## A WORD OF CAUTION

With the advent of summer, it seems that many youngsters are begging for motor scooters, motor bikes or some type of power driven vehicle.

Donald Westley, of the State Dept. of Public Safety, believes that parents be advised of the State Law governing the operation of any of the above vehicles.

A child thirteen years or older may operate a motor vehicle which does not exceed five horsepower. However, a special license to operate the vehicle must be purchased. This license costs two dollars for two years, and may be used until the youth is sixteen years of age, after which a regular drivers license must be obtained.

Proof of age and a parental consent form must also be presented.

Parents are also required to sign a form in which they assume all responsibility for any wilful misconduct or negligence which may occur by reason of operation of the vehicle.

Any deviation from the above constitutes the breaking of the law.

## (drivers license)

In the event of a child operating a motorized vehicle without a license, or operating a vehicle of greater horsepower than the license permits the parents are liable for any accident or damage which may result.

It was felt that many parents are of the opinion that a drivers license is unnecessary when operating such vehicles and a word of caution at this time may prevent considerable trouble in the future.

Drivers licenses may be obtained from Mr. Westley at the Chugiak Post Office every Thursday between 1 and 4pm.



The two recipes which Leanore gives us this week would either one make an ideal contribution to a pot luck dinner. One a hearty salad, and the other an unusual one dish meal.

## MACARONI SALAD

2 cups macaroni

Stephens achieved the goal of every boy at bat by belting a homer over the center field fence with the bases loaded.

A make up game was played the following night at Mt. View against the Dodgers, with Gary Hoag pitching a one hit shut out for another 29 to 0 win.




