Open house was held at the new Chugiak Post Office Building Last Saturday, Dec. 10th.

A special cake, which was an exact replica of the new building had been baked by Mrs. F.S. Lee of Swanee Slopes and was served with coffee to the guests and patrons.

The post office which normally closes at noon on Saturdays, remained open all day; and despite the icy roads, a large number of people attended.

The original Post Office in Chugiak opened on August 1st 1947 at the Moosehorn Trading Post with Marie McDowell as postmistress.

Present postmaster Paul Swanson recalled that the name of the community had been selected at a meeting of the community club when a number of names (among them "Bear Paw" and "Hoose Run")had been suggested (cont page 4 col 2)
