

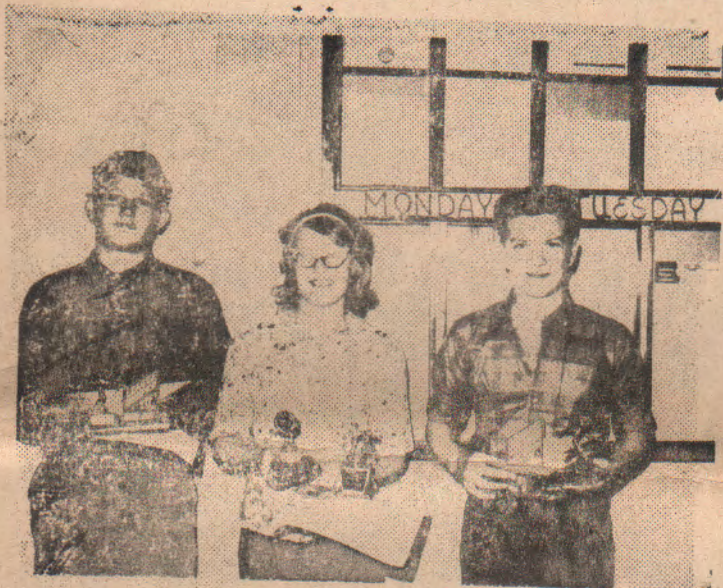

ANCHORAGE: The Anchorage City Council last Monday evening voted approval of setting up a non-profit cooperation which will in a joint effort with the Power Development Committee of Palmer set in motion the machinery for the construction of a mine mouth power generation plant at Sutton Alaska.

This approval was granted following a series of meetings between the City Council and the PDC. The non-profit cooperation which will be organized is sponsored by the City of Anchorage and will be working independent of, but with the full support of the Matanuska Electric Association.

The next step will be the organization of a five man board which will consist of three from Anchorage and two from Palmer. The duties of this board will be to issue contracts for construction, power sale etc.

Construction of the Sutton Power Center as the generation plant is to be called, is expected to begin in the spring of 1965. It is estimated that approximately 100 men will be employed during the construction phase and approximately twenty five permanent employees when the plant is in operation.

The land on which the plant is to be located is

The Well Baby Clinic which would have been held on May 27th will not take place due to Mrs. Bacon being on vacation.

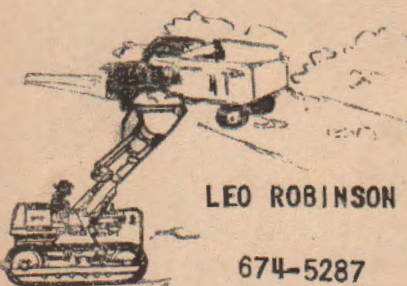
