



The new automatic dishwashers also offer a greater choice of cycles for various types of loads. Many of them, for instance, have a heavy-duty cycle for pots and pans and a gentle one for glassware, as well as the usual washes and rinses.

If breakfast and lunch dishes are held in the dishwasher to be done after dinner, the rinseand-hold cycle found on many of the 1962 models keeps food from sticking stubbornly. This is another factor that has helped eliminate hand rinsing.

Whatever its size or type, an electric dishwasher is more of a work-saver than ever. The homemaker who has a 1962 model can completely eliminate hand rinsing as well as the
