COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES OFFERED

BIRCHWOOD: The Anchorage Community College will offer three interest courses to be taught at Chugiak High School this fall if approximately fifteen people sign up for each class.

The classes offered are as follows; Beginning and Intermediate Art; Tuesdays, from 7:00pm to 10:00pm. Instructor will be Miss Jeri West. Furniture Making, on Wednesdays from 7pm until 10pm; the instructor will be Dennis Harms. Basic and Intermediate Tailoring, Wednesday, 7pm to 10pm. Instructor for this course will be Judith Thompson.

Registration for all three above listed courses will be held at Anchorage Community College at 1670 Fireweed Lane on September 6th, 7th and 8th from 6pm to 10pm.

Classes will begin the week of September 13th. Registration fee for all three of the above listed will be \$36 per course.

THREE INJURED IN LAKE ROAD ACCIDENT

EKLUTNA LAKE: Three women were injured when the car in which they were riding left the road and struck a tree at mile 1.5 Eklutna Lake Road last Sunday afternoon.

The car was a 1960 Chevrolet sedan, driven by Robert L. Moorehead of Anchorage. According to Moorehead, the brakes went out on the car as he was coming down the steep road. He said he drove the car off the side of the road in order to stop it, and it was stopped when it struck the tree.

Hurt, were his wife, Francis L. Moorehead of Anchorage and his mother in law, Mary Martin of Adak who suffered minor injuries. More seriously injured was his sister Elizabeth Moorehead of Adak, who suffered a back injury.

All three of the injured women were taken to the Presbyterian Hospital in Anchorage by the Chugiak and Eagle River Volunteer Fire Company ambulances.

ANCHORAGE: Word was received by the GAAB School Board that a Certificate of Entry has been granted by the Bureau of Land Management for the construction of the Birchwood Elementary School on the site under consideration across Birchwood Road from Chugiak High School.

Dale Pierson, local member of the GAAB School Board said that the board will now accept proposals from well drillers for the drilling of a series of exploratory wells on that location.

The proposals will be taken under consideration at the September 13th meeting of the school board, with the drilling to begin as soon as a contract is awarded.

LOCAL ELECTION RETURNS

CHUGIAK: Voters in the Greater Chugiak Area went to the polls yesterday in a record turnout for a Primary Election.

Voting in six precincts, a total of 996 votes were cast 400 more than in 1964 when only 596 voted.

BIRCHWOOD: The very first day that Chugiak High School begins (Monday, August 29th), the cross-country team has their first practice. Why the hurry?

Friday afternoon the first week the thin clads will host West Anchorage High on the 2 1/2 mile cross-country course. One week is scant time to be ready for the West men.

Cross-country is open to all boys from 8th to 12th grade. But remember, cautions coach Andy Kirk, a cross-country man must have a doctor's physical exam before he may even come out to practice. "So get your physical exam slip at the high school as soon as possible so that you may begin practice Monday afternoon. (Or call 688-6331 and one will mysteriously be delivered to your door)" Kirk advises.

The X-C schedule this year consists of 8 races, with at least one meet every week during the short 6-week season.

TWO STOLEN

CARS RETURNED

BIRCHWOOD: Two vehicles which were taken from their owners in Birchwood were mysteriously returned last week.

AUGUST IS IMMUNIZATION MONTH







LOCAL MAN STILL IN CRITICAL CONDITION

FIRE LAKE : A local man who was seriously injured in an accident two weeks ago is still in critical condition at the 5040th Air Force Hospital.

Frank Martin of Birchwood has not as of the latest report regained consciousness from the injuries he sustained when the car in which he was a passenger was involved in an accident at mile 17 on August 11th.

The car, a 1964 Volkswagen, driven by Hubert Bruton, also of Birchwood, was struck in the rear as it was slowing down. The impact caused the Bruton car to veer into the oncoming lane of traffic, where it was struck by a 1956 Chevrolet, driven by Thomas Campbell of Anchorage. Bruton, suffered a broken right arm and right leg. Martin sustained a severe head injury. Neither Campbell, nor the driver of the third car, a man identified only as Leish, of Anchorage was injured.

Both the injured men were taken by the Chugiak and Eagle River Volunteer Fire Companies ambulances to local hospitals. Martin to the 5040th, and Bruton to Providence.

SCHOOL BUS SCHEDULES TOLD

CHUGIAK: The following school bus schedule for the Greater Chugiak Area has been announced for the coming year.

Buses will begin operating next Monday, August 29th, the first day of school. Listed below are bus routes and number (beginning with the first stop.)

CHUGIAK ELEMENTARY:

BUS #21: Eklutna Elementary run. This bus should leave the garage at 7:25am. Proceed to Eklutna, picking up students on east side of Glenn Highway enroute. Turn around and pick up students on west side of Highway as far as Peters Creek Service. Proceed to Chugiak Elementary School, arrival time 8:05am.

BUS #22: Birchwood Airstrip Elementary run. This bus should leave the garage at 7:25am, proceed north on the Glenn Highway to the Birchwood Loop Road, turn left and proceed as far as the French residence and then begin picking up students. Continue to the Railroad, turn around and proceed to the school. Arrival time 8:10am.

BUS #23: Middle Birchwood Elementary run. This bus should leave the garage at 7:25am, proceed north on the Glenn Highway, turn left on the Birchwood road and start picking up students at the "Y" and continue to pick up as far as the Nation's residence, proceed to the school. Arrival time 8:10am.

BUS #25: Peters Creek North Birchwood Elementary Run. This bus should leave the garage at 7:25am, proceed to Peters Creek Service and turn around. Start picking up students, continue to the Birchwood Road and pick up to approximately the French residence. Turn around and proceed to the school. Arrival time 8:10am.

EAGLE RIVER ELEMENTARY
Bus #40, Route 1: 7th Grade only. From sout to north end of Birchwood Loop. First pick up 6:50am. Continue to pick up to the north end of the Birchwood Loop along the Glenn Highway. Continue on north to Eklutna, turn around and pick up students on return, turn right on north end of Birchwood Road and continue to School. Arrival time 7:50am. Bus #41, Route 2: Fire Lake Run. South end of Birchwood Road, first pick up 7:40am. Continue pick up, going south on Glenn Highway. Arrival time 7:55am.

BUS #42, Route 3: Loop Road Run. First pick up 7:40am. Up Loop Road to Eagle River Road. Turn right, proceed to school. Arrival time 7:50am.

BUS #43, Route 4: Eagle River Road run. Proceed to end of State maintained part of Eagle River Road turn around. First pickup at 7:40am. Continue to pick up to the Loop Road. Proceed to school. Arrival time 7:55am.

CHUGIAK HIGH SCHOOL
Bus #41, South Fork Run. Will make first pick up at scale house on Glenn Highway at 8:10am. Return to Shopping Center and complete load. Proceed to school. Arrival time 8:40am.

BUS #42, Eagle River Road. First pick up at 8:10am at end of maintained road. Pick up as far as Loop Road, turn right and proceed to school. Arrival time 8:40am.

BUS #43, Loop Road and Glenn Highway. First stop 8:05. Continue to pick up students as far as Shopping Center. Proceed to school. Arrival time 8:40am.

BUS #24, Eklutna Run. First pickup at 8:05am, at Railroad. Continue to load going south on Glenn Highway as far as the Halfway House. Proceed to school. Arrival at 8:40am.

BUS #22: North Birchwood. First at the Chugiak Elementary School. Continue to load going north on Glenn Highway, turn left on Birchwood Loop Road to Airstrip. Turn around and proceed to school. Arrival 8:40am.

BUS #25: Middle Birchwood. First stop at "Y" at 8:15am. North end of Birchwood Loop Road. Continue south to school, arrival 8:40am.

BUS #23: Halfway House. First stop at 8:10am. Proceed south on Glenn Highway to north end of Birchwood Loop Road. Turn right and proceed to School. Arrival at 8:40am.

All the above listed schedules are subject to future change.

BRIGGS EXPLAINS STAND ON FIRE DISTRICTS

EAGLE RIVER: Borough Assemblyman Glenn Briggs said today that he felt that some readers of the Knik Arm Courier may have misinterpreted his statement in last week's issue to indicate that he opposed the formation of local fire service districts.

Briggs said, "I supported the formation of the two fire service districts for the Greater Chugiak Area with the tacit understanding that voters would be asked on October 4th to approve a one-half mill tax on real and personal property, not a two mill tax."

"This half mill tax would provide approximately the same amount of operating funds for the fire companies as has been obtained in the past from subscriptions. The taxpaying residents of the area are more concerned with broad support for our ambulances than of upgrading fire equipment for the reason that no amount of money spent on upgrading of fire equipment will provide better fire protection or lower insurance rates."

"For a 4-mill tax property owners in the Spenard district get street maintenance, street lights, police protection, sewer and water in addition to fire protection."

"Because of the quality of fire protection most of the Spenard area has a fire rating of 7 under which home owners pay only 68 cents per thousand for fire insurance. The best rate that can be expected in the Greater Chugiak Area is a class 9, under which home owners pay one dollar seventeen cents per thousand for fire insurance."

"If a two-mill tax is approved, by the voters in October a home owner with a home valued at \$25,000 will pay a tax of fifty dollars and will get no reduction in the cost of his fire insurance policy." Briggs concluded.


