS SUPPOSED TO GO SPECIFICALLY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM AND NONE OF IT CAN BE USED FOR LAND PURCHASE UNDER THE PRESENT PROVISIONS OF THE BOND ISSUE.

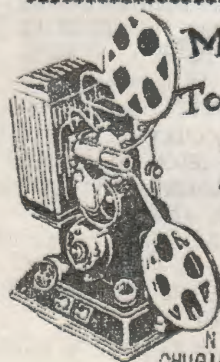

AS A YOUNGSTER HE ENJOYED HUNTING & FISHING, WAS A 4-H GARDENER, A MEMBER OF THE PIONEERS (A YMCA SPONSORED YOUTH GROUP), AND OF COURSE HAD HIS SHARE OF CHORES TO DO AT HOME: MILKING THE COWS, FEEDING THE CHICKENS, WORKING IN THE FAMILY GARDEN, ETC.

WAYNE ATTENDED THREE YEARS AT HORACE MANN JR HIGH WHERE HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE LEADERS CLUB (A SCHOOL GYMNASIIC ORGANIZATION), A BOY SCOUT WHO REACHED THE RANK OF STAR SCOUT, AND WAS ALSO ACTIVE IN THE YOUTH ORGANIZATION OF THE CHURCH. MEET NEIGHBOR (CONTINUED)

THROUGH METHODIST LITERATURE THE HULLS LEARNED OF THE NEED FOR METHODIST MINISTERS AND TEACHERS IN ALASKA AND WAYNE FELT A STRONG DESIRE TO COME TO THE TERRITORY. HE APPLIED FOR ASSIGNMENT TO ALASKA EXPECTING IT WOULD TAKE QUITE SOME TIME. INSTEAD, EIGHT MONTHS LATER THE FAMILY WAS PACKING. THEY SOLD ALL THEIR POSSESSIONS AND FLEW TO ANCHORAGE. WAYNE RECEIVED AN APPOINTMENT TO KENAI AND NINILCHIK. THE HULLS LIVED IN KENAI, HELPED TO BUILD THE CHURCH AND PARSONAGE AND DEVELOPED THE CONGREGATION FROM SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES HELD IN THE LIBRARY TO A FULLY FUNCTIONING CHURCH. THROUGH THEIR EFFORTS, THE METHODIST CHURCH AT NINILCHIK WAS ALSO DEVELOPED. THE HULLS SERVED IN THAT AREA FOUR YEARS.

THE FAMILY TOOK A THREE MONTH FURLOUGH AND TRAVELED TO THE MID-WEST TO VISIT BOTH THEIR FAMILIES. UPON THEIR RETURN WAYNE ACCEPTED APPOINTMENT TO THE CHUGIAK METHODIST CHURCH. BOTH HE AND ESTHER FELT THERE WAS REAL GROWTH POTENTIAL HERE AND HAVE FOUND THIS A CHALLENGE. THEY MOVED INTO THE METHODIST PARSONAGE AT EAGLE RIVER AND IN THE PAST THREE YEARS HAVE BEEN HAPPY TO SEE THE CHURCH GROW JUST AS THE AREA HAS GROWN. IN ADDITION TO THE SUNDAY SCHOOL AND REGULAR SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP SERVICES, BOTH THE JR & SR MYF GROUPS HAVE BEEN FORMED, JR & SR CHOIRS HAVE BEEN ORGANIZED, THE WSCS OF THE CHURCH HAS BEEN REACTIVATED AS HAS THE METHODIST MEN'S GROUP. THE CAMP SITE IN BIRCHWOOD WHICH WAS PURCHASED SHORTLY BEFORE THE HULLS' ARRIVAL IN OUR COMMUNITY HAS SINCE BEEN (CONT NEXT PAGE)

DEVELOPED AND THREE SUMMER CAMP SESSIONS HAVE BEEN HELD THERE. THE METHODIST SUMMER VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL HAS ALSO BECOME QUITE POPULAR WITH LOCAL CHILDREN.

ONE YEAR AGO LAST MONTH THE HULLS WERE GRATIFIED WHEN THEIR METHODIST CONGREGATION MOVED INTO THE BASEMENT QUARTERS OF THE NEW CHURCH AT MILE 18. CONSTRUCTION HAD BEGUN ON THE 13 ACRES IN JUNE 1961 AND FIRST SERVICES WERE HELD IN THE BUILDING LAST OCT. THROUGH THE DEDICATED ENDEAVORS OF BOTH WAYNE AND ESTHER, THE CHUGIAK METHODIST CHURCH HAS GROWN AND BECOME A TREASURED PART IN THE LIVES OF A NUMBER OF EAGLE RIVER-CHUGIAK RESIDENTS.

IN ADDITION TO HIS MINISTERIAL DUTIES, WAYNE TAKES AN ACTIVE INTEREST AND PART IN OTHER COMMUNITY FUNCTIONS. HE IS PRESENTLY CHAIRMAN OF THE CHUGIAK ADVISORY SCHOOL BOARD, IS A CAP CHAPLAIN & ENJOYS MANY OF THE OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES ALASKA AFFORDS. HIS PLEASURE IN HUNTING & FISHING IS ENJOYED AS TIME PERMITS AND HE HAS BAGGED AT LEAST ONE OF ALL THE BIG GAME SPECIES THIS STATE OFFERS. HE OFTEN TAKES HIS TWO SONS WITH HIM ON HUNTING-FISHING TRIPS AND SINCE COMING TO ALASKA, HE HAS TAKEN FLYING LESSONS & IS A STUDENT PILOT. HE EQUALLY ENJOYS RAISING A FAMILY GARDEN EACH YEAR, DOES A LOT OF READING AND IS A REGULAR CAMERA BUG. TWO PICTURES HE HAS TAKEN HAVE APPEARED IN "TOGETHER" MAGAZINE.

THE HULL FAMILY GREATLY ENJOYS TRAVEL. THEY HAVE VISITED MANY HISTORICAL & GEOGRAPHICAL LOCALES IN THE SOUTH 48, HAVE SEEN QUITE A BIT OF ALASKA & CANADA AND THIS PAST SUMMER MADE THEIR SECOND TRIP INTO OLD MEXICO.
