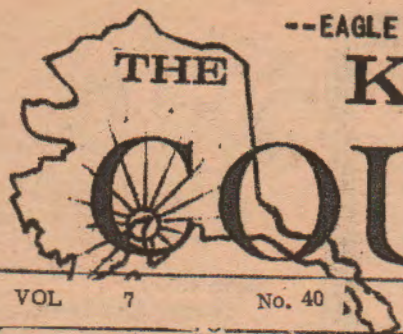

ASSEMBLY SAYS PIERSON'S PETITION OKAY

OCHS CELEBRATION TO TAKE PLACE --OCTOBER 3rd

CHUGIAK: The Victory Celebration planned by the OCHS (Operation Chuglak High School) group has been set for October 3rd at 8pm, according to Dale Pierson, OCHS Chairman. The time and date was set in accordance with word from Governor Egan, as to when he will be able to attend the event.

Pierson is calling a meeting of the 26 OCHS organizations for Saturday, September 26th at 8pm at the Chuglak Methodist Church.

Representatives of these groups will be notified by phone or by letter.

Final plans for the celebration will be made at this time. Pierson said that he hopes that every one of the original twenty six clubs will be represented at this meeting.

LOCAL TAX RATE TO BE LOWER

ANCHORAGE: The tax rate for those residing outside the city of Anchorage and the Anchorage Independent School District will be lower than first planned, according to Assembly Glenn Briggs from Section one.

Briggs explained that the 4 1/2 mills that had been originally set for the six month period ending December 31, had been based on an estimated appraisal of real property at 10,000,000 dollars. The actual appraisal was found to be almost 15,000,000.

Since the original budget had been made up on the basis of the estimate, the 4 1/2 mill rate is now more than is necessary to meet this budget and has been reduced to 3 1/2 mills for the same six month period.

PETERS CREEK YOUTH INJURED BY HOMEMADE ROCKET

PETERS CREEK: Thirteen year old Johnny Johnson, was seriously injured last Sunday when a homemade rocket exploded in his hand.

The boy, son of Mrs. Lorraine Johnson of mile 23 was rushed to Providence Hospital by a neighbor,

ANCHORAGE: Dale Pierson, local candidate to the Borough School Board, was given a green light by the Borough Assembly Monday night when they passed an emergency ordinance amending Borough Ordinance #6, regarding transitional registration.

Pierson had been declared ineligible as a candidate due to the ruling which stated that each candidate must have on his petition at least 50 signers who had pre-registered for the Borough Election.

With registration in the Greater Chuglak Area being opened late on September 15th, and deadline for filing being midnight of that same day, Pierson had in effect only a few hours in which to obtain the fifty signatures. According to Pierson he had assumed that anyone who did pre-register before the September 25th deadline would be counted as a registered voter. The interpretation that the voter must pre-register prior to the filing deadline made some of his signers ineligible.

The Borough Assembly feeling that Pierson had been treated unfairly, amended the Ordinance to read as follows: "Any voter who voted in the Primary Election of the State of Alaska, 1964, or in the General Election of the State of Alaska 1962, shall be deemed a registered voter under this ordinance until November 20th, of 1964.

It was further amended by adding the following paragraph. "Any qualified voter may register during the period between the effective date of this ordinance and the closing of the polls for the borough election on October 6th, 1964. The borough clerk shall maintain facilities for registration at each polling place in said election, and registration at the polls shall be administered by the election clerks and judges assigned to the polls.

Pierson had filed for the one year seat on the borough School Board.

MTA EMPLOYEE UNINJURED IN PLANE WRECK

BOULDER CREEK: Leon Kuhn, an M.T.A. employee assigned to the Greater Chuglak Area, escaped injury last week when he wrecked his light plane at Boulder Creek.

Kuhn, who was moose hunting at the time, had landed on a gravel bar, and was applying the brakes when a tire blew causing the plane to ground loop and damaging the propeller and landing gear.

Another pilot who was in the area at the time came to Kuhn's assistance and was able to fly in a new prop and necessary parts to make emergency repairs and fly the plane out.

EAGLE RIVER YOUTH SERIOUSLY INJURED IN MOTORCYCLE WRECK

EAGLE RIVER: Nineteen year old Jim Connell, son of Mr. and Mrs. James Connell of Eagle River was seriously injured when his motorcycle struck a car on Muldoon Road near DeBarr Road last Friday.

According to reports of the accident, young Connell had just pulled out to pass a car, when a auto pulled out onto the road in his path. He was unable to avoid hitting this car, and struck it broadside throwing him off his cycle and over the car onto the pavement.

Connell was taken to Providence Hospital where he was found to be suffering from head injuries. As of the most recent report he had not yet regained consciousness.

Connell had just recently returned from New York where he had purchased the cycle and had ridden it to Texas and back up the Alaska Highway. He was on his way to the Motorcycle Sales and Service operated by Dave Burns of Eagle River and recently moved to Muldoon and DeBarr Roads when the accident occurred.

Connell was a driver of the Chuglak School bus number 6.

EFFECT OF LOSS OF MILK AND COAL CONTRACTS DISCUSSED

PALMER: A meeting between Palmer business men and representatives of the three cooperatives of the area, (MTA, MEA and Matanusak Maid) dwelt mostly upon the effects of the loss of the milk contracts from the military and the possible loss of coal contracts on the economy of the Valley and also on the Greater Chugiak Area, which is served by both the MEA and the MTA.

Representatives from the Greater Chugiak Area were Jim Ekstedt, Director on the Board of the MEA, and Russell Oberg, director to the MTA.

Ekstedt, acting as spokesman for MEA, said that the group agreed that the only hope for the local coal

industry would be the completion of the proposed mine-mouth generation plant at Sutton.

The plans for this plant are presently under very close scrutiny by the REA in Washington.

An interesting talk was given by Dr. Mick, of the Extension Service on milk production.

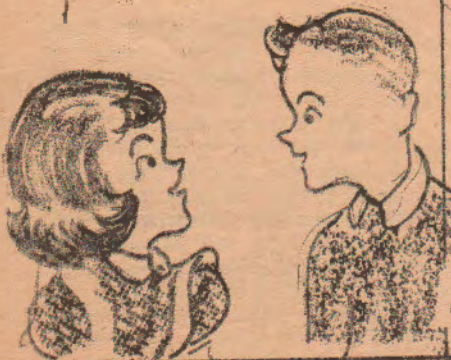

COOK OF THE MONTH

COOK FOR SEPTEMBER
KRISTINA TALLMAN

For her last visit to our cook's corner, Kristina gives us a delicious way to prepare beef or that moose, and a simple dessert.

MARINADE BEEF

2 pounds beef (moose)
1 bottle beer
1/2 cup vinegar
4 Tbs. sugar
2 red onions, Chopped
3 bay leaves
5 whole cloves
5 whole pepper-corns
COMBINE ingredients
ALLOW to stand 2 to 3 days in marinade
REMOVE from marinade
BROWN meat in butter
ADD a generous cup of water
PLACE in moderate oven
ALLOW to roast for about 1 hour
USE pan juice for gravy adding flavoring, salt and pepper to taste.

MOCHA CREAM

WHIP 2 egg yolks with 2 tablespoons of sugar
ADD 3 heaping teaspoons of flour
POUR in 1 3/4 cups of coffee
BRING to a boil
ALLOW to cool whipping constantly
FOLD in 3/4 cups whipping cream

**ACCIDENTS SAID TO
BE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATHS**

PALMER:

Motor vehicle accidents are the leading cause of death among youthful drivers, Leland Cade, district Extension agent, said this week. Young drivers have the highest accident and death rate of any driver group—an accident rate that is double the rate for the adult population.

More youthful drivers than ever are now driving on the nation's roads. During last year youthful drivers accounted for 15 per cent of all vehicle accidents, even though they accounted for only 8 per cent of the driving population.

A number of reasons account for the high accident rate of young drivers. The two main reasons are the absence of experience and emotional immaturity. This expresses itself in terms of speed, breaking various traffic rules, and lack of consideration for others.

Youthful drivers are urged to check their driving habits with competent drivers for their own safety and the safety of others, Cade concluded.
