JESSE LEE HOME GETS BEQUEST

ANCHORAGE : The Jesse Lee Home, an Anchorage institution for the care and treatment of troubled children, will receive a \$20,000 bequest from the estate of a California woman, Mrs. Irene Hannan of Oakland. Mrs. Hannan was killed in an auto - train accident about ten days after will was written, Her husband had preceded her in death a few months earlier. There were no children.

Mrs. Hannan, a retired employee of Pacific Gas and Electric was well acquainted with the works of the Jesse Lee Home, although there is no record that she had ever been personally acquainted with it or that she had ever visited Alaska.

The Jesse Lee Home was founded at Unalaska in 1890 by a school teacher who named it after a famous Methodist evangelist of New England, Rev. Jesse Lee. ANCHORAGE: The GAAB Assembly met Monday night, and among items passed was Emergency Ordinance 41, which deals with reapportionment within the borough.


Section one, (The Greater Chugisk Area) will remain unchanged. An earlier plan had called for including part of the Muldoon area in Section one.


The accident took place under the observation of the pursu observation of the pursuing trooper,


