

## HWOOD SCHOOL PLANS TOLD

#### VETS MAY SET UP LOCAL RABIES CLINIC

CHUGIAK: Several Anchorage Veterinarians have been approached in regards to setting up one or more rabies clinics in the Greater

Chugiak Area.
With the deadline approaching by which time all dogs must be licensed under the Borough Dog Control Ordinance, local residents have felt that perhaps it would be more expedient to make it possible to obtain the required rables shots at local clinics rather than have to

bring their pets into Anchorage.

Mrs. Christa Burg, who operated the Birchwood Kennels, said erated the Birchwood Kennels, said that she had spoken to two Anchorave Veterinarians, and both had indicated a willingness to set up local clinics if there was sufficient interest on the part of local residents to justify their coming out here. Mrs. Burg also said that it might also be possible for the veterinarians to be authorized to issue dog licenses following the impoculation of the dogs. innoculation of the dogs.

#### LOCAL WOMAN NAMED TO JESSE LEE BOARD

ANCHORAGE: Mrs James Ekstedt of Eagle River has been chosen to serve on the Board of Directed of the Jesse Lee Home in Anchorage.

This board is the first one composed of local individuals in the seventy-five year history of the home.

The Jesse Lee children's home, which was recently re-located to Anchorage from Seward, has until this time been administered by the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church, whose home offices are located in New York City.

According to Mr. Gilbert, Dir-ector of the home, under the direction of a local board the home will change from a strictly custodial institution to one which can be concerned in the rehabilitation and advancement of youth.

The board is composed of 24

members from all walks of life, Mrs. Ekstedt will be representing the Women's Society of Christian Service of Alaska Missions of the Methodist Church, and will serve a three year term.

No date for the start of construct-ion of the new school has been announced. Bids have not yet been advertised, following which the con-tract will be let.

It had been announced earlier in the year that the Birchwood School be ready for occupancy by the fall of 1966. If the school is not completed by that date possibly double shifing at either or both of double shifting at either of both of the local elementary schools may be necessary until construction is completed.

Pierson said that the School Board had recommended the above mentioned site because of its prokimity to Chugiak High School. He id that at a future date this could disself to the merging of the hools into a elementary, junior-

dor high complex.

When completed the center will not be a temporary collection of quonset huts as the term "camp" may have pictured to some, but will include a complex of permanent buildings which will compose a larger area that that presently composing Chugiak High School.

Plans call for a dormitory to house 200 boys, housing for supervisory personnel, classroom and training buildings and recreation facilities. Tillifont said the program will be patterned after the C.C.C. program the 1930's, but improved and modernized.

Intensive education and training is planned, with classroom instruction at high school level or below where necessary. Special guidance personnel are to be employed in all fields.

Tillifont also said that while the Job Corps Youth are to be employed primarily on work pro-jects supplied by Federal and State exercises that in cases where local agencies, that in cases where local (Chuglak) civic organizations can demonstrate need for man power for local projects, they will be avallable.

The free time of Job Corps youth will be taken up in planned recreat-ion, making use of local bowling, skiing and other facilities with com

munity dances also planned.

Although the center will not be open and fully operating until November of 1967, recruiting is now under way for key personnel.

Tillifont said that the Center will be built on State owned land, several sites being under consideration at the present time. most promising site is located adjacent to the proposed Birchwood Elementary School, with the thought that both institutions might be able to develop a common water system.


