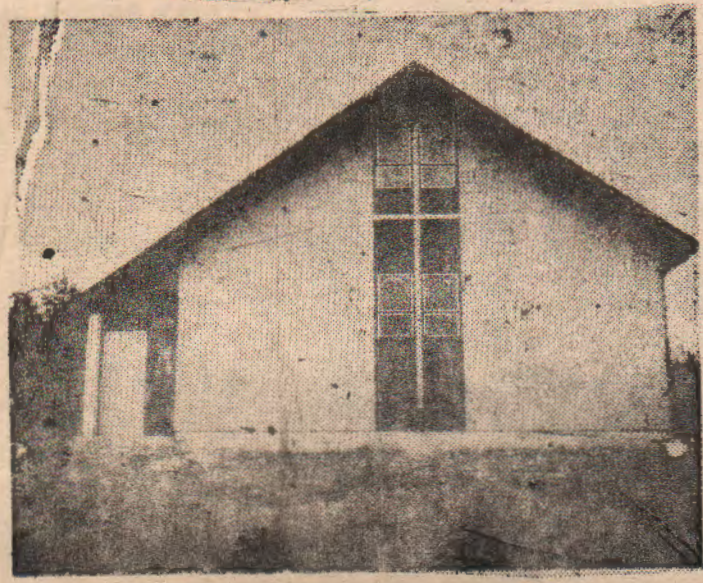

GAAB SCHOOLS TELL NEW ADMISSION POLICY

ANCHORAGE: The Anchorage Borough School District has announced a new admission policy for children under the legal age for enrollment in summer kindergarten next month. The previous policy stated that only children who would be six years of age on or before November 1, 1966 were eligible to attend. Now it is possible for children who will celebrate their sixth birthday between November 2, 1966 and February 2, 1967, to gain admission based on testing and classroom observation. Interested parents who believe their children will benefit from early admission to school should make application at Airport Heights Elementary School, 2765 16th Avenue, (272-7841) on June 20 or 21st, between 9:00am and 4:00pm. They must bring the child's birth certificate at that time. The initial testing will be held at Airport Heights School on June 28 and June 30. Those children whose test scores indicate readiness for school will be enrolled in summer kindergarten with follow-up evaluation and observation. This enrollment will be tentative for one month until the child has proven to the satisfaction of the school staff that he can perform academically, emotionally, socially and creatively with his classmates.

HIGH SCHOOL GYM TO BE OPEN IN JULY

BIRCHWOOD: Starting July 5th, and continuing for the rest of July, the Chugiak High School gym will be open two afternoon and two evenings a week. Tuesday and Thursday afternoons the gym will be open from two to four for 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grade boys and girls. Monday and Wednesday evenings from seven to nine the gym will be open for 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade boys and girls. The following sports will be offered at the beginning with additions as the program expands: Basketball, Volleyball, Badminton, Ping Pong, and High Jumping. Those planning to participate are asked to please note the following: 1. No shoes in the gym. Participants must wear sneakers or go barefoot. 2. Toilet facilities will be available, but no showers. 3. Entrance will be directly into the gym. The rest of the school building will be locked (therefore no phone available.) Local youngsters are invited to come down and enjoy the gym during July. If there are any questions, call Andy Kirk, gym director, at 688-6331.

PALMER: The threatened strike of members of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers against the Matanuska Telephone Association has been postponed until July 8th, according to Max Clement, MTA manager.

Clement said that the postponement was at the request of Gil Johnson, Commissioner of Labor for the State of Alaska. Mr. Johnson had requested a 45 day delay in the strike but the IBEW had agreed to delay only until July 8th.

The union was requesting an increase in pay of 7 1/2% for a one year contract or an increase of 12 1/2% for a three year contract, according to Clement.

There are a total of six men involved in the dispute, repair men and telephone installers.

Clement said that the Matanuska Telephone Association has the highest rate of pay in the State of Alaska with the exception of only the phone workers in the cities of Anchorage and Fairbanks.

Clement concluded saying that in the event that negotiations fail to arrive at a contract and the union does go on strike, MTA subscribers would continue to receive uninterrupted service. He said that the only effect would be on new installations and moves.

He added that outages would be taken care of by management personnel.

NEW UNION STATION TO BE ALASKAN FIRST

EAGLE RIVER: The new service station which is being constructed next to the Eagle River Shopping Center is to be an Alaskan First, according to Glenn Briggs, spokesman for the Eagle River Shopping Center Corporation.

The station is to be the first of a new design, which is built to blend into residential areas.

Briggs said that the building is more in the nature of a ranch type home than the conventional service station structure.

The station is being built by Union on land leased from the Shopping Center Corporation. When completed the station will then be leased to a private operator.

Briggs said that Danny Jensen of Fire Lake will lease the new station. Completion is scheduled for some time in August Briggs concluded.

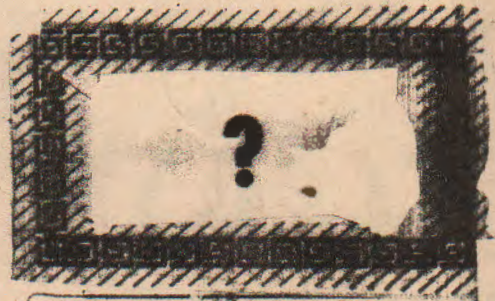

.... I am proud to report that three young men I appointed to the service academies back in 1962 received their commissions this past week. Fred Barnes, of Cold Bay (formerly of Palmer) has been graduated from the U. S. Military Academy; Dennis "Pat" James, of Anchorage, from the Naval Academy and Jim Roberts, of Anchorage, from the Air Force Academy. The four years involved have gone by so rapidly that it seems like only yesterday that I nominated them to the three academies.

.....A new "gun" bill has been introduced in Congress by Representative Bob Sikes of Florida in an attempt to end the long controversy relating to the so-called Dodd anti-firearms bill. The new measure, H. R. 14628, would make it a federal violation for dealers and manufacturers to sell a gun in violation of state law, would support state firearms control, would not cut off the purchase of firearms through interstate commerce, would not discriminate against small companies, as would the Dodd bill, and finally, would not grant any "gun czar" authority to the Treasury Department. In 1957, an addition to this building was made. Later a quonset was added for additional Sunday School rooms.

The church was set in order May 10, 1957 and a charter membership was set up. Charter members were: Rev. and Mrs. Wilburn Craig, Melba and Dale Hendrickson, Julia and Roe Huling, Miriam and Kenneth Huling, Paul Huling, Naomi and Milton Wyatt, Ruby and Reuben Wyatt, Minor Martin and Patsy Read.

The first deacons of the church were Kenneth and Paul Huling and Dale Hendrickson. Trustees were Kenneth Huling, Dale Hendrickson, and Milton Wyatt.

Rev. Craig resigned later that month and Rev. Bernard Tewell came as pastor in June 1957. During Rev. Tewell's ministry, the church grew to the point of needing further expansion, thus a basement was erected. The groundbreaking ceremony for the basement was held in August, 1962 with Rev. Paul Riley and Rev. Tewell officiating.

Rev. Tewell served the church as pastor until June, 1964. Rev. Edgar McElhannon came to the church as pastor in August, 1964.

Again, there was a need to build. In June, 1965 work began on a 12 foot extension on the basement and the upper structure. The first service was held in the new sanctuary May 15, 1966.

Departments within the church which are active are: Women's Missionary Council, Christ's Ambassadors (young people), Missionettes, Royal Rangers, Men's Fellowship. Current attendance roll numbers of 150.

The summer kindergarten program this year will be held from July 5 to August 12.

A second testing session for children under legal school age who are not enrolled in summer kindergarten, but who wish to apply for admission to first grade, will be held early in August.

Children who will be six years of age between February 3 and November 1st, 1967, may also be considered for admission upon satisfactory evidence of superior development. For further information regarding the procedure involved, parents may contact the Assistant Superintendent for Instruction at 277-5321.

The new School District entrance age policy stems from state legislation passed in the last session declaring that under age youngsters may be admitted to school at the discretion of the local school board.

LARGE TURNOUT FOR RABIES CLINIC

BIRCHWOOD: There was a large turnout for the rabies inoculation clinic held last Saturday at the Birchwood Kennels, according to Mrs. Richard Burg, kennels proprietor.

Dr. Jack Rasmussen, Anchorage veterinarian had agreed to come to Chugiak for the purpose of administering rabies shots necessary in order to be eligible to secure borough dog licenses.

Mrs. Burg reported that over seventy dogs were inoculated that morning. This was much in excess of the number anticipated, and Dr. Rasmussen had to send to Anchorage for additional serum.

In addition to the presence of the veterinarian, a representative of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough was present to issue dog licenses to those wishing to secure them.

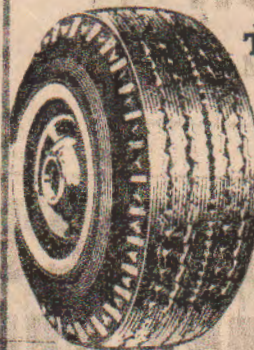

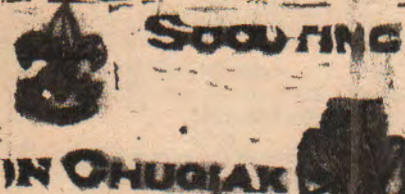

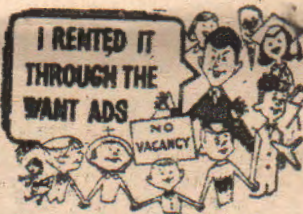
