### ACCIDENT VICTIM ONCE LIVED HERE

PETERS CREEK: Mrs. Hal Painter, who died last week in a traffic accident in Spokane Washington, was at one time a resident in the Peters Creek area.

Mrs. Painter and her husband resided at mile 22½ in the home originally built by Bob Stewart.

Mrs. Pinter was killed when her small foreign car struck a school bus near Spokane after skidding in the icy pavement.

Her three year old daughter Sharon, who was with her in the car at the time of the accident died a week later of a head injury.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Painter worked for the Anchorage Times during 1956 and 1957,

BIRCHWOOD: Mrs. Cristopher Brooks, of Peters Creek suffered only a cut lip and broke three of her front teeth in a collision with Donald Gene Sisson on the Birchwood Road last Saturday, December 8th.

Sharon Baker, a passenger in the Brooks car suffered a blow on the head.

Mrs. Brooks was driving south on the Birchwood Road, when the 1958 Mercury driven by Sisson, pulled out of a side road in front of her.

Mrs. Brooks said that she attempted to turn right to avoid hitting him, but skidded on the icy road and ran into him.

Two other passengers in the Brooks vehicle Aprile Stephens and Scott Brooks were uninjured.

Sisson, his wife Katherine and their three children all of whom live in Birchwood escaped injury.

Damage to Mrs. Brooks' 1962 Rambler Station Wagon was estimated at \$300, to the Mercury \$200.

Mrs. Brooks and Miss Baker were taken to the office of Dr. Marshall Simpson in Eagle River, where Mrs. Brooks had several stitches taken in her lip, and Miss Baker was examined to determine the extent of her injuries.

The fact the neither Mrs. Brooks or any of her passengers were not more seriously injured may have been due to the fact that they were all wearing seat belts.

Mrs. Brooks is the former Natalie Haskell and is a music teacher in the Chugiak School system.

State police did not issue any citations to either Mrs. Brooks or Mr. Sisson.

While the students of bus "4110" could like to complain about the heating system.

There are two heaters on the bus. One in the front of the bus on the right hand side, heating only the driver and the two front seats.

The second heater is under seat "11" heating only the people in that seat.

From past experiences, we have found this far inadequate under weather temperatures of 20° below.

Living out in an area like Peters Creek and Eagle River, many of the students are forced to walk from a quarter of a mile to a half a mile every day.

How many of us remember the taste of an old-fashioned Christmas pudding?  
Well, this week Laverne shares with us one handed down to her from her mother.

**STEAMED FRUIT PUDDING**

- 1 cup shortening
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup grated raw carrot
- 1 cup grated raw potato
- 1 cup grated raw apple
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp each: cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice
- 1 cup raisins cut in small pieces
- 1 cup candied fruit
- 1 egg (optional)
- 2 cups flour mixed with scant tsp baking powder

CREAM together sugar and shortening  
ADD egg and cream  
ADD remaining ingredients in order given  
MIX well  
TRANSFER to a 1 1/2 qt mold or two empty shortening cans greased and floured  
COVER and steam for 5 hours  
SERVE with hard sauce, lemon sauce or caramel sauce.
