

LEMON VELVET PIE

MIX TOGETHER:

11/3 cups sugar 6 tbs corn starch 1/2 tsp salt

ADD mixture slowly (stirring constantly) to

1½ cups boiling water COOK over Cirect heat, stirring occasionally until thick and smooth.

PLACE over boiling water and cook 15 minutes longer.

ADD 2 well beaten egg yolks 2 tbs butter

COOK 2 minutes longer REFOVE from heat

ADD 1/3 cup strained lemon juice

I tsp vanilla extract RELIOVE one scant cup of mixture and set aside to cool.

ADD to remaining hot liquid 1 tbs unflavored gelatin (softened in % cup water)

STIR until dissolved. BLEND in one cup canned milk

WHEN mixture begins to jell, FOLD in 2 stiffly beaten

egg whites POUR into balted pie shell COVER or GARNISH with cup

SPELLING BEE IS A TEST OF NERVES


Jerry Rankin, top Chugiak Speller, found out calong with the other contestants that a spelling Bee is as much a test of nerves, as it is a test of spelling ability.


