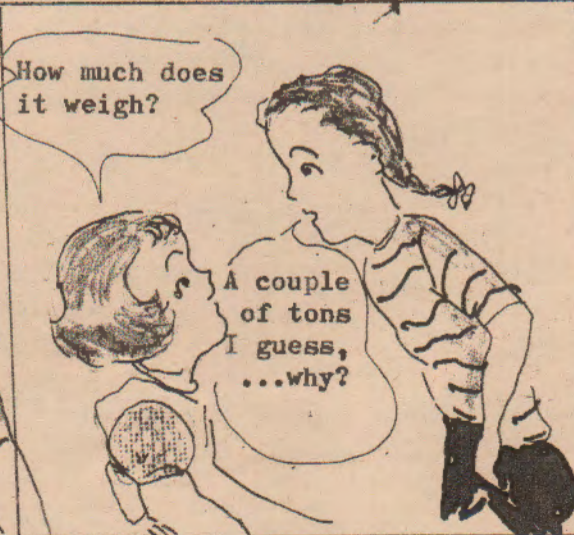
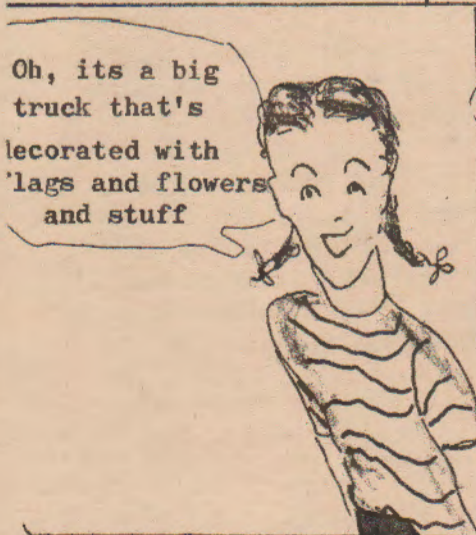
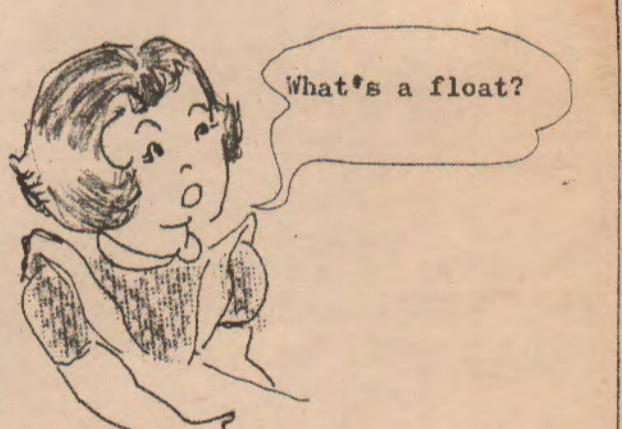
The factors in favor of

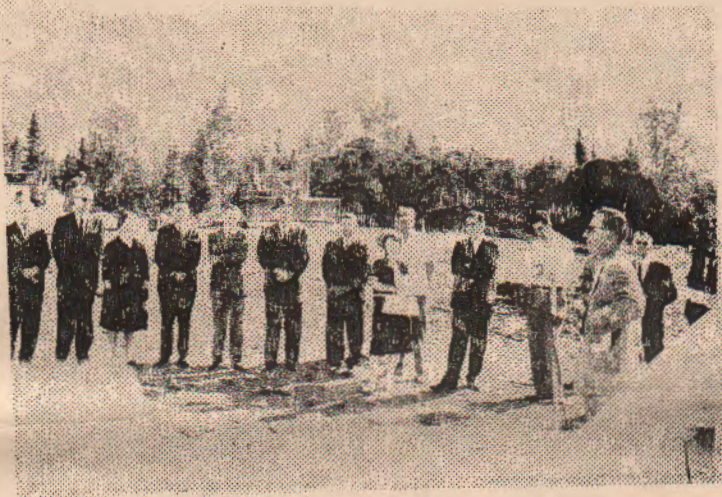

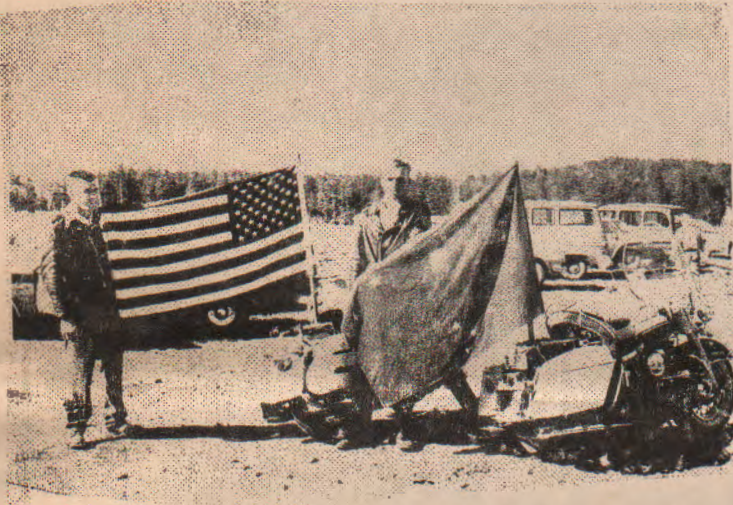
