CAR STRIKES GUARDRAIL ROLLS OVER BANK

FIRE LAKE: A speeding 1962 Volvo failed to negotiate a curve at mile 17 and struck the guardrail and flipped over the embankment.

The accident occurred in the early morning hours of July 4th, and sent the driver, Malcom Cousins of Anchorage to Providence Hospital in the Eagle River Ambulance where he was found to be suffering from scalp lacerations. His passenger, Judith Sherman, also of Anchorage escaped with minor scratches and bruis-The car was declared a total loss.

Cousins was cited for negligent driving.

CHUGIAK: Glenn Briggs, Assemblyman from Section One said today, that he has had repeated requests from residents of the area for an explaination of the personal property tax assesments which they are expected to comply with.

In the following statement Briggs attempts to answer these questions and offers his advise on how to make these tax payments.

"The Greater Anchorage Area Borough encompasses roughly the area east of Turnagain Arm and Cook Inlet between Portage on the south and the Knik River on the north.

By law, all services provided throughout a borough must be equal. Tax systems for the support of borough wide services must be applied equitably borough wide.

The GAAB is a borough of second class, with the three mandatory powers of education, assessing and taxing and planning and zoning.

The Borough has of now, assumed only the powers of assessing and taxing and education.

As of July 1, 1964 the real and personal property of the Greater Chugiak Area and the area south of the Anchorage Independent School District will for the first time be taxed for the support of their schools. The tax period for this assessment will be for the one-half of the calendar year, July 1 to December 31, 1964.

Since the City of Anchorage and the Anchorage Independent School District

tax base. The personal property of the area has been
appraised at 10% of this amount, or \$700,000.00. The
mill rate of taxation has
been set at 9 mills, which
will provide revenue for
schools for the six month
period July 1 - Dec 31, 1964
of \$34,650.00 calculated as
follows:

\$7,000,000.00 real prop.
x 9 mills x ½=\$31,500.00
\$700,00.00 personal x 9
mills x ½ = \$3,150.00
Which gives the needed
\$34,650.00.

If John Doe of Chugiak owns real property which has been assessed at \$10,000.00 then his tax assessment for the six-month period would be calculated: \$10,000.00 x 70% x 9 mills or \$31.50.

Since his personal property tax has been determined to be ten percent (10% of the above amount, then his personal porperty tax equivalent would be calculated: \$1,000.00 x 70% x 9 mills x% or \$3.15.

Some of the repugnant features of the personal property tax can be avoided, and compliance with the intentent of the law can be accomplished by setting industry down the lump sum valuation of the personal property.

Therefore, if John Due's appraised valuation of personal property comes to \$1,000, then it figures at \$1,000 x 70% x 9 mills x % or (again) \$3.15.

The same solution can be applied to those who do

not own real property land, homes, permanent buildings. My only suggest in
these cases is to supply on
the personal property form
the total value the owner
places on his personal property without itimization.

This also applies to the individuals who are in business and have been instructed to complete the itemized form of inventory and equipment. These

should only need to submit a ligure representing the gross value of inventory an equipment, without itemizing.

The penalty for falling to file a personal property tax return is a fine of \$300.00 and/or 30 days in jail.

Real property tax notices will be mailed out on or about July 18. The Borough Assembly will start sitting as a Board of Equilization on August 31. Any taxpayer who feels his appraisal is not equitable may and is encouraged to appear before the board.

Taxes real, or personal for the current period of July 1 - Dec. 31 1964 will not be due or payable until after the Boar of Equalization hearings.


