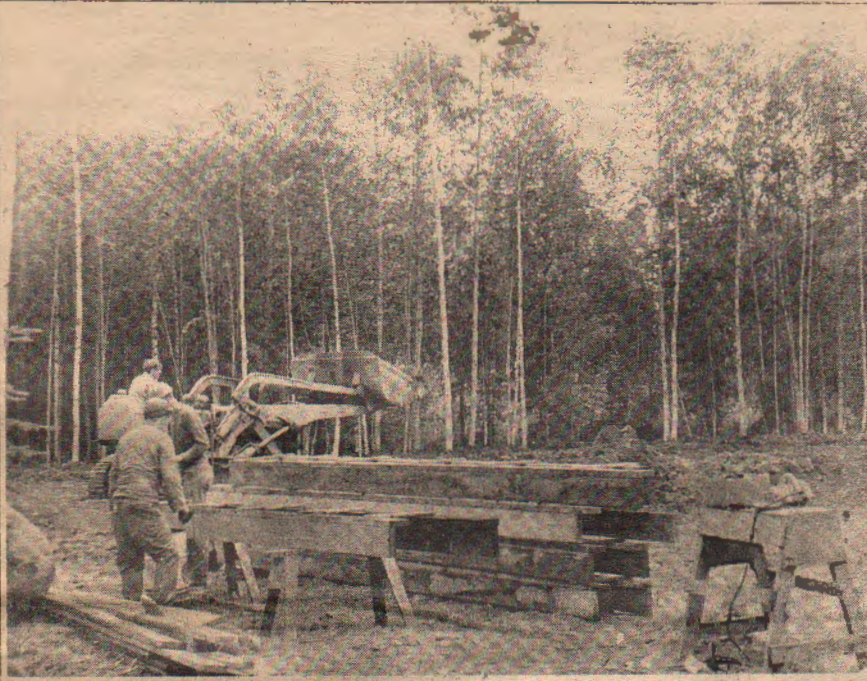

DUMP AGREEMENT TERMINATION CONTESTED

CHUGIAK: Elsie Oberg, Secretary for the Chugiak Benefit Association stated that the organization has received a letter from John F. Grasse of Anchorage regarding the termin-

ation of their agreement with him to maintain and manage the Sanitary Fill or dump, located south of the Eagle River Bridge.

CBA had obtained a lease from the State Division of Lands for the dump site, and in turn had entered into an agreement with Grasse to maintain the fill, in return for which he would collect the dump fees paid by customers.

CBA had terminated the agreement for the following reasons which were stated in a letter to Grasse. "The facility was never operated in compliance with terms of the agreement, and formal termination of the agreement became necessary following your abandonment of the operation during the winter of 1966-67."

In a letter dated July 12, 1967, Grasse told CBA. "At the time I took over the preparation and maintaining of this dump, the Borough, State and the Chugiak Assn. were not in a financial position to do so."

"At this point, I have too much money and time invested in this project to just let it go. However, I would be happy to cooperate for a period of one year for your people to maintain this dump. At that time, I will negotiate with the Borough to try and make the necessary arrangements for this dump to be open to the public."

Mrs. Oberg said that CBA would like regular users of the dump to recall the condition in which the dump had been allowed to deteriorate during the time that Grasse had claimed that he was investing his time and money. She pointed out that the rubbish had been allowed to accumulate without visible attempt to keep it covered and filled, and that at the time the agreement was formally terminated, the Borough officials along with CBA had inspected the site repeatedly and it had been declared a health hazard by the Borough Health Department.

CBA had in the original agreement with Grasse asked that a 3 percent of the gross income of the fees be paid to CBA in return for allowing him to operate the facility. During the time the agreement was in force, not one single payment was made to CBA.

WEEKEND WRECK HURTS FOUR

PETERS CREEK: A collision between two cars at the junction of Glenn Highway and Mt. Eklutna Drive in Peters Creek, resulted in the injury to four persons last Saturday.

A 1956 Ford Panel truck, driven by Sig G. Hilderbrand of Anchorage was slowing preparing to turn off the highway, when several of the long string of cars following pulled out to pass him. As he turned left, he collided with a 1967 Volkswagon station wagon which was passing him in a no-passing zone.

Injured were the driver of the VW, Arthur L. Cufford, and passengers, Phyllis A. Cufford and Timothy L. Cufford. Hildebrand also suffered injury.

LOCAL SCHOOL INFO. CLARIFIED

CHUGIAK: Due to a conflicting number of reports on the times that local schools start and are dismissed the Courier has been requested to reprint the following schedule.

The Chugiak Elementary School begins at 8:45am and is dismissed at 3:15pm. Eagle River Elementary School begins at 9:00am and is dismissed at 3:30pm. Birchwood Elementary begins at 8:30am and is dismissed at 3:00pm. Chugiak High School begins classes at 8:00am and is dismissed at 2:45pm.

Because of the last minute change of the school attendance zones, there will be only one class per grade at the Chugiak Elementary School. This leaves the following teachers unassigned; Alta Coleman,

In reply to Grasse, in a letter dated August 24, 1967, CBA stated, "You, the Borough Administration, and the State Departments of Highways and Health were aware that the Chugiak Benefit Association was a non-profit community service organization without funds. This fact was accepted by you at the time of your acceptance of terms of agreement with the Chugiak Benefit Association for the operation of the sanitary fill at the Eagle River site. All parties were also aware that costs would be involved in preparation of a fill area and for the construction of a road to it. The State Division of Lands did give assistance in the development and operation of the facility by tendering to you nine hundred dollars in script and by granting certain gravel rights."

The dump was re-opened by the Borough following the termination of the agreement with Grasse, and

kept open 24 hours a day as a free public dump. CBA pointed out that Grasse had only had an attendant at the dump for a few hours every weekend. Maintenance of the dump is being done by a private contractor under a special appropriation of \$1,000 by the GAAB Assembly. Mrs. Oberg said that CBA

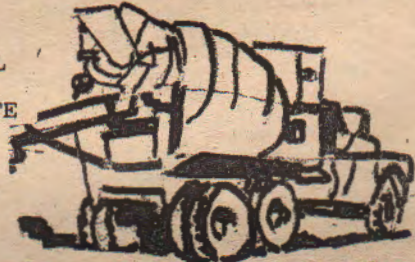
also asks regular dump users to compare the manner in which the dump is being maintained at present, as compared with the manner in which Grasse had maintained it, or in this case, failed to maintain it.

In the above mentioned letter CBA told Grasse, "Reopening of the facility in February 1967 was made possible by a loan of one thousand dollars to the community by the Greater Anchorage Area Borough government. The greater portion of that fund has been spent in collecting and burying rubbish allowed by you to accumulate during the prior two years of operation."

"For the first time the facility is now being acceptably operated as a sanitary fill, readily available at all time to the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area and without

Ora Jean Banks and Betsy Kenworthy. This also leaves four unoccupied classrooms at the Chugiak Elementary School.

Opening day enrollment at the four local schools is as follows: Chugiak Elementary School, 150 students (including Special Education), Eagle River Elementary School, 380 students, Birchwood Elementary, 222 students (Birchwood Elementary students are being housed in four relocatable classrooms at the Eagle River Elementary School, plus four classrooms in the Eagle River School and a fifth grade class at the Eagle River Baptist Church) and 582 students at Chugiak High School.

An additional member of the faculty has been assigned to Chugiak High School since the list was published last week. This is Kay Landolt, who will be teaching French and Seventh Grade English.

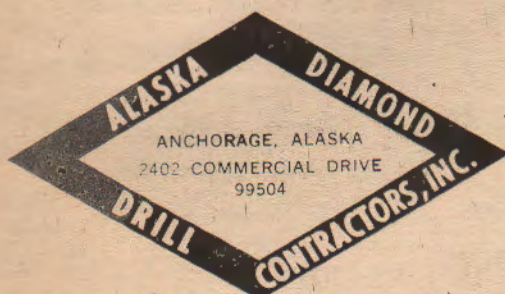

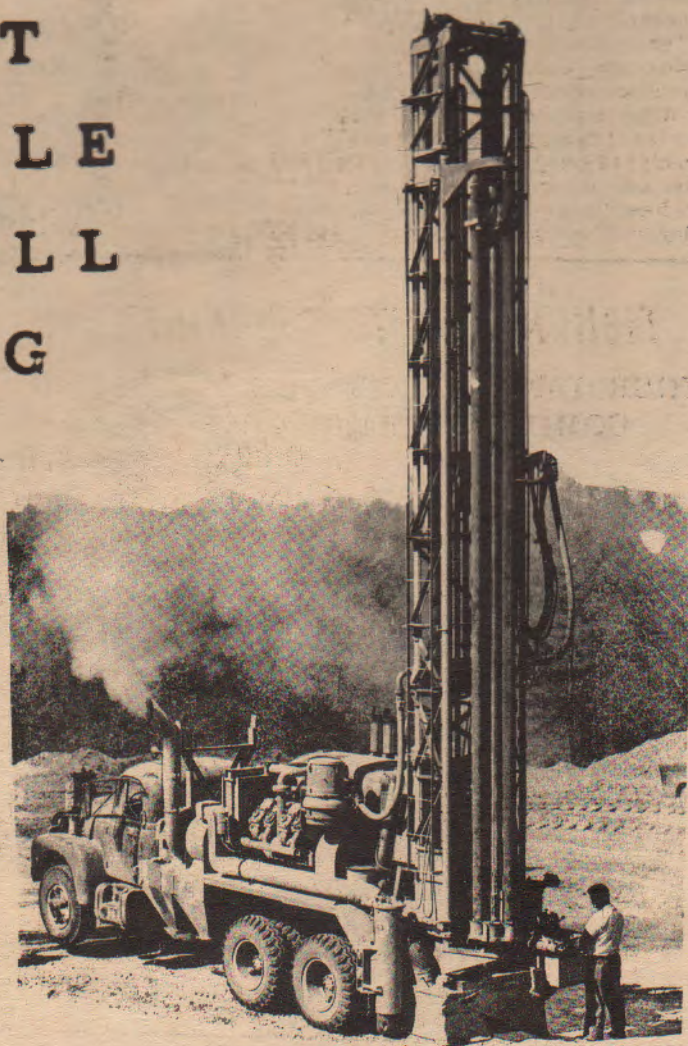

WORK PROGRESSES ON SGPA CLUBHOUSE

SCHOOL LUNCH CHANGES TOLD

CHUGIAK: School lunches at all four area schools will be prepared at the kitchen of Chugiak High School this year, and then rushed in insulated vans to the individual schools.

This is in an attempt to cut down the cost of operating the individual kitchens.

The food will be kept heated and refrigerated at the individual school kitchens, and served in the usual manner.

The cost for lunches is, for grades one and two, 45¢ for a daily lunch ticket, \$2.25 for a weekly (five days) ticket, \$4.50 for a ten day ticket and \$9.00 for a monthly ticket. This is for 21 days, and, offers the inducement of one free lunch per month, a new policy of the GAAB School lunch

program.

For grades three through six, the daily charge is 60¢, \$3.00 for 5 days, \$6.00 for 10 days and \$12.00 per month.

For Junior and Senior high students, the charge per day is 60¢, \$3.00 for five days, \$6.00 for a ten day ticket and \$12.00 per month.

Individual servings of milk may be purchased on a daily basis at 10¢ for a half pint carton, or a weekly ticket for 50¢.
