The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Co. has just put into service a newly overhauled 1941 Packard Ambulance, a gift from the Alaska Racing Association to the community.

Lt. Ted Brink, of the Rescue division stated that this is a factory built ambulance, fully enclosed and heated; a considerable improvement over the panel truck which has served as an ambulance in the past.

This new vehicle is fully equipped with a resuscitator and medical supplies and is designed to transport injured persons to the hospital and to administer First Aid enroute.

PETS WARN HOMESTEADER OF FIRE

A pet dog and cat were responsible for warning Mrs. Paul Jones of a chimney fire and making it possible for her to extinguish it before it caused serious damage.

Mrs. Jones said that she was awakened Sunday morning by the cat and dog leaping on her bed and apparently trying to warn her of something.

She smelled smoke and traced it to the chimney which was glowing with heat and apparently burning on the inside.

MRS. KULL ASSUMES NEW POSITION

Mrs. Dove M. Kull, district welfare worker in Anchorage since August 1959 has been promoted to the position of child welfare supervisor in the Department of Health and Welfare, Juneau office of the Public Welfare division.

The announcement was made today by Miss Marjorie Morris, division director. She said the state office position had been vacant since the resignation last fall of George Spartz who resigned to join the Bureau of Indian Affairs area office welfare staff in Juneau.

Mrs. Kull has her B.A. degree in social work from the University of Oklahoma and worked in both private and public social services in that state.

Prior to coming to Alaska, she was state assistant consultant on foster homes and adoptions for the Oklahoma State Department of Welfare.

Her new post in Juneau is one of the three state positions in the Welfare division.

Mrs. Kull was known in Chugiak as the field worker for the Department of Welfare, and worked here on local problems.

The group will be meeting weekly from now until the date of the show, to take care of all the necessary details.


The group meets today at the home of Darlene Robinson in Peters Creek, and will meet next Wednesday at the home of Bonnie Flint in Eagle River at 8:30.

SCALLOPED APPLES WITH PEANUT BUTTER

6 large tart apples
1/2 tsp salt
1/2 pound peanut brittle
4 tbs lemon juice

SPREAD thinly sliced apples over bottom of a baking dish
SPRINKLE with salt
PLACE a layer of peanut brittle (broken into small pieces) on top of apples
REPEAT with layer of apples & candy until all are used.
POUR lemon juice on top layer of apples before adding last layer of brittle
BAKE in slow oven for 1 hr.

BLARNEY STONES

5 eggs (reserve whites of 2 eggs)
2 cups sugar
3 cup flour
1 cup boiling water
1 tsp vanilla
Pinch salt
3 tsp baking powder
BEAT eggs until light
ADD sugar, water, flour, baking powder, salt & vanilla
BEAT well
POUR into square pan
BAKE at 350° for 35 min. or until done.

Cool and cut into squares

FROST with....

ICING:

1 1/2 spanish peanuts ground very fine
1 1/2 butter
1 1/2 powdered sugar
BEAT and add to egg whites beaten stiff

FROST cakes on all sides
ROLL in chopped nuts.
