The new director from the Greater Chuglak Area resides at mile 19 1/2 in Old Chuglak and is the proprietor of Swanee Slopes Rentals.

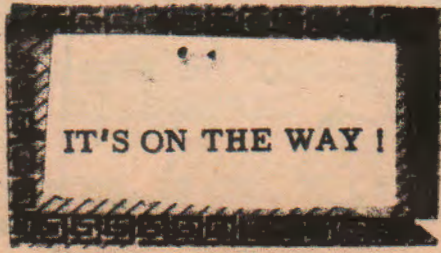
CHANGE IN POLLING PLACE FOR NEW PRECINCT TOLD

THIS WEEK IN WASHINGTON

My Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs has approved a bill calling for an annual subsidy for domestic gold miners. Qualifying operators of presently closed mines would receive subsidies of \$44 an ounce above the fixed price of \$35 set by the Roosevelt Administration. Operating mines would be given payments equal to six per cent of the gold they produced during a previous year. The House is expected to act upon the measure during the present session. Anyone desiring a copy should write to me at 450 Cannon House Office Building, Washington, D.C., 20515.

Final action is near on H. R. 13881, a bill to regulate the transportation and sale of dogs and cats intended to be used for experimental purposes. House and Senate conferees met several times this past week in an effort to resolve differences between the Senate and House-passed versions of the legislation. During the past two years, approximately 100 Alaskans have written me in support of the measure.

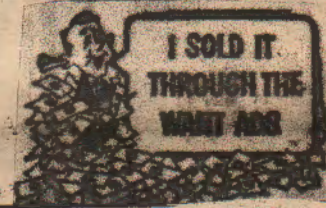
The Subcommittee on Fisheries and Wildlife Conservation met in executive session this past week and approved for full committee action the bill (H.R. 9531) to establish a 12-mile fishery zone around the United States and its possessions. This legislation cleared the Senate earlier this year.

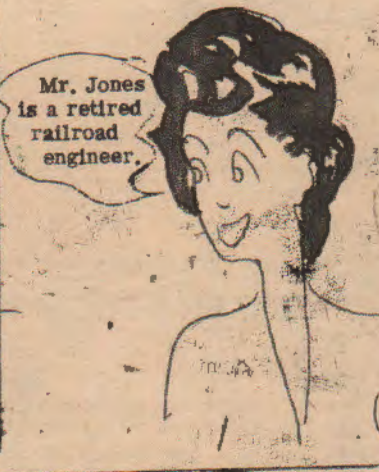
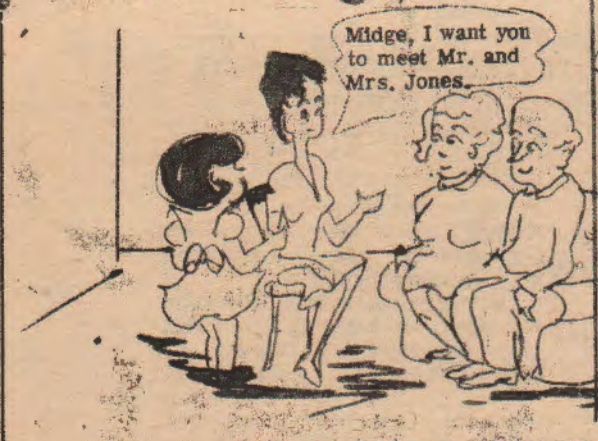

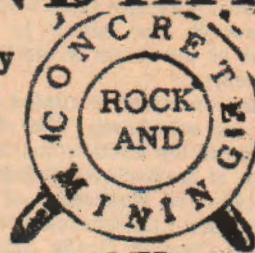

CHUGIAK TO BENEFIT FROM REA LOAN

PALMER: MTA subscribers in the Chugiak exchange will benefit directly from the \$1,058,000 loan approved this week by the Rural Electrification Association to the Matanuska Telephone Association.

Announcement of the approval of the loan was made in a wire from U.S. Senator E.L. (Bob) Bartlett to the local co-op.

Among the improvements slated to be added to the MTA with the funds from this loan is the replacement of the dialing office of the Chugiak exchange.

Other facilities will be constructed to serve 1,007 new subscribers and improvements for 53 current subscribers. Also planned is the construction of 86 miles of new line, the re-location of the Willow dialing office and the existing dialing office in the new Talkeetna exchange.

PLAYGROUND PAVED AT CHUGIAK SCHOOL

OLD CHUGIAK: Anchorage Asphalt Paving Company last week completed the paving of the playground of the Chugiak Elementary School.

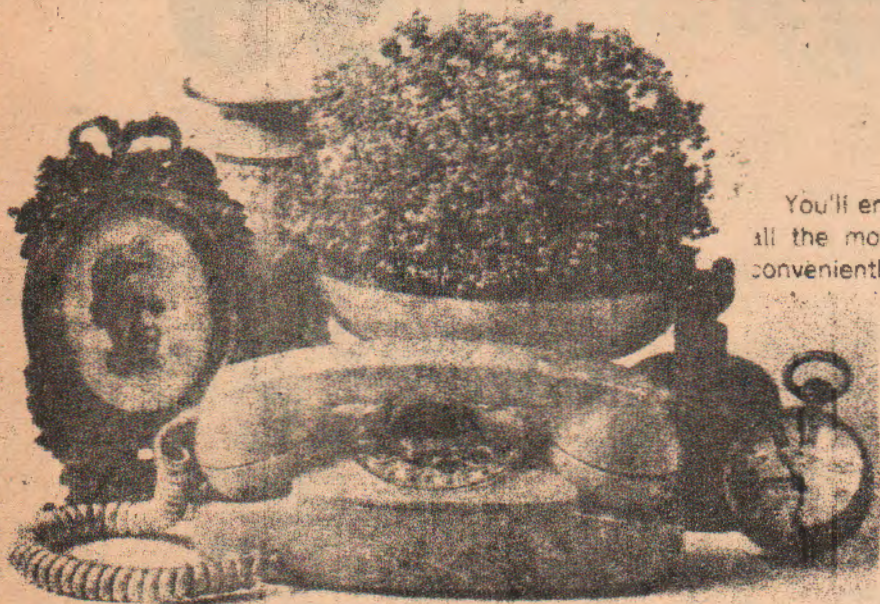

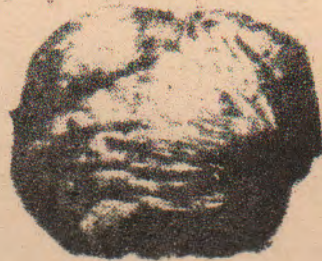
