### INFANT KILLED IN CAR-TRAIN CRASH

PALMER: The four month old grandchild of an Eagle River man was pronounced dead on arrival at the Valley Presbyterian Hospital in Palmer following a car train collision at the Matanuska crossing on the new Glenn Highway last Saturday morning at 10:30am.

The victim was little Cindy McCrary, granddaughter of Gordon W. McCrary of Eagle River, and child of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon W. McCrary Jr. of Chickaloon.

The child was a passenger in a car driven by Leona Hunt also of mile 78. Also passengers in the car were the victims mother Phyllis McCrary and her sister Theresa, age 1 1/2 years.

According to State Police, the driver had apparently not seen the train in time to bring her car to a stop. Skid marks on the road indicated that an attempt had been made to stop the car.

Mrs Hunt was driving toward Anchorage, when she struck the northbound Alaska Railroad train. When

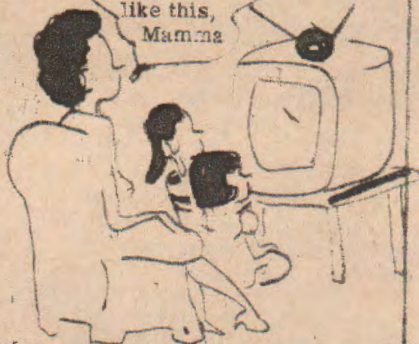

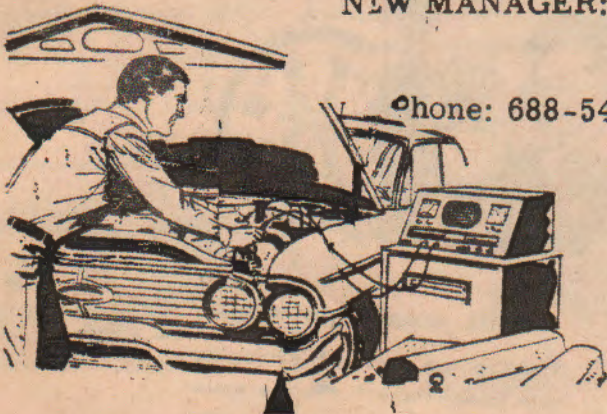

### WOMAN HURT IN REAR END SMASH

**FIRE LAKE:** The wife of James D. Smith, of Sheep Mountain ACS Station suffered neck injuries, when the car in which she, and her husband were riding was struck in the rear at mile 16 3/4.

The Smiths were slowing their 1961 Chevrolet Station Wagon prior to turning into the Fire Lake Service Station when they were struck by a 1956 sedan driven by Irvin O. Dick of Anchorage. Dick had not realized that the Smith car was slowing down and crashed into the rear of it, inflicting an estimated \$200 to the tailgate. Damage to the Dick car was limited to the left front fender and grill, and was estimated at \$300.

Jean Smith was taken to the 3040th Air Force Hospital in a military ambulance.

### ARMY TRUCK SKIDS ON ICY ROAD

He was attempting to swing back into his own lane when he skidded, lost control of the truck and slid sideways into the path of the Smith car.

The Ford suffered an estimated \$300 damage to the left front end. The truck was undamaged. Neither driver was injured.

The second course in beginning and intermediate clothing construction.

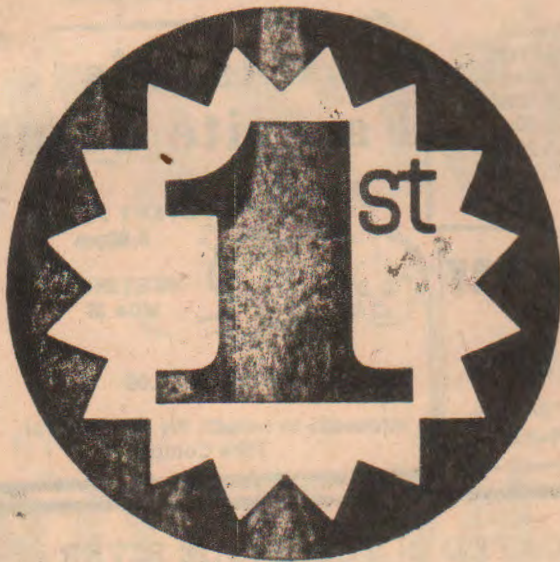
