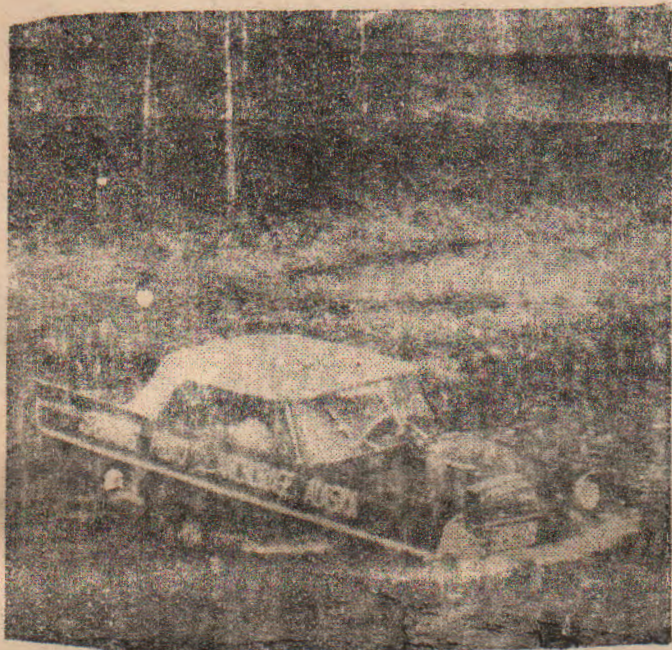


LOCAL YOUTH AVERTS TRAGEDY



BAPTISM IN MIRROR LAKE (See page 9 for story)

PETERS CREEK: The sharp eyes and quick action of a Chugiak youth saved a four year old Anchorage girl from drowning last Sunday afternoon.

The child, little Virginia Schackle, daughter of Larry Shackle of Anchorage, had apparently fallen from the dock at Camp Gorsuch on Mirror Lake.

Frank Mielke, a Chugiak High School junior, happened to notice the child beneath the water and pulled her to safety.

While awaiting the arrival of the State Police and an ambulance, the child was kept alive by mouth to mouth resuscitation, which was administered by Bernard Hopp of Anchorage Drilling. When the Eagle River Volunteer Ambulance arrived, oxygen equipment was available, and the ambulance driver, Larry Fifer administered the oxygen, while the State trooper administered external heart massage until the child revived. She was then taken to the 5040th Air Force Hospital by the ambulance where she was placed in an oxygen tent.

Frank Mielke, the boy whose quick action is credited with saving the child, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Mielke of Lower Peters Creek.

BUSES TO BE USED FOR LOCAL HEADSTART STUDENTS

CHUGIAK: School buses will be used this year to transport students from the Greater Chugiak Area who will be participating in "Operation Headstart".

The Headstart pre-school program for low income families will be held at the Denali School in Anchorage.

Registration of local youngsters is being conducted by Mr. Don Olson, himself a resident of the Greater Chugiak Area. Mr. Olson has been personally going to the homes of prospective head start students to explain the program and to register the children.

Any families with children who will be six years of age on or before November 1st 1966 who are interested in participating in Operation Headstart are asked to call Mr. Olson at 272-2322 and he will determine if they are eligible to participate.

The Headstart program will begin on Monday June 20th and continue until August 12. Registration will be open until the June 20th starting date.

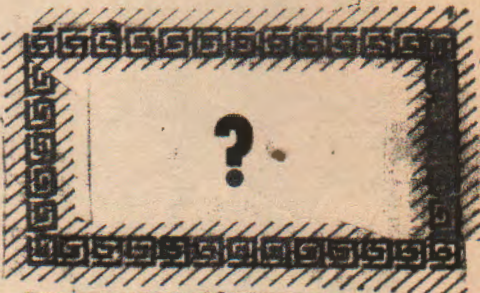

IT MAY BE "UNLUCKY 13" FOR YOU

JUNEAU: In conjunction with the Centennial Cleanup Program, the Alaska State Troopers are on the march against litter, according to Martin B. Underwood, Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety.

It may be "Unlucky 13" for you if you are seen littering our highway, recreation areas or private property, for Chapter 13 SLA 1966 signed into law by Governor William A. Egan, took effect May 30 of this year, and sharp focus is now being placed on keeping Alaska free from "all garbage, rubbish, animal viscera or other discarded objects" in accordance with the law.

"This is also a citizen participation program," states Mr. Underwood. "For instance, if someone throws rubbish out of a car, the citizen in the car back of him should immediately mark down the license number, the date and area in which this took place and phone this information in to the nearest State Police office. Office personnel will then transfer this information into a "Litterbug Report" which is mailed to the violator.

The "Litterbug Report" in part, reads as follows, "A fellow citizen has advised me that litter was seen being thrown from a vehicle described as a (name of car) Alaska License No. _____. This incident, in the vicinity of _____ took place on _____ 1966."

"All Alaskans are being requested to help prevent the littering of our highways and other public areas caused by tons of trash and litter that forgetful and inconsiderate motorists dump each year. Your cooperation is requested in keeping Alaska clean and beautiful as a contribution to the future and to keep our State a pleasant and enjoyable place that we can be proud to call our home."

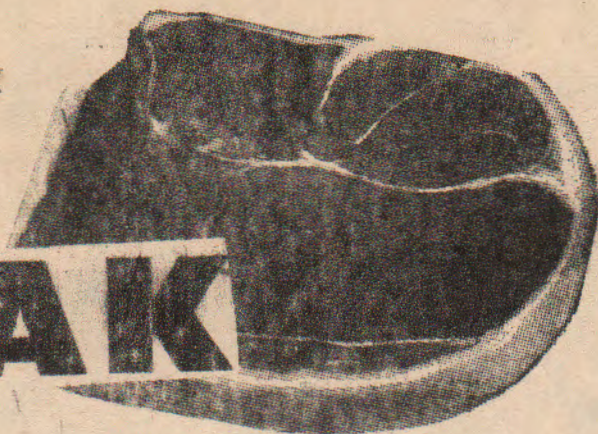

ANCHORAGE: The man who will serve next year as the Assistant Principal of Chugiak High School is presently in charge of the Neighborhood Youth Corps in the Anchorage Area.

WORK PROGRESSING ON COLD STORAGE PLANT

EAGLE RIVER: Work on the new plant for Eagle River Cold Storage Inc. is approximately one quarter finished, according to Jim Ekstedt, President of the cooperation.

This new facility, which is located at approximately mile 13 1/2, will offer frozen food locker rental along with a cooling room for commercial storage. A portion of the building is being reserved for rental to another business, and will be finished to the specification of the renter.

Ekstedt said that plans call for the services of a professional butcher, who will process wild game for freezing or into sausage and special cuts. Plans for next year call for means to smoke fish and process seafood.

Other officers of the cooperation are Dan Ekstedt of Anchorage, vice-president, Herman Jones of Eagle River, Treasurer and Bob Paculli of Anchorage Secretary.

Architects for the new building are the firm of Schultz and Maynard of Anchorage.

A Grand Opening date has been set for August 13th, with the plant ready to swing into full operation for the opening of the fall hunting season.

CHUGIAK: The Chugiak Bankers, local Babe Ruth baseball team are still enjoying a winning streak, according to Steve Jordan, special sports correspondent for the Knik Arm Courier.

After defeating the 5th Avenue Chrysler team at Mulcahy last Wednesday, with Ronnie Tyson pitching to a 12 to 6 victory, the Bankers came home to Peters Creek Monday for another win.

The local team took on L&K Construction at the local diamond, where errorless fielding, combined with the four-hit pitching of Rick Stephens held L&K to but a single run, as the Eagle River Branch First National Bank tallied seven off two L&K pitchers.

Stephens threw only seventy-three pitches in all, hurling but four in the sixth as his fielders retired the side.

Chugiak got started in the second when Rick Stephens scored by help of errors. Then with two outs, Allen Wallis drove in two with a double to left center. Five passes and L&K errors gave Chugiak four additional markers.

Randy Jones provided L&K's only run when he came in on a fielder's choice after swiping second and third after his single.

This is the Banker's fourth win, which makes their record 4 wins, 1 loss and makes them contenders for first place in the East division.

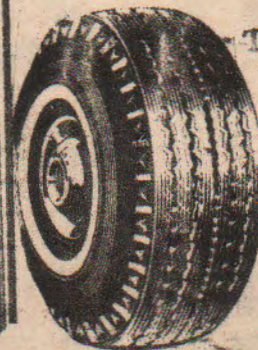

BURGLAR CAUGHT IN VALU CITY
