CHUGIAK: A pre-school kindergarten program is being planned in the Greater Chugiak area, pending availability of funds, according to Dr. Don Dafoe, superintendent of the Borough School System.

The program is tentative scheduled to begin on July 6th and is to last until August 14.

The program will be conducted at both the Chugiak and the Eagle River Schools, and will consist of at least one class at each school, with a third class to be located at one of the schools if enrollment warrants it. A maximum of twenty five students is planned for each class.

This kindergarten is for children who will be entering the first grade this coming September. To be eligible for enrollment the child must be six years old on or before November 1st, 1964.

There is no charge to parents for this program, but parents must make their own transportation arrangements as no bus service will be available.

Classes will be for one half day, five days a week during the time

Funds for purchasing the light were raised through sale of a community calendar which the Sorority sponsors.

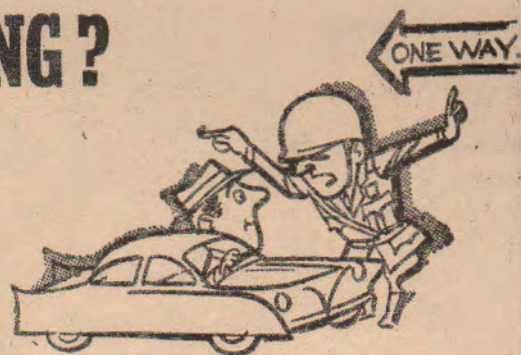
