Move Underway For Local High School

"A High School in Chugiak by 1963, if we all pull together and work hard!" This possibility was brought to the attention to a group of interested citizens who met Monday evening at the home of Mrs. Ralph Long in Eagle River.

Mrs. Guy Johnson, of Peters Creek, reported of her conversation with Sec. of State of Alaska Hugh J. Wade and a later meeting with George T. Keefe, Representative of the State Department of Education for the Anchorage area which she attended along with Ed Willis of Eagle River.

Both Mr. Wade and Mr. Keefe felt that this was the time for Chugiak to put in their bid for a high school, and both men felt the chances for success were excellent.

In order to obtain the information necessary to present to the proper authorities (i.e., a survey of school land available, (min 20 acres) current maps and an up-to-date census) it was decided to form a committee consisting of residents from all sections of the community to conduct this survey.

A meeting has been called for Monday, June 5th at 8pm, to be held at the Chugiak VFW Hall at mile 21. Invitations to attend this meeting have been sent to all organizations within the area affected (from the Eagle River Bridge to the Knik Bridge). This includes all church groups, civic, social and fraternal clubs.

northern boundry should
remain the same, and that
any new boundry line fol-
low the line of Township
13, which is located at
approximately mile 15 1/2,
just past the Al Cross
residence.

This recommendation will
be submitted to Alaska
Secretary of State Hugh
J. Wade for his consid-
eration.

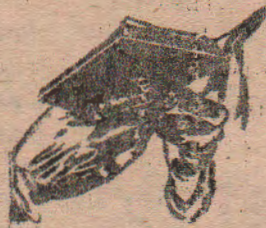

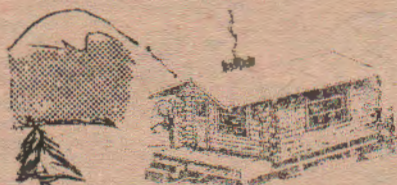

For her last recipe, Billie has given us a salad dressing which has zip and zing, and makes all salads sit up and take notice.

GARLIC SALAD DRESSING

- 1 can tomato soup
- 1/2 cup vinegar
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp paprika
- 1 tbs. Worcestersteshire Sauce
- 1 cup Mazola or other oil
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 tsp dry mustard
- 1 tsp scraped onion juice (or 1 whole onion)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 clove garlic, (scraped or diced)

MIX in quart jar
STORE in refrigerator

NOTE: The amount of sugar to be used in the cake recipe of last week was 1 1/2 cups, not 12 cups as was printed. (Shame on us!)

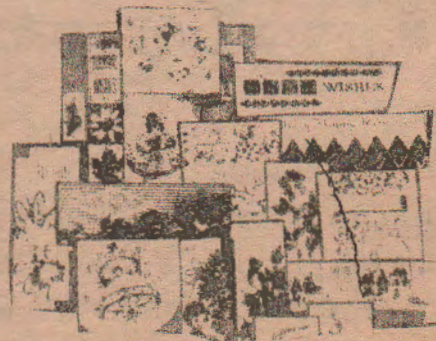

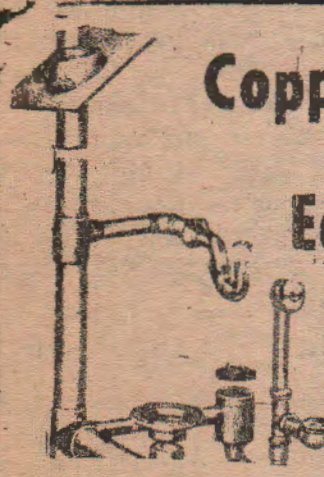

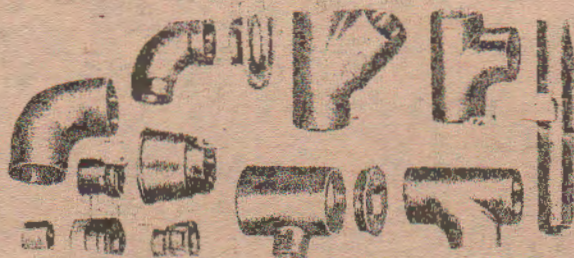
