

requirements.


Also, special conferences must be held with the Public Health nurse and the Mental Health Doctor.

The sale will be held between the hours of 1pm and 8pm on Friday and all day on Saturday.



Lion Kallenburg will be teaching science, among other things, at the Eagle River School this term.


