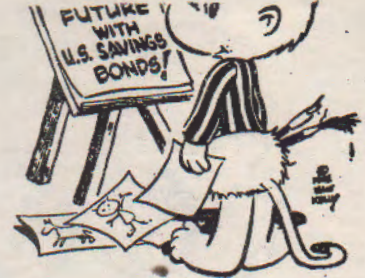

Now after one has invested in ten thousand dollars worth of new equipment, we might wonder what

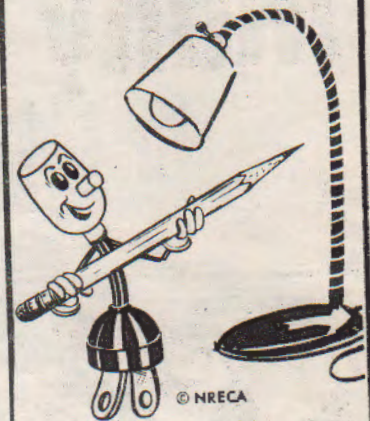

I only wish I could be with you all at Christmas, for I really miss my friends and companions at Chugiak High, but since I can't be with you, a part of you has come to me through your package.

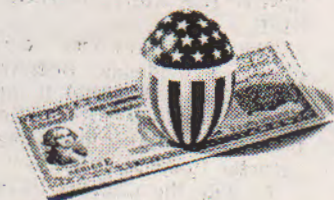
TIPS FOR MILADY

Naboro's chief virtue will be that it will enable young offenders to be separated from hardened criminals.

The emphasis at the Naboro Farm is on rehabilitation. It will accommodate selected first and second offenders between the ages of 17 and 23. They will be given practical training in agriculture to enable them to find a living at the completion of their sentences.

Men and women eat separately in some families in India. Men eat first and when they have finished the women are served.
