
#### WOMAN HURT IN THREE CAR PILE UP

A total of 283 voters turned out in all five local precincts to vote on whether "...the State of Alaska shall issue its general obligation bonds in the principal sum of not to exceed \$5,000,000 tearing interest not to exceed six per cent per annum and maturing in not to exceed 30 years from the date of issue for the purpose of providing funds for payment of the cost of designing, acquiring and constructing highways and roads in the state".

Bell's resignation followed by two days the resignation of Holdsworth. Bell declared in his letter, "In the light of your resignation as Commissioner of Natural Resources, I believe that it is in the state's interest that I, at this time, also tender my resignation from my position as director of the Division of Lands."

Bell expressed his conviction that the administration of Alaska's land resources is such an exacting task that the new commissioner should be completely tree to select men of his own choosing to share the responsibilities

bilities. Bell indicated he is willing to serve the state for a limited period of time. He has requested acting Natural Resources' cummissioner Dale Wallingt on to advise him of an effective date for resignation "which may best serve the state's interest." Bell, who is 62, has no immediate plans for employment elsewhere, but does not plan to retire before he reaches age 65.

do so by contacting the Enrollment Officer, Bureau of Indian Affairs, BOX 3-8000, Juneau, Alaska 99801. Mr. Morken stated that due to the unexpectedly large number of ap-plications, some individuals may not have received a response acknow-ledging receipt of enrollment ap-plication. There is a concentrated effort by the Enrollment Office in acknowledgement and all persons who have filed applications will be contacted in the near future.

The Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska are anticipating a judgment award from the United States Court of Claims. The case is now in the evaluation stage. A decision is ex-pected in the near future.





He attended Thiel College in Green ville Pa where he received his B.A. He then attended St. Lawrence University at Canton New York for two years to earn his M.S. It it was at this point that he decided on medicine as a career and enrolled in the University of Manitoba in Winni peg Canada, for four years where he received his M.D. He interned at the St. Boniface General Hospital in Winnipeg for 1 year, and spent the last two years as Staff Physician at the ANS Hospital in Anchorage. This his past summer, he filled in for Dr. Vincent Hume in Palmer while the latter was away. Dr. Green has lived up to the
