



BIRCHWOOD SCHOOL OPENS

BIRCHWOOD: Quickly, efficiently and with a minimum of problems, the teachers and students of the Birchwood School moved into their new building last Monday morning.

Although the Birchwood School has existed as an educational unit since the beginning of the fall term, the classes were housed in both the Eagle River and Chugiak Elementary school pending the completion of the building.

According to plan, on Monday morning the children boarded the buses at the regular time and were taken to the temporary classrooms at the Eagle River and Chugiak schools. There they gathered up their books and personal belongings which they had made ready Friday afternoon, got back aboard the buses and by 9:15am, they were moving into their new classroom in their new school. The teacher had spent their spare time during the past week getting the classrooms and bulletin boards all set up, so very little time was lost in getting right back to the school routine.

Each class, however, was taken on a tour of the new building by their teacher before getting down to books and lessons.

The Birchwood School has a total of fourteen classrooms and a multi-purpose room. Of these, nine are occupied, leaving five classrooms for future growth. The teachers who are engaged in teaching in these nine classes are; Grades 1; Mrs. Beverly Emmons and Mrs. Ruth Fischer; Grade 2; Mrs. Mary Cline, Grade 3; Mr. Rodger Larson, Grade 3-4 combination; Mrs. Theodosia McGrew, Grade 4; Mrs. Irene Hildebrand, Grade 5; Mr. Ray Hules, Grade 5-6 combination, Mrs. Alta Coleman and Grade 6, Mrs. Lura Kerbow.

Principal of the Birchwood School is Mr. Harry Winner, lunch room manager is Mrs. Patsy Miller, Day Man, Eric Bergstrom, Custodian, Mrs. Delores Steeves. Nurse is Miss Marie Hill, and Mrs. Eileen Griffon is Librarian.

The enrollment of the Birchwood School as of today is 217 students.

Lunches are served from a warming kitchen, with the food prepared at the central kitchen at Chugiak High School and brought to the school each day in heated carts.

Pride of the school office is the compact school inter-communication system. This allows the office to make announcements to the school at large, or to call each individual classroom. In turn, a teacher can call the office for any reason. An AM/FM radio, which is a part of the unit can be piped to any individual classroom, the teachers lounge or to the entire school. Also incorporated into the system is a tape recorder, with which any radio program may be taped and be played back to any or all classrooms at a later time.

MISS ALASKAN SHOP BURGLARIZED

EAGLE RIVER: State Troopers are investigating a burglary which took place at the Miss Alaskan Dress Shop last week.

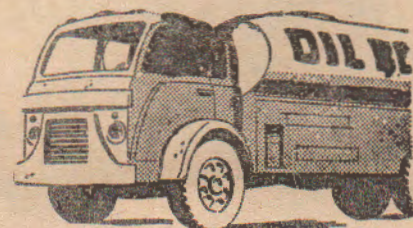
The classroom that turns the largest number of these coupons will receive a cash prize of \$10

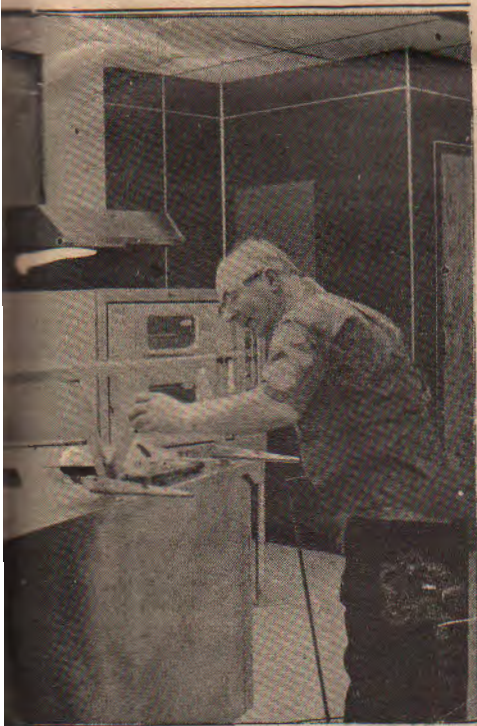

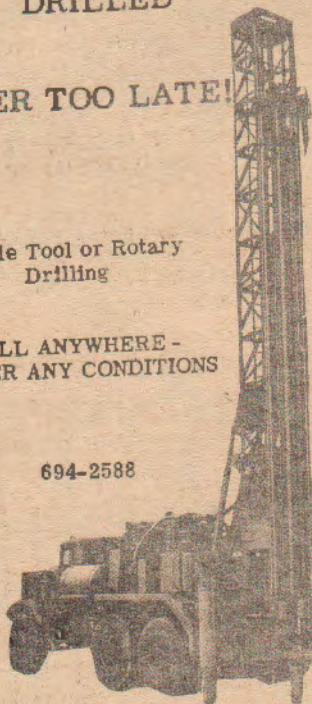

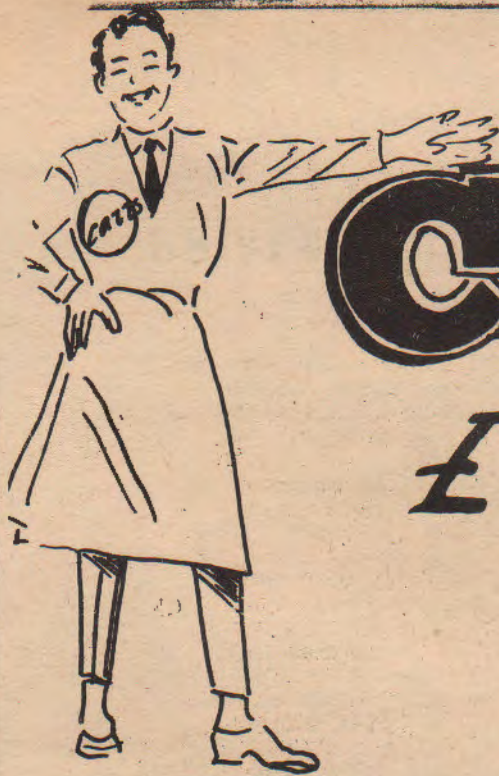
