

BIRCHWOOD SCHOOL PLANS TOLD

VETS MAY SET UP LOCAL RABIES CLINIC

CHUGIAK: Several Anchorage Veterinarians have been approached in regards to setting up one or more rabies clinics in the Greater Chugiak Area.

With the deadline approaching by which time all dogs must be licensed under the Borough Dog Control Ordinance, local residents have felt that perhaps it would be more expedient to make it possible to obtain the required rabies shots at local clinics rather than have to bring their pets into Anchorage.

Mrs. Christa Burg, who operated the Birchwood Kennels, said that she had spoken to two Anchorage Veterinarians, and both had indicated a willingness to set up local clinics if there was sufficient interest on the part of local residents to justify their coming out here. Mrs. Burg also said that it might also be possible for the veterinarians to be authorized to issue dog licenses following the inoculation of the dogs.

Anyone who is interested in obtaining rabies shots for their dogs at a local clinic is asked to call Mrs. Burg at 688-5121.

Dates and places of the clinics will be published in the Knik Arm Courier as soon as this information is available.

PLANS FOR JOB CORPS CENTER TOLD

BIRCHWOOD: Plans for a Job Corps Center which will be located in the Birchwood Area were told today in an exclusive interview to the Knik Arm Courier.

This center will be built by funds supplied by the Office of Economic Opportunity and managed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

According to Tom Tillifont of the BIA, this center will provide specialized training for underemployed undereducated boys between the ages of 16 and 21. This center

LOCAL WOMAN NAMED TO JESSE LEE BOARD

ANCHORAGE: Mrs James Ekstedt of Eagle River has been chosen to serve on the Board of Directors of the Jesse Lee Home in Anchorage.

This board is the first one composed of local individuals in the seventy-five year history of the home.

The Jesse Lee children's home, which was recently re-located to Anchorage from Seward, has until this time been administered by the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church, whose home offices are located in New York City.

According to Mr. Gilbert, Director of the home, under the direction of a local board the home will change from a strictly custodial institution to one which can be concerned in the rehabilitation and advancement of youth.

The board is composed of 24 members from all walks of life. Mrs. Ekstedt will be representing the Women's Society of Christian Service of Alaska Missions of the Methodist Church, and will serve a three year term.

ANCHORAGE: The GAAB School Board at a special meeting held last Thursday night recommended that the Borough acquire a 78 acre tract of land on the Birchwood Loop Road as the site for the proposed Birchwood Elementary School.

This land, which at the present time belongs to the State lies across the Birchwood Road from the Chugiak High School, beginning at the Hilltop View Road and extending toward the inlet.

According to Dale Pierson, local member of the GAAB School Board, tests as to suitability of the land especially with regards to a sufficient water supply will be made before a final decision is announced.

No date for the start of construction of the new school has been announced. Bids have not yet been advertised, following which the contract will be let.

It had been announced earlier in the year that the Birchwood School would be ready for occupancy by the fall of 1966. If the school is not completed by that date possibly double shifting at either or both of double shifting at either of both of the local elementary schools may be necessary until construction is completed.

Pierson said that the School Board had recommended the above mentioned site because of its proximity to Chugiak High School. He said that at a future date this could add itself to the merging of the tools into a elementary, junior-high complex.

The local highway cleanup project was most successful and once again we can drive through Chugiak to Eagle River without disgust at the highway litter.

The project extended from Mirror Lake to the Eagle River bridge and nitted some fifty cubic yards of trash.

Our personal experience in picking up conservatively indicated one piece of debris every twelve inches. This could mean that some 105,600 individual pieces of something necessitated a stoop to retrieve. This is almost one bit of litter from every car, truck and bus in the entire state of Alaska. We suspect, however, because of the groupage of cans, bottles and other items, that most of this stuff was deposited from a relatively few vehicles. Are we like to think that none came from our local populace.

During the past week or so, I have observed personally and by way of newspaper pictures numerous high school seniors who are

graduating with some type of honor.

Perhaps of no significance, but still of refreshing interest is the fact that all the young men had decent haircuts, and this in the face of the new, higher price required to obtain such.

From time to time, this column has, in various veins, been concerned with the horrible toll of deaths and injuries resulting from automobile accidents. Recently, much ado has been made over improving and increasing the safety of the automobile itself. Of course, added safety features are good, but I cannot get excited about them. It strikes me as about the same as attempting to eliminate the undesirable qualities of liquor by advocating unbreakable bottle, or improving the health factor of cigarettes by using a non-crushable package.

Earlier this year, in this space, writing of tragic accidents in our community, we made this statement: "Unfortunately, it requires no prophetic vision to predict there will be others before this year is finished." Unfortunately, until our entire concept of driving and driver

is being built primarily for Alaskan youth (both native and non-native) and there are no plans to recruit young people from the South 48.

Tillfont went on to stress that this is not to be detention home for delinquent or pre-delinquent youth, and none in that status will be accepted.

When completed the center will not be a temporary collection of quonset huts as the term "camp" may have pictured to some, but will include a complex of permanent buildings which will compose a larger area that that presently composing Chugiak High School.

Plans call for a dormitory to house 200 boys, housing for supervisory personnel, classroom and training buildings and recreation facilities. Tillfont said the program will be patterned after the C.C.C. program of the 1930's, but improved and modernized.
