DEPARTMENT REPLIES  
TO LOCAL HEALTH  
COUNCIL

ANCHORAGE: Bruce D. Adams Supervisor for the Regional Sanitation Services, Division of Public Health, stated in a letter to the Chugiak Health Council that the State had never accepted the responsibility for operating and maintaining local dumping areas.

Mr. Adams further stated that about eighteen months ago, a new site was selected on land belonging to the State of Alaska in the vicinity of the Birchwood Air-Strip for a public dumping Site.

"To my knowledge, this land is still available. However, before the State can lease or otherwise grant the use of this site for a sanitary land fill, there must be a local government which will accept the responsibility and guarantee proper use.

"Unfortunately there is no local government in your area.

"Until such time as a local government is organized, there is little we can do to eliminate the existing public health hazard."

# COOK OF THE MONTH

COOK FOR MAY  
RUTH NEEDLES

Wild rabbit is a dish that many of us hesitate to fix.

This week Ruth offers a surefire favorite for this plentiful Alaskan meat.

### ROAST WILD RABBIT WITH DRESSING

- FLOUR rabbit
- BROWN in skillet
- PLACE in roaster around outside edge
- LEAVE opening in the center for dressing
- FILL cavity with dressing
- ROAST in slow oven (350°) for approx. 3-4 hours
- ADD cut potatoes and carrots around dressing during last 30-40 minutes.
- REMOVE rabbit and vegetables.
- ADD hot water and make gravy.
- PREPARE favorite salad and dessert for complete meal.

#### DRESSING:

- 3-4 cups stale bread crumbs (use leftover rolls biscuits, toast etc.)
  - 1/2 cup celery stalks and leaves (cut fine)
  - Poultry Seasoning to taste
  - 2 tbs. instant minced onion
  - 1 beaten egg
- COMBINE, bread, celery, and other ingredients
- POUR 1/3 cup melted butter or oil mixture.
- ADD enough hot water or broth to make very moist
- STIR and fill cavity.

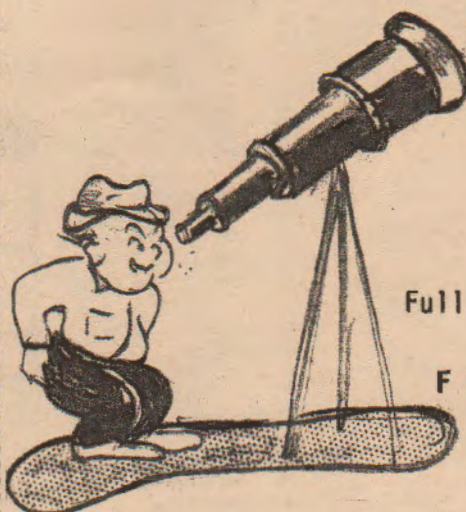

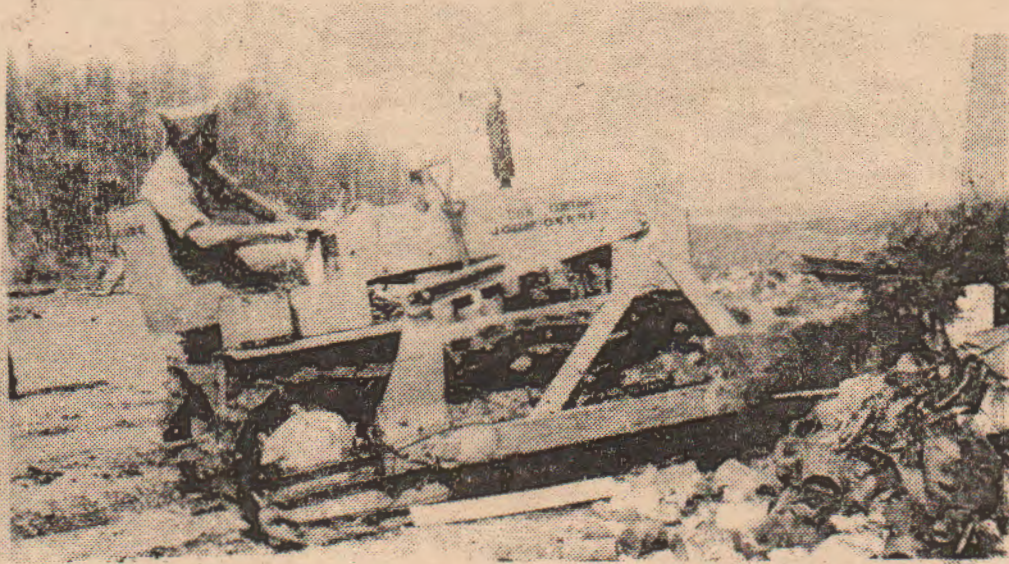

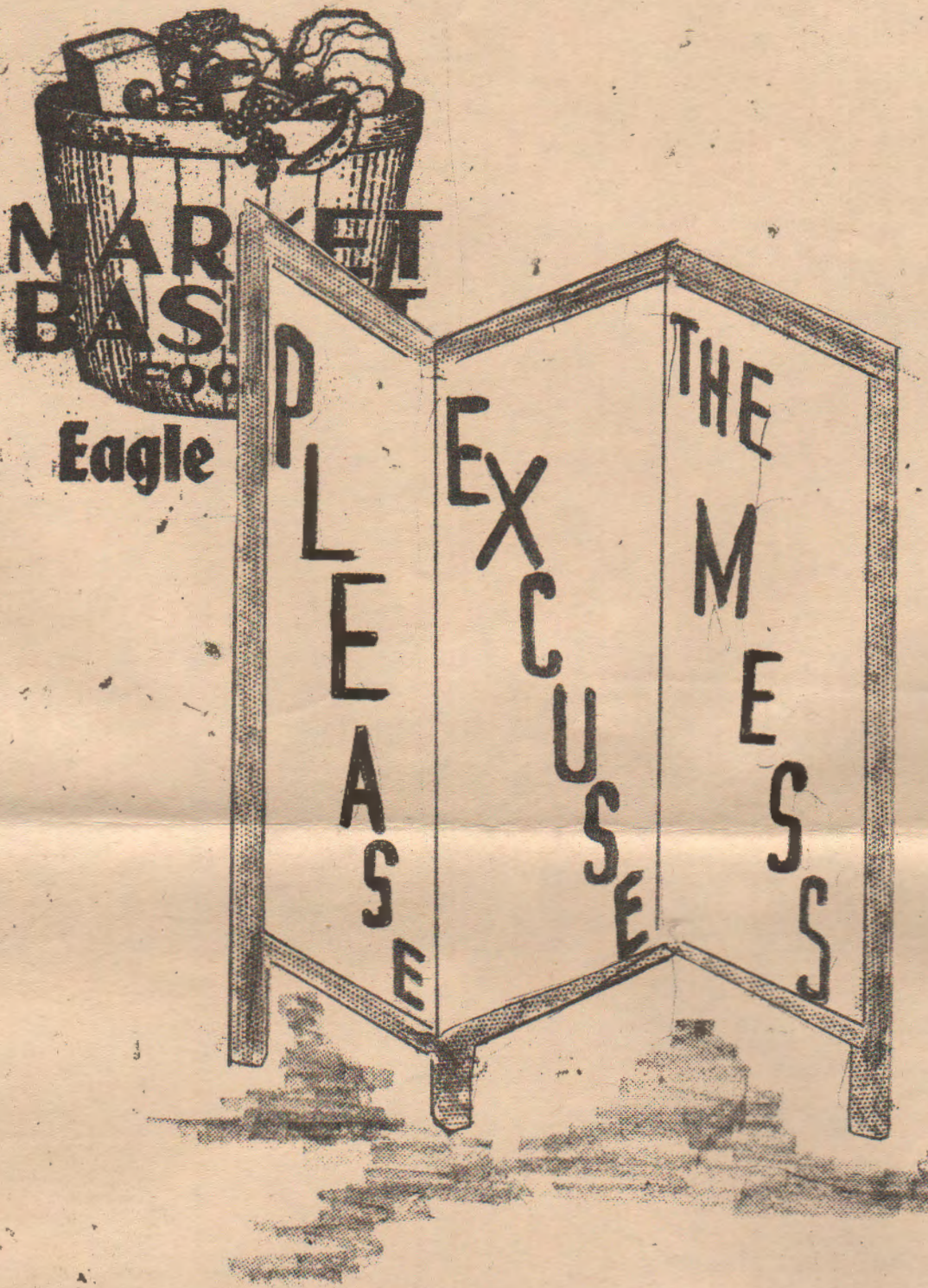
