## LOCAL SCHOOL BUS SCHEDULE TOLD



**BIRCHWOOD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AT IT'S PRESENT STAGE OF CONSTRUCTION.** The school is scheduled to be completed and ready for occupancy by October 20th, of this year. Mr. Don Fridley, of the GAAB School District stated that unless some unexpected obstacle should come up, he sees no reason why this should not be completed on schedule.

North Birchwood; First pick-up 7:25am at north end of Birchwood Loop continue to pick up to the Birchwood Airstrip and proceed to the school. Arrival time 7:55am

Middle Birchwood; First stop at "Y" at 7:30am north end of Birchwood Loop Road, continue south to High School. Arrival time 7:55am.

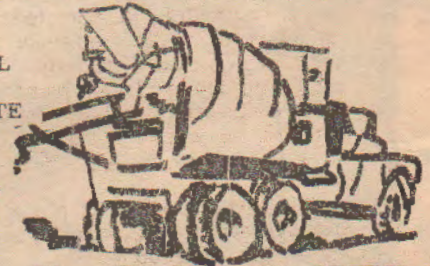

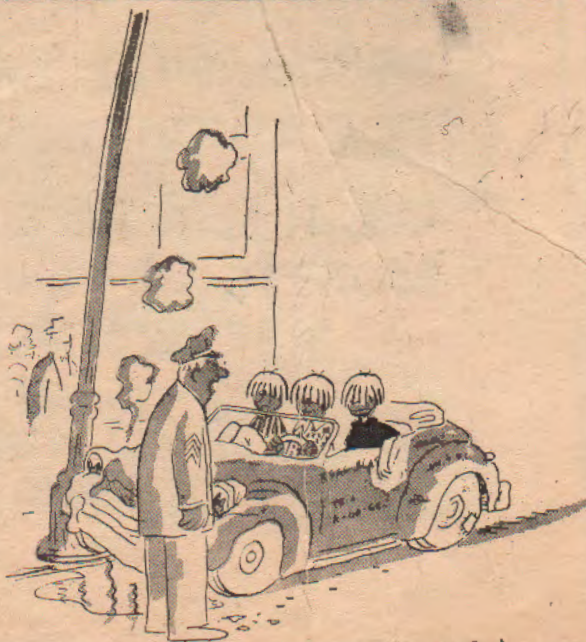

## JESSE LEE HOME GETS BEQUEST

**ANCHORAGE :** The Jesse Lee Home, an Anchorage institution for the care and treatment of troubled children, will receive a \$20,000 bequest from the estate of a California woman, Mrs. Irene Hannan of Oakland. Mrs. Hannan was killed in an auto - train accident about ten days after will was written. Her husband had preceded her in death a few months earlier. There were no children.

Mrs. Hannan, a retired employee of Pacific Gas and Electric was well acquainted with the works of the Jesse Lee Home, although there is no record that she had ever been personally acquainted with it or that she had ever visited Alaska.

The Jesse Lee Home was founded at Unalaska in 1890 by a school teacher who named it after a famous Methodist evangelist of New England, Rev. Jesse Lee.

In 1925 it was moved to Seward where its functions were greatly expanded. Badly damaged by the 1964 earthquake, the home was rebuilt in Anchorage. The children and staff moved into the new quarters in June 1966. A local 25 member board of directors governs the home in accordance with policies established by the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church.

The public is invited to attend the second annual open house to be held at Jesse Lee Home on Sunday September 10th from 3pm to 5pm. The afternoon will feature tours of the 4 ten child cottages and an outdoor family barbecue.

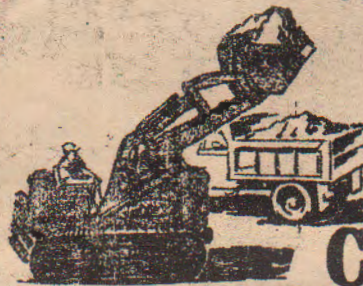
## CYCLIST IN HOSPITAL MOOSE UNINJURED
