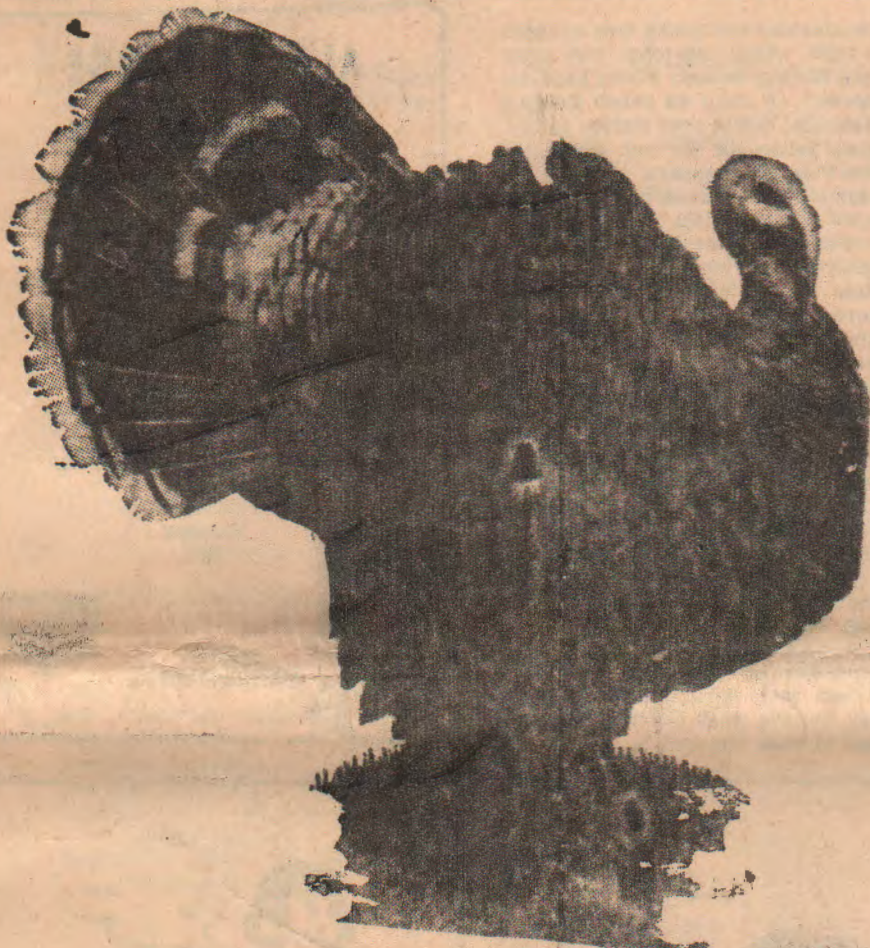

### NONE HURT IN REAR END COLLISION

Rev. Tewell, who was pastor at the Assemblies of God Church at Petersburg for the past year, was pastor at the Chugiak Chapel for the seven years before that.

The memorial services were conducted by Rev. Ben Wilson of Fairbanks, superintendent of the Assemblies of God in Alaska.

Funeral services for Rev. Tewell were held on Monday in Petersburg.

EAGLE RIVER: The Valu City store at Eagle River was broken into Monday night, and several containers of money were taken.

Entrance was gained by breaking the glass in one of the doors at the front of the store.

Missing were several gallon glass jars which had been placed there to collect cash donations for the Paul Beach family who had lost all their possessions when their home burned last week. Also taken were several coin canisters for the March of Dimes. The store safe, which was located at the front of the store was not touched.

State Police, who are still investigating, stated that this was much more likely the work of teen aged delinquents rather than professional burglars. There was approximately \$100 in the glass jars and only two or three dollars in the coin canisters.

The Varsity put on a very good showing for their first game, though they lost it. The Mustangs jumped to a very quick 13-1 lead. At the end of the first quarter the score was 25-11, in favor of the Mustangs.

The second quarter was still a battle, with the Seahawks of Seward outscoring the Mustangs that quarter 23-18, the Mustangs still ahead. The same thing happened in the third quarter; but not much of a margin, still leaving the Mustangs ahead 51-45. But in the final quarter, the Mustangs fell to the Seahawks, but led until the final minutes. The Seward team outscored the Mustangs 23-12 to give the Seahawks a 83-67 victory and the Mustangs their 24th straight loss.

In the JV game preceding that, the Mustangs gained their first victory over a Junior Varsity team. The final score was 47-52. Scoring for the Mustangs were Steve Brooks 18, Dan Ferre 13, Gary Hoag 7, Butch Miller 6, Harvey Pullen 4, Steve Willis 2 and Louie Edwards 2.

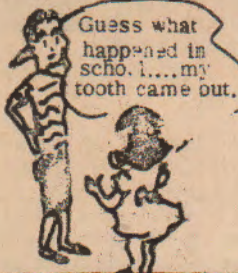
