## ASSEMBLYMAN CALLS PUBLIC MEETING

BIRCHWOOD: Ed Willis, Borough Assemblyman from Section 1, (the Greater Chugiak Area) has called a public meeting for Wednesday, August 16th at Chugiak High School.

The meeting will be held in the multi-purpose room beginning at 8pm.

Mr. Willis said that the purpose of the meeting is to report to the residents of this area on the items which may appear on the ballot at the coming election; namely library services, fire protection, police powers, sewer bonds etc.

He is also anxious to discuss the possible effects of re-apportionment on this area. The Borough has considered consolidating the Greater Chugiak Area with some precincts of the Matanuska area in order to conform with the reapportionment as called for by State Law. Willis said that it is his belief that this would be a fair to local residents as well as those in the Matanuska area. He doesn't think the two areas share common problems, and that one assemblyman would have difficulty in doing a good job of representing everyone.

Willis will also invite those attending the meeting to bring up any problems they may have and will attempt to answer all questions.

The meeting is scheduled for next Wednesday, August 9th, at 8pm in the Multi-Purpose room at the Chugiak High School.

The School administration will outline the schedule for the seventh grade, which is being moved to the high school and will be housed in relocatable classrooms which were constructed this summer. The curriculum and activities which the seventh graders will be offered will be explained and any questions answered.

Miss Miller sustained bruises and abrasions, while Phillip B. Klug, a passenger in the Gregory car, complained of pains in his arms and back.

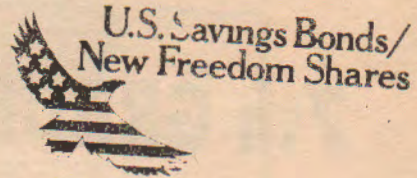
Damage to the pick up was estimated at \$600, and to the Plymouth an estimated \$500.

### STATE GETS BREATHALYZER

The Alaska Association of Insurance Agents recently presented its fifth Breathalyzer to the Alaska Department of Public Safety. The Breathalyzer will be sent to Sitka. The association has furnished other machines of the same type to Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan.

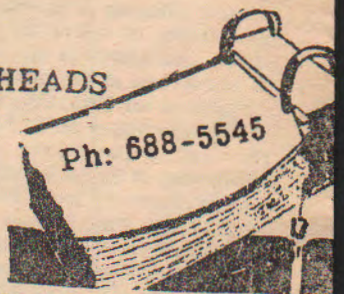
The Breathalyzers, according to safety commissioner Mel Personett, are used not only to test persons for drunkenness but to prove his innocence.

According to federal standards he explained, the blood concentration level at which the driver may be deemed to be intoxicated shall not be set higher than .10 per cent of weight. The Breathalyzer has been approved by the court systems as acceptable evidence.

### POST OFFICE BIDS ASKED AGAIN

EAGLE RIVER: Postmaster General R. F. O'Brien, today advised Postmaster Lucille M. Fly, of the Eagle River Alaska Post Office, that during the period July 21, through August 17, 1967, bids will be solicited for construction of a new postal facility in Eagle River on a site owned by Thomas J. Take Jr. and Vernon Burger of Eagle River, which will be sold to the successful bidder.

The property is located on the Northeast corner of Glenn Highway and Cornado Road, and comprises approximately 25,275 square feet.

The facility desired will contain 4,250 square feet of interior floor space with a 216 square foot platform and 18,336 square feet of parking and maneuvering area.

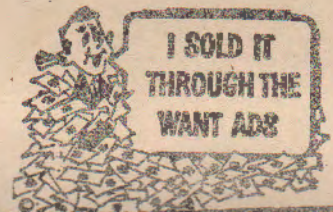

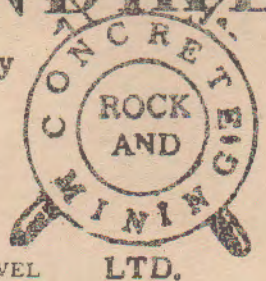

**ANCHORAGE:** Several items of business were tabled or postponed at the Monday meeting of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough Assembly.

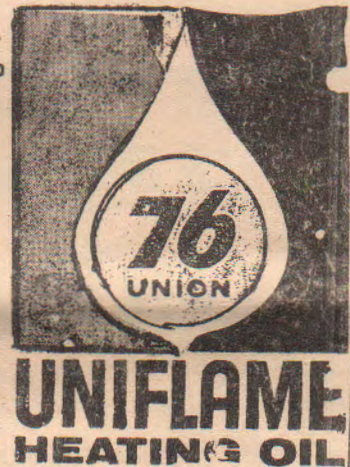

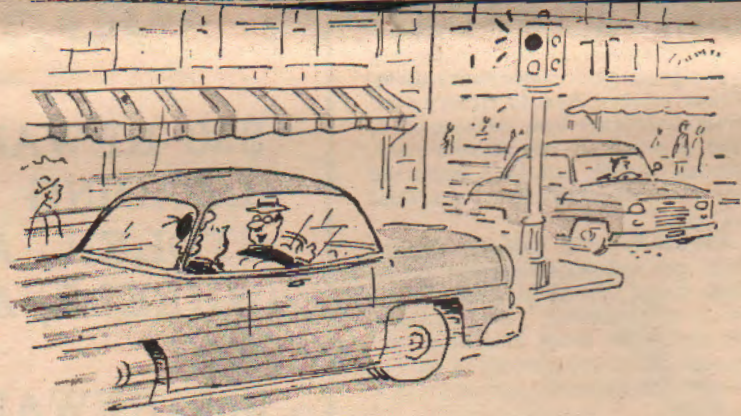

## BABE RUTH ALL STARS COME IN SECCND

JUNEAU: Four Chugiak Area Babe Ruth baseball players were on the runner up team in the State finals at Juneau last week. They were Richard Martin, Ron Tyson, Neal Bullock and Steve Jordan, all members of the Eagle River Branch First National Bank team during regular season play.

The East Division All Stars won their first three games, but were beaten by a come back Elmendorf team in the championship game Friday, July 21.

East defeated Sitka 4-1 playing in a steady rain. Jordan was starting pitcher, but got into trouble in the first inning when two walks and an error loaded the bases with one out. 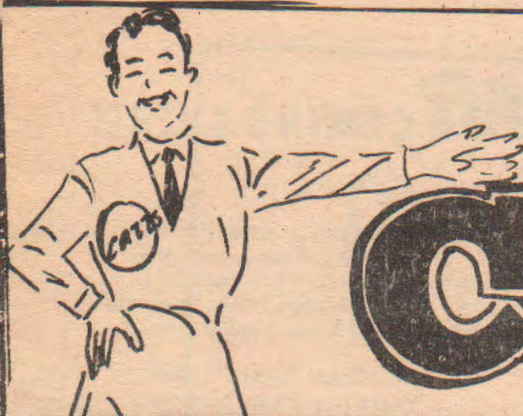
