

SUICIDE VICTIM FOUND HERE

BIRCHWOOD: A Spenard man was found dead in his car on Monday, October 9th at 6:52am, the victim of an apparent suicide.

The incident was reported to the Alaska State Troopers by Mr. and Mrs. John C. Mielke, and their son John R. Mielke, of Lower Peters Creek.

The Mielke's told the State Troopers that they had been on the way to work when they saw a 1966 Ford sedan parked near the Birchwood Airstrip with two hoses going from the exhaust pipes through the car windows. They stopped with the hope of reviving the victim, but when they determined that he was already dead, they notified the police.

The name of the victim is being withheld pending the notification of next of kin.

GAAB ASSEMBLY NAMES OFFICERS

ANCHORAGE: The GAAB Assembly held an organizational meeting last Monday, according to local Assemblyman Ed Willis.

Herb Lang of Section 6 was elected president of the Assembly and Joe Josephson was elected presiding officer.

Willis said that he plans to meet with the Borough Administration to attempt to work out an interim solution to the management of the local Sanitary Landfill Dump. The proposition that the voter of Section One be taxed for the operation of the dump was defeated at the recent election.

WOMAN HURT IN THREE CAR PILE UP

OLD CHUGIAK: A local woman suffered minor injuries as a result of a three-car accident at mile 17 1/2 last Wednesday evening.

Mrs. Juanita Hahn, of mile 17 1/2 had stopped her car and was signaling for a left hand turn. The car following her, a 1952 Chevrolet sedan, driven by Donald E. Kritzer, of mile 19 1/2, slowed down to stop, but was struck in the rear by a 1961 Chevrolet Carry-All, a military vehicle driven by Marlon R. Bussard of Ft. Richardson.

LOCAL VOTE HITS ALL TIME LOW

CHUGIAK: Local voters trickled to the polls yesterday in a display of apathy which made last week's 530 votes look like a landslide.

A total of 283 voters turned out in all five local precincts to vote on whether "...the State of Alaska shall issue its general obligation bonds in the principal sum of not to exceed \$5,000,000 bearing interest not to exceed six per cent per annum and maturing in not to exceed 30 years from the date of issue for the purpose of providing funds for payment of the cost of designing, acquiring and constructing highways and roads in the state".

Bell declared in his letter, "In the light of your resignation as Commissioner of Natural Resources, I believe that it is in the state's interest that I, at this time, also tender my resignation from my position as director of the Division of Lands."

Bell expressed his conviction that the administration of Alaska's land resources is such an exacting task that the new commissioner should be completely free to select men of his own choosing to share the responsibilities.

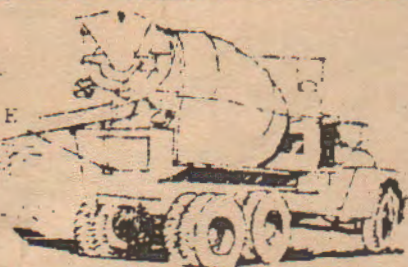
Bell indicated he is willing to serve the state for a limited period of time. He has requested acting Natural Resources' commissioner Dale Wallington to advise him of an effective date for resignation "which may best serve the state's interest." Bell, who is 62, has no immediate plans for employment elsewhere, but does not plan to retire before he reaches age 65.

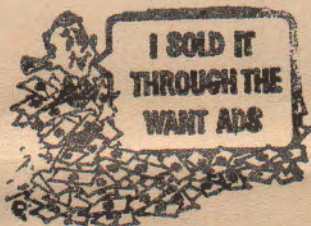
SCOUTING IN CHUGIAK

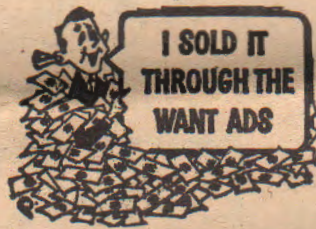

The impact drove Kritznerns car into the rear of Mrs. Hahn's 1965 Buick Sedan.

Damage to the Buick was estimated at \$200, the car belonging to Kritznern was judged a total loss, and the military vehicle damaged an estimated \$600.

State Troopers said that the Carry-All left 174 feet of skid marks before striking the Chevrolet. Bussard was cited for driving too fast for conditions. Mrs Hahn complained of neck pains, and was taken to her home. Neither of the other two drivers was injured.

ILL FATED ASTRONAUT VISITED IN ALASKA

HOUSTON TEX: Marine Major Clifton C. Williams Jr., who was killed in the crash of his T-38 Talon trainer aircraft last week, was one of three U.S. Astronauts who visited Alaska last fall on a hunting and fishing trip.

It was just one year ago that Williams told the Knik Arm Courier in an exclusive interview that he hoped to be the first man to set foot on the moon. Williams had not yet made a flight into space at the time of his death.

The doctor will have as complete medical service as possible, including a room equipped for emergencies, including X-Ray machine. He said that he plans to expand his facilities as the need arises, including the service of another doctor if necessary, and perhaps a dentist.

When asked his policy on house calls, the Doctor said that he would make them when he felt that it would be for the greatest benefit to the patient. 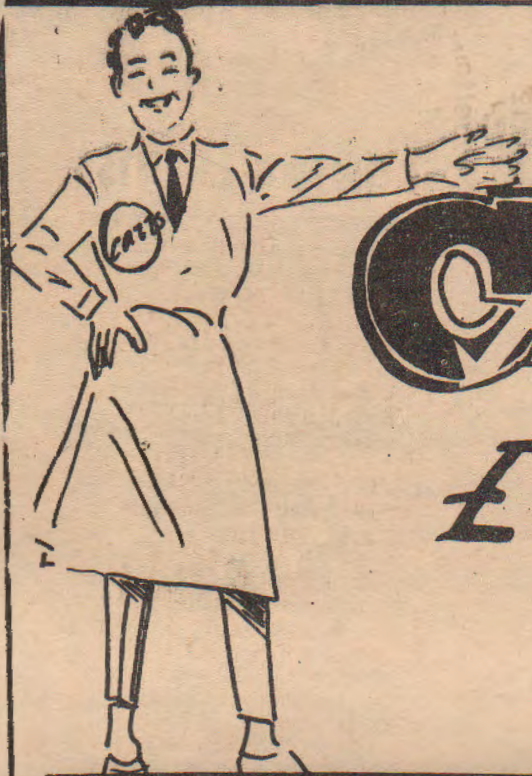
