MILK AND TRIM WAISTLINES

COLLEGE: Girls who are afraid to drink milk because they think it is fattening, don't have a scientific leg to stand on, according to Miss Agnes Sunnell, State Home Demonstration Leader with the Cooperative Extension Service, Unimmesity of Alaska.

She points to a test at Iowa State University to back up the claim.

The survey showed that the girls with the trimmest figures had drunk the most milk.

Actual results from the Iowa study with 297 teenage girls showed that obesity occurred in almost twice the number of girls who drank little milk, compared with those who drank a quart or more daily.

Other survey results showed that, after age 12, one girl in five fell into the over-weight category. Yet, only 16 percent of theese girls were from the group that were large milk consumers.

Also, many of these over weight girls felt milk was fattening and most had generally poor diets.


